California. This seems to be an error for two reasons: (1) I examined all specimens in Horn's series—the only ones ever assigned to this species —and all bear Baja California locality labels; and (2) the three localities are all in the semi-tropical Cape District (below 24° latitude) of Baja California, separated from the state of California by over 600 miles of arid terrain. In view of this, opaculus should be dropped from lists of the United States fauna.
