



The finalists are all here tonight and the winning team will receive a prize package that includes a BAFTA Young Game Designers Award; a work experience stint at EA's Bright Light studio during which they will continue to develop their games concept; and a prototype of the winning game developed with Abertay University.

This is such an exciting competition and entirely unique in the UK. Many young people consider that a career in the games industry is just for those who are "good at computers" – but ours is an industry which increasingly relies on a diverse range of talents, including storytelling, art, animation, design, physics, maths and more. Our ambition is that BAFTA Young Game Designers will grow and inspire young people to discover and develop these talents, playing an important part in investing in the future of Britain's creative industries and visual arts.

We're thrilled that this competition will return next year – be sure to check bafta.org/ygd for more info and help us encourage more youngsters to get involved in this thriving industry.

Perhaps we will see the finalists and winners of BAFTA Young Game Designers tonight back here in few years time picking up a BAFTA mask at BAFTA's Video Games Awards. We really hope so.





Special Award

Brian Cant

well-loved star from the world of children's television can find themselves with a wide and sometimes surprising fan base. This fact Brian Cant knows from experience.

"Two years ago I went to the Edinburgh Festival with a show called *Trumptonshire Tales*," he chuckles, "which Phill Jupitus did with me. The shows were packed out, not with children but 30 and 40-year-olds, bowing and scraping as I walked on. It's incredible the effect it had on people."

Now a genial 77-year-old, Cant has enjoyed a long acting career in television and theatre, working alongside such names as Richard Briers, Tony Robinson, Patricia Hodge and Barry Cryer. But it was as one of the most fondly remembered of *Play School* presenters that he found his way into the collective consciousness.

Along with his appearances on *Play Away*, and as narrator of *Trumpton*, *Chigley* and *Cambenvick Green*, Cant unwittingly evolved from jobbing actor to national treasure thanks to an easy charm and the twinkle in his eye that hinted at a wry sense of humour. But alongside the fun of those early programmes, great care was taken to educate as well as entertain, to remain inclusive just as the wider society was becoming more aware of its breadth and diversity.

"One of the main rules of those *Play School* days," Cant notes, "was that we should play to the camera as though we were talking to one child, in whatever circumstance. It could be somebody in a tower block, a nice semi-detached somewhere, or a Royal palace. You had to phrase everything so, whoever was watching it, they felt you were talking to them."

And there lies the great skill of a man who began his performing career as an actor in rep, and managed to successfully combine presenting children's television with roles in a succession of popular dramas including *The Long Way Home, No Hiding Place* and *Doctor Who* – in one episode of which he was killed by a Dalek.

The views of his generation of presenters on modern children's television hit the headlines recently, after an appearance on Radio 4's *Reunion* programme, though he is too much of a gentleman to dismiss the appeal of modern exponents out of hand. "Well I don't watch a lot of it," he says. "But it sometimes seems that there's no time to relax. I do find a lot of it quite noisy."

At the same time he is quick to point out that the Golden Age of children's television came when there were just two, later three, television channels, and modestly underplays his own contribution to it. The warmth of affection in which he is held by people he has never met was captured perfectly by James May, who eulogised him in a recent Daily Telegraph article.

"I never want to meet Brian Cant," the *Top Gear* presenter wrote, "in fact I was once at an event where I thought Brian Cant might have been in attendance, so I left just to be on the safe side. I don't doubt that Mr Cant is a nice man – how could he not be? – and would be a pleasure to meet. But Cant can't possibly live up to expectations, not if you grew up in the 1970s. I'm therefore leaving him in the radiant nimbus of spotlessness I've created for him in my mind where he can shine forever more."

This exciting competition was launched in August for children aged 11–16 to explore the creative possibilities and career potential within video games.

Friends and schoolmates across the country worked in teams of three to plan, write and illustrate an idea for a new video game, whilst games professionals shared their secrets of design at workshops around the UK, and gave feedback on the young participants' pitches. The BAFTA Young Game Designers website (www.bafta.org/ygd) provided additional online support, including top tips from some of the big names in UK video games design.

We were thrilled to see dozens of schools taking up the challenge, as well as groups of young people working in their own time. Hundreds of entries were submitted from across the British Isles, and the final nominees were selected by a 'Super Jury' of industry experts and the competition's Ambassador, actor Matthew Lewis (Neville Longbottom in the Harry Potter films).

Tonight's winning team will receive work experience with professional game designers at Bright Light (an EA studio), a working prototype of the winning entry developed with Abertay University, and a choice of video games hardware.

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
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
