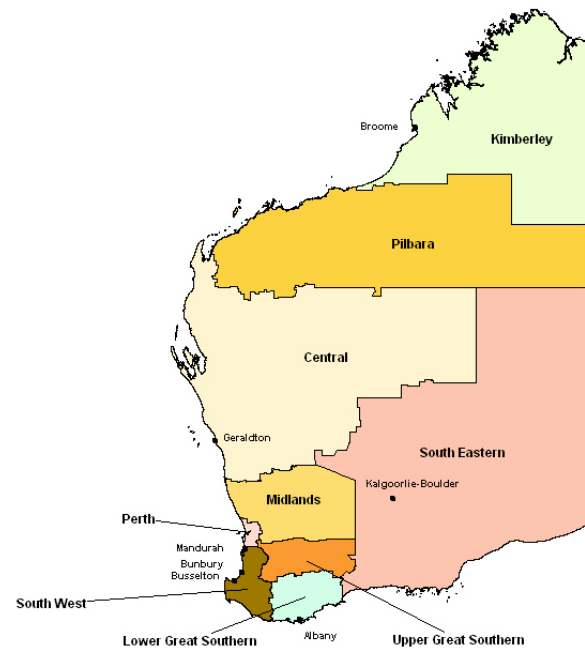
Western Australia had an estimated population of 2,105,783 in June 2007, accounting for 10% of Australia's population.

Western Australia has the largest land area (2,532,400sq km) of any Australian State or Territory. Its coastline of 12,500km amounts to 34% of Australia's total coastline.

The State's capital, Perth, was founded on 12 August 1829 and contains over 70% of Western Australia's population.
