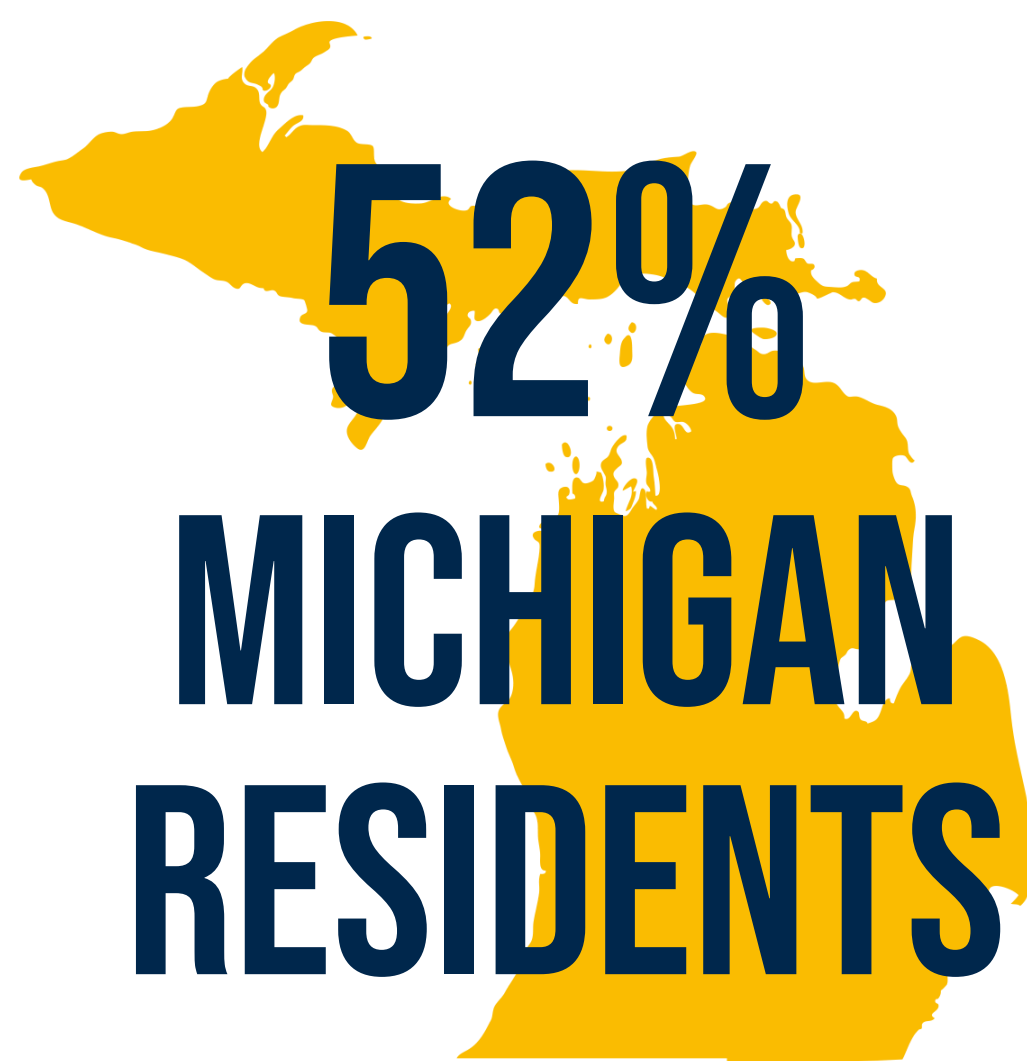
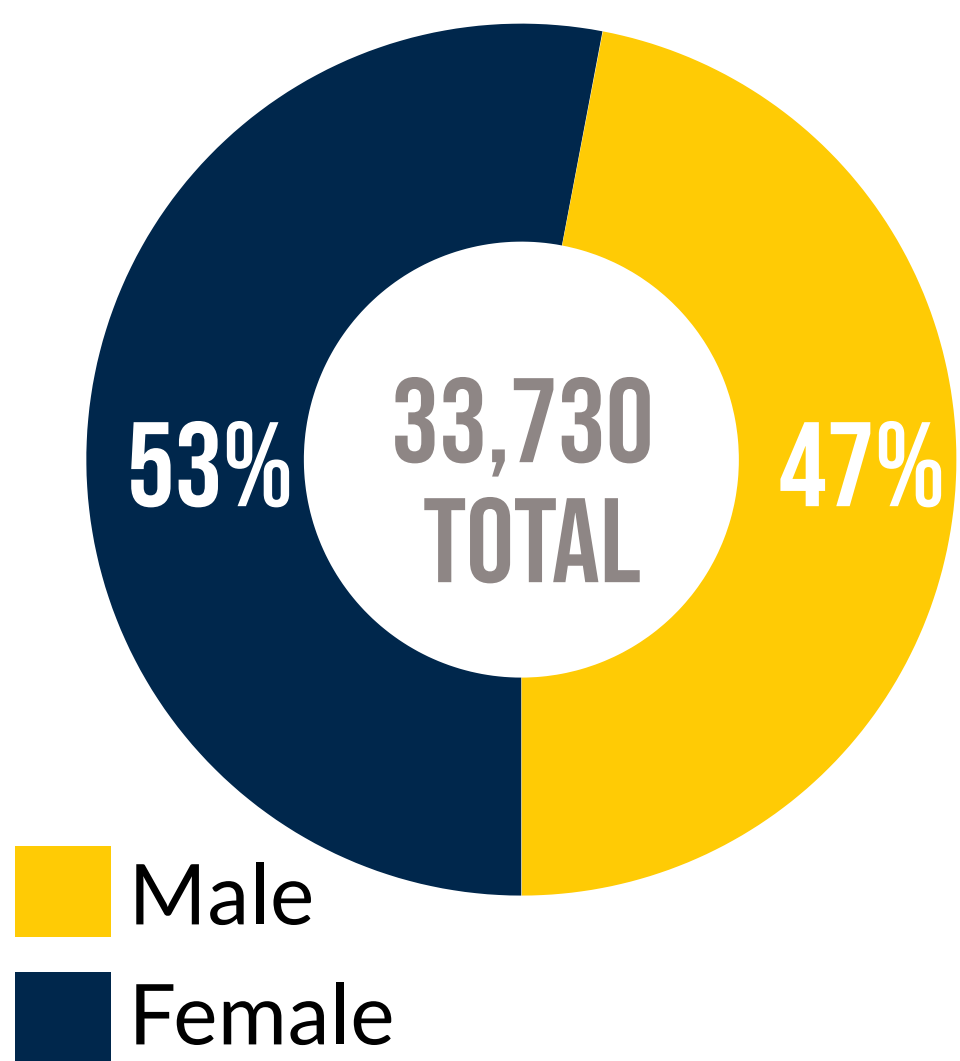

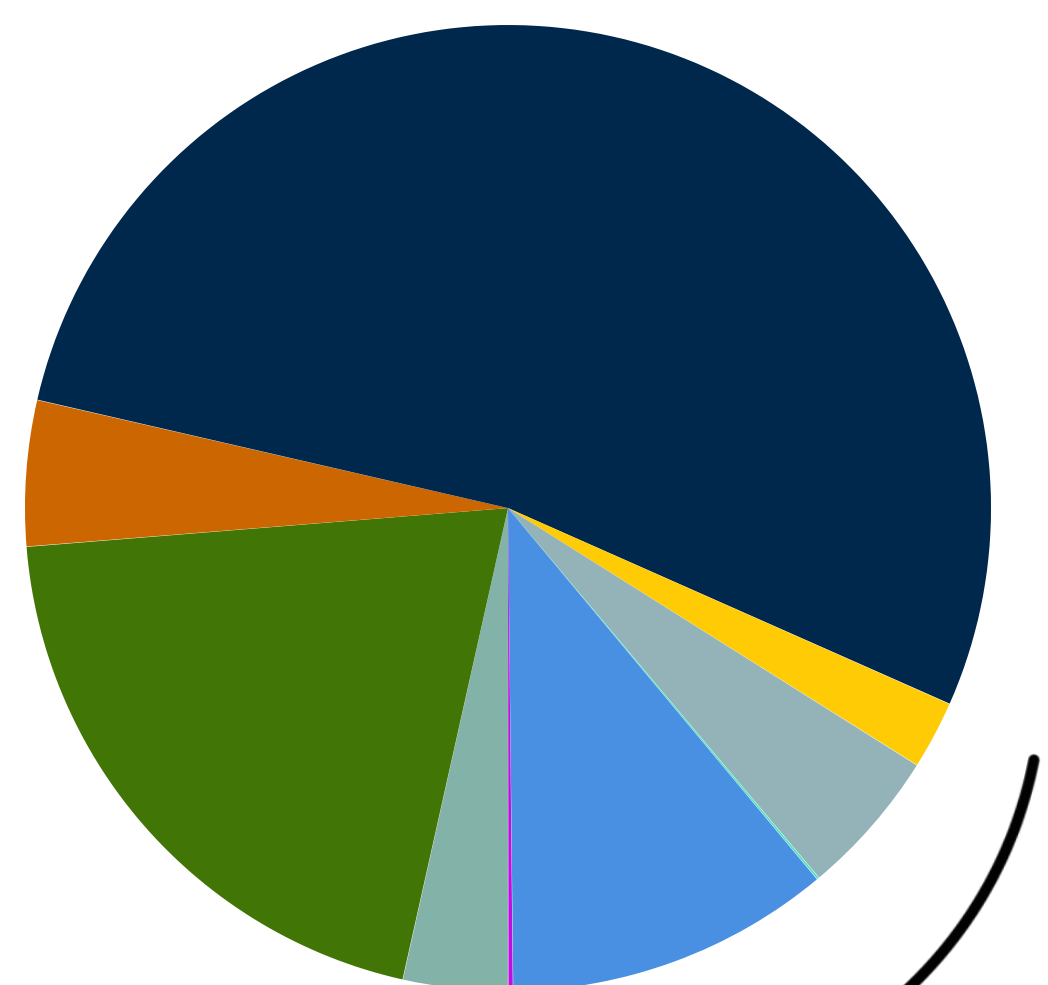

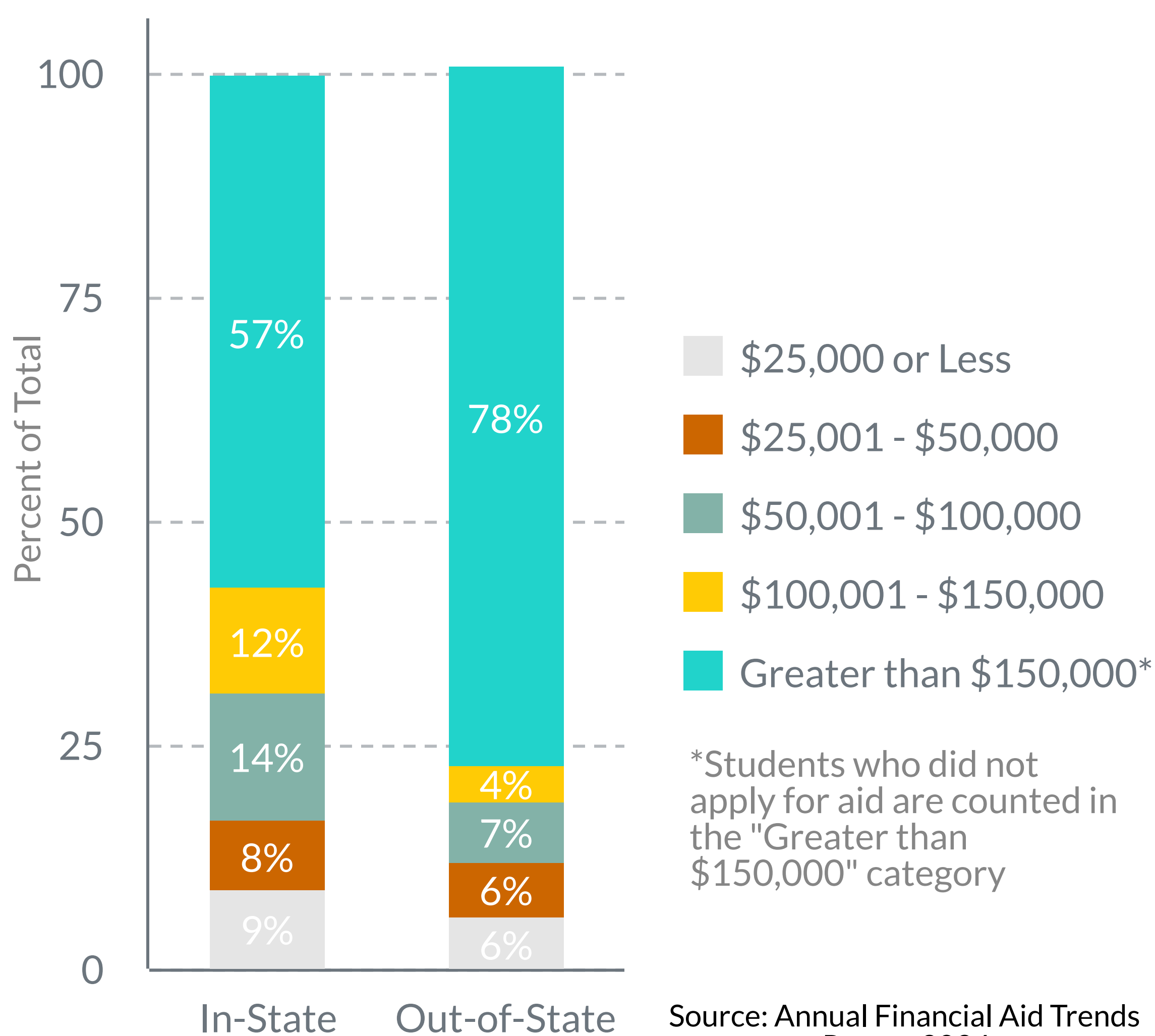

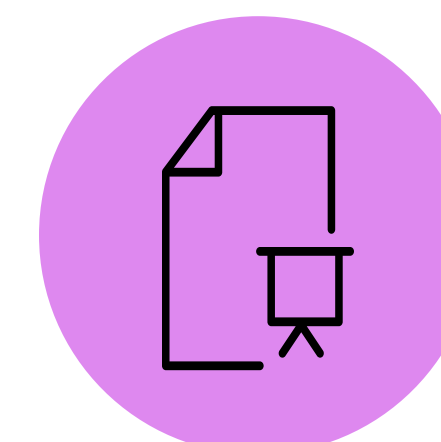

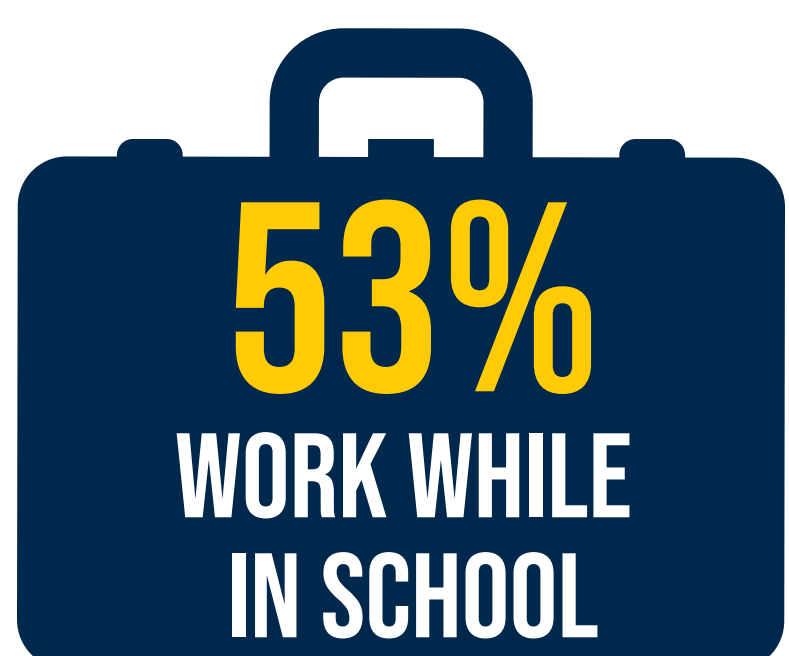

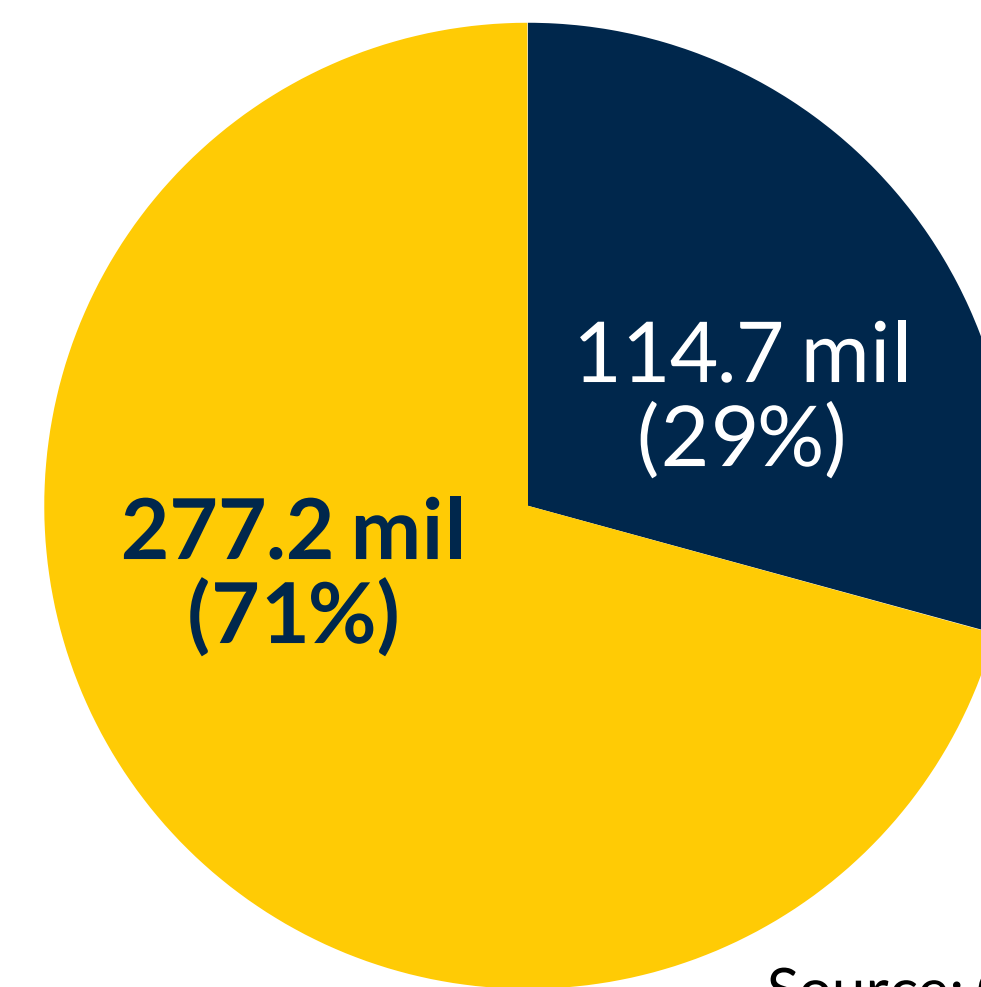

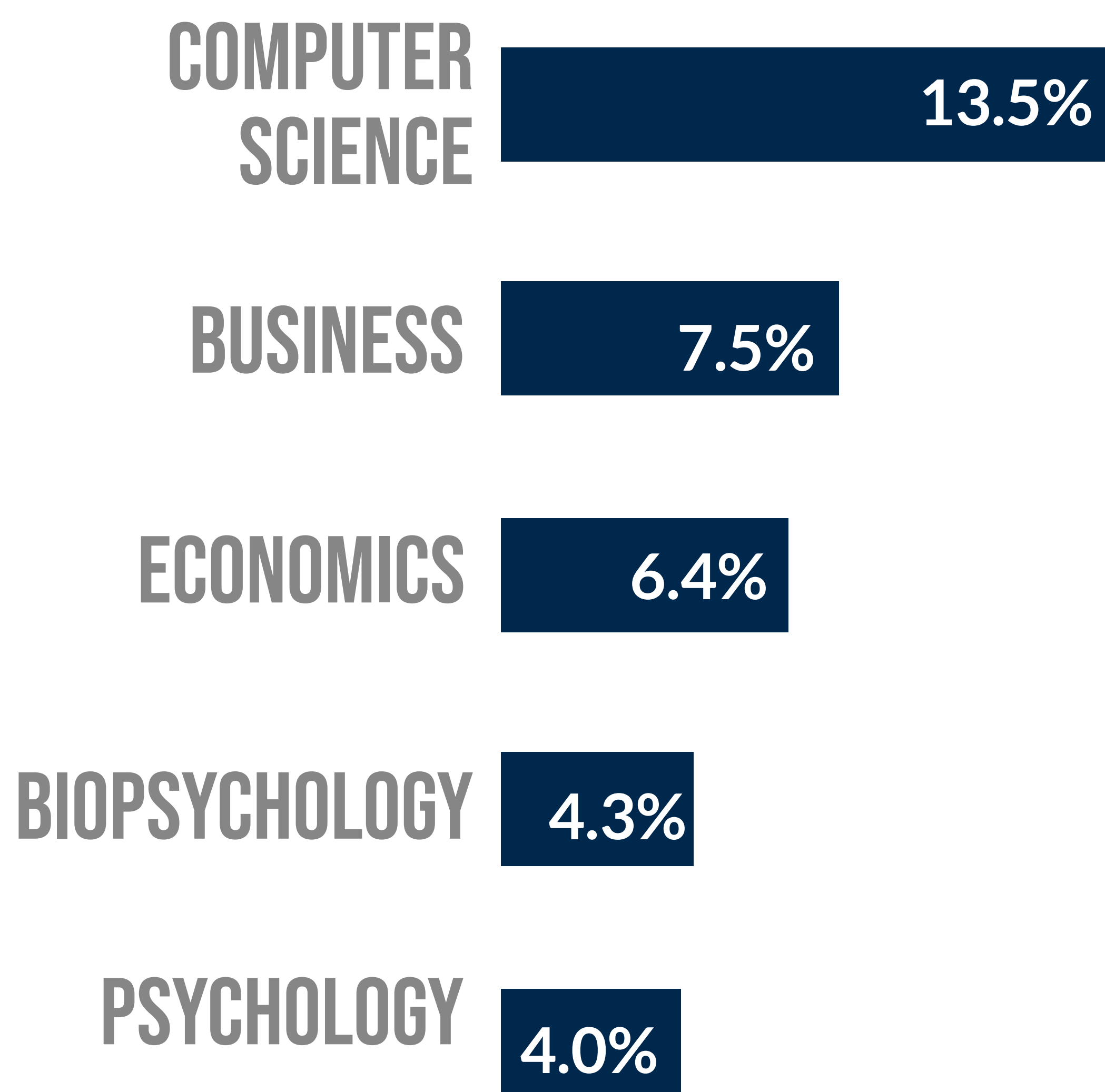

MOST POPULAR DEGREES AMONG UNDERGRADUATE DEGREE RECIPIENTS



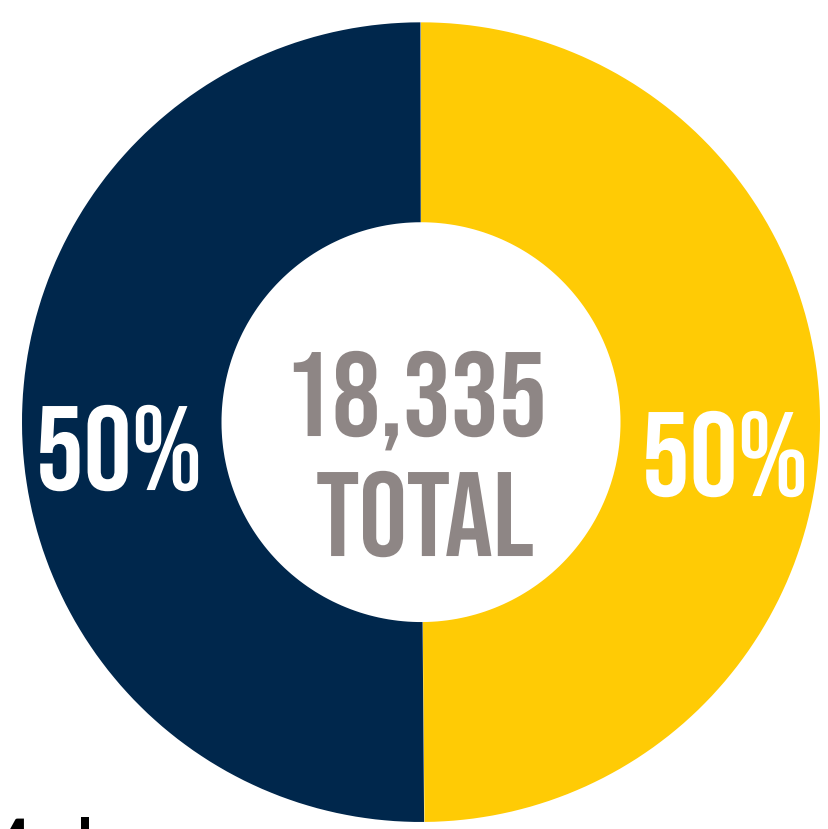

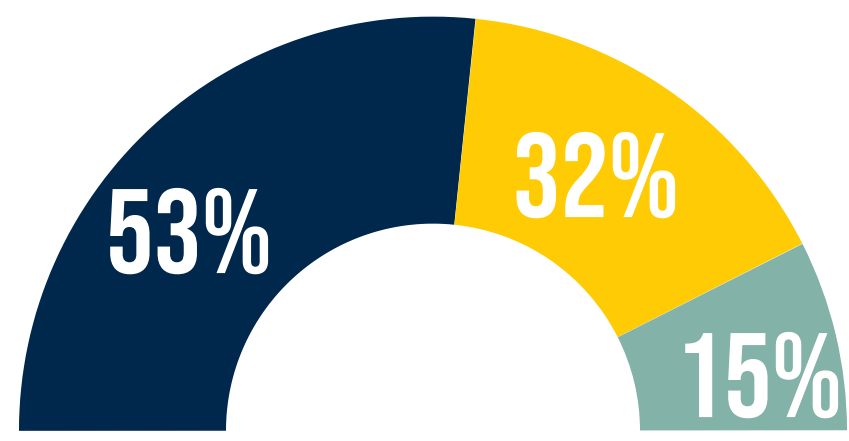

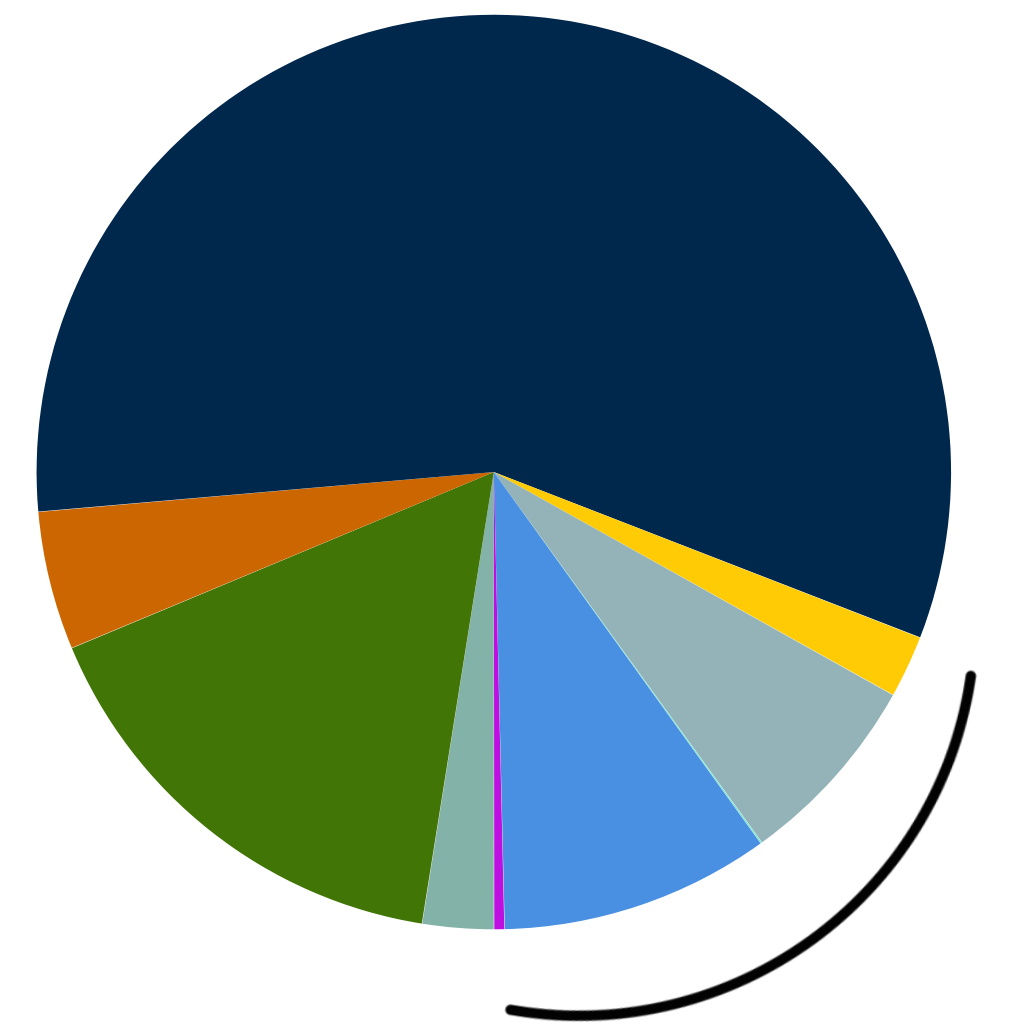

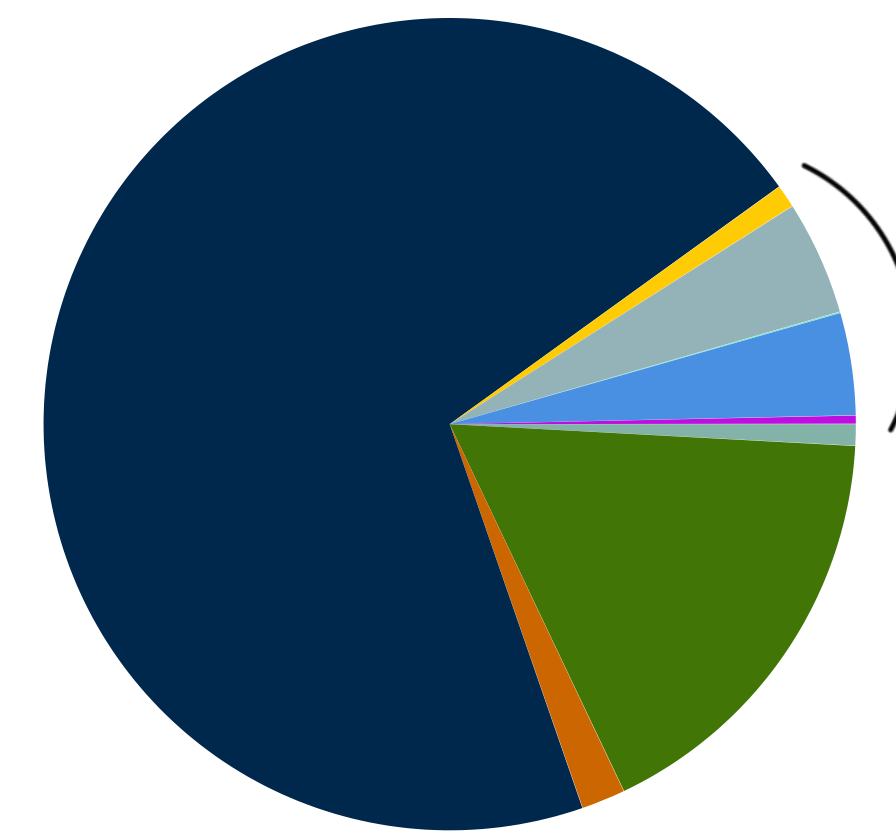
