and Kinah near the border of Edom (Josh 15:21). Therefore, Jagur could be found in the southernmost district of Judah, in the Negeb east of the Beersheba Valley. Since Kinah is usually identified with Hirbet Gazze (1657.0686) along the Wadī el-Oēnī (165.065) south of Arad [Tell 'Arad (1621.0766)], Jagur should be identified with Hirbet Sumrā (1630.0710) lying between Arad and Kinah, and not with Hirbet el-Garra (1487,0711) or Tell el-Milh (1525.0696). Jagur is also mentioned on a fragmentary list of delivery at Arad underlining its proximity to Arad (AI 42). LXX^B renders Jagur with Ασωρ. Jerome translates Iagur with "colonist" or "stranger" (Nom. hebr. 28.8-9), but gives no information exceeding the biblical description (Sit. 107.22).
