Boston College men's hockey has added 14 newcomers to its roster for the 2023-24 season, including 11 freshmen and three graduate transfers. Represented among the newcomers are seven forwards, four defensemen, three goaltenders and a total of seven NHL draft picks.

Timmy Delay

Fr. • F • Hingham, Mass. • Chilliwack (BCHL)

- Spent the 2022-23 season with the Chilliwack Chiefs, where he posted seven goals and 17 assists for 24 points in 42 games
- Added nine points on four goals and five assists in the BCHL playoffs for Chilliwack
- Skated for the USHL's Green Bay Gamblers in 2021-22 after playing for the Boston Jr. Eagles and attending St. Sebastian's School
- Father Tim and uncle Mike both played hockey at Boston College; aunt Katie played for the BC women's soccer team

Drew Fortescue

Fr. • D • Pearl River, N.Y. • USNTDP (USHL)

- Selected by the New York Rangers in the third round with the 90th overall pick in the 2023 NHL Draft
- Skated in 62 games last season for the U.S. National Under-18 Team, posting a goal and 25 assists for 26 points with a plus-34 rating
- Added three points and a plus-9 rating in seven games as Team USA won a gold medal at the 2023 IIHF Under-18 World Championship
- Posted 16 points in 51 games during the 2021-22 campaign with the U.S. Under-17 Team

Jacob Fowler

Fr. • G • Melbourne, Fla. • Youngstown (USHL)

- Taken by the Montreal Canadiens in the third round with the 69th overall pick at the 2023 NHL Draft
- Named USHL Goaltender of the Year and USA Hockey's Dave Peterson Goaltender of the Year
- Backstopped the Youngstown Phantoms to the organization's first USHL Clark Cup championship, going undefeated in the finals
- Led all USHL goaltenders in the regular season with a 2.28 goals against average, .921 save percentage and 27 wins
- Awarded Clark Cup Most Outstanding Player, finishing the playoffs with an 8-1 record and leading all goaltenders in every major category

Nolan Joyce

Fr. • D • Dedham, Mass. • Chicago (USHL)

- Posted 10 points on three goals and seven assists in 57 games last season for the Chicago Steel
- Attended St. Sebastian's School and registered 14 goals and 24 assists for 38 points in 25 games during his final season
- Also skated for the Boston Jr. Bruins from 2017-22
- Older brother Connor is a junior forward for the Eagles and his father John was a captain for BC during the 1993-94 season

Jan Korec

Fr. • G • Bratislava, Slovakia • Des Moines (USHL)

- Played 24 games in net last season for the Des Moines Buccaneers, posting a 3.21 goals against average and a .901 save percentage
- Attended the Northwood School and finished with a 28-11-1 record, 1.35 GAA and .939 SV% in 40 games during the 2021-22 campaign
- Represented his native Slovakia on the international stage in 10 games at the U18 and U20 level
- Won a silver medal with Slovakia at the 2022 Hlinka Gretzky Cup

Ryan Leonard

Fr. • F • Amherst, Mass. • USNTDP (USHL)

- Drafted eighth overall by the Washington Capitals this summer, making BC just the third NCAA school to have two top-10 picks in the same draft
- Scored 51 goals during the 2022-23 campaign, which is tied for ninth all-time in a single season in U.S. National Team Development Program history
- Over his two seasons with Team USA, he netted 77 goals which is seventh all-time in program history, two shy of Auston Matthews
- Scored the game-winning goal 2:20 into overtime of the U18 World Championship Gold Medal Game to beat Sweden 3-2, closing the tournament with 17 points including eight goals

Aram Minnetian

Fr. • D • Woodcliff Lake, N.J. • USNTDP (USHL)

- Selected by the Dallas Stars in the fourth round (125th overall) of the 2023 NHL Draft
- Registered 31 points last season on seven goals and 24 assists in 62 games for the U.S. Under-18 Team while posting a plus-48 rating
- Collected four points and was plus-16 for Team USA's gold medal winning squad at the U18 World Championship
- Posted 12 points in 42 games while skating for the U.S. Under-17 Team during the 2021-22 season

Alex Musielak

Fr. • G • Elma, N.Y. • Kemptville (CCHL)

- Played in 18 games last season for the Kemptville 73's and finished with a 3.68 goals against average and a .905 save percentage
- Posted a 1.84 goals against average and a .933 save percentage at the North Shore Hockey Academy during the 2021-22 season
- Also played for the Utica Jr. Comets and the Nichols School where he was All-Western New York in 2020

Gabe Perreault

Fr. • F • Hinsdale, Ill. • USNTDP (USHL)

- Drafted in the first round with the 23rd overall pick by the New York Rangers in the 2023 NHL Draft
- Registered 53 goals and 79 assists for 132 points this past season, the most in a single season by any player in the history of the USNTDP
- His 114 career assists and 185 career points over two seasons with the USNTDP both rank fourth all-time in program history
- Collected 18 points on five goals and 13 assists at the U18 World Championship in Switzerland to rank second in the tournament behind Will Smith

Will Smith

Fr. • F • Lexington, Mass. • USNTDP (USHL)

- Became the highest NHL draft pick in the school history this summer, going fourth overall in the first round to the San Jose Sharks
- Named the MVP of the 2023 IIHF Under-18 World Championship, leading Team USA to a gold medal with nine goals and 11 assists in seven games
- His 127 points during the 2022-23 campaign rank second all-time in the history of the USNTDP for a single season behind Gabe Perreault
- Finished his career ranked second all-time for the USNTDP with 191 points over two seasons, trailing only 2019 first overall pick Jack Hughes

Will Vote

Fr. • F • Arlington, Mass. • USNTDP (USHL)

- Collected 45 points on 16 goals and 29 assists in 61 games last season for the U.S. Under-18 National Team with a plus-16 rating
- Had seven points in seven games and a plus-6 rating at the U18 World Championship, helping Team USA win a gold medal
- Scored 20 goals and added 10 assists in 52 games for the U.S. Under-17 squad in 2021-22
- Also played for the Boston Jr. Bruins and skated one year at Dexter Southfield School

Gr. • F • Warwick, R.I. • Boston University (HEA)

- Spent four seasons in Hockey East, playing in 94 career games with 26 points and a plus-20 rating
- Posted career-highs with five goals, eight assists and 13 points last season in 29 games as a senior
- Played parts of three seasons in the USHL with Central Illinois and Sioux City and skated one season with the BCHL's Penticton Veeps
- Had 51 points in 27 games during his final year at Avon Old Farms School

Jacob Bengtsson

Gr. • D • Stockholm, Sweden • Lake Superior St. (CCHA)

- Played three seasons with Lake Superior State, amassing 57 points in exactly 100 career games
- 50 of those points came over the last two seasons while skating in 72 contests and serving as an assistant captain last season for the Lakers
- Spent two seasons in the USHL with the Waterloo Black Hawks, finishing with 29 points in 109 games
- Prior to arriving in the U.S., he played four seasons with AIK in his native Sweden

Jack Malone

Gr. • F • Spring Lake, N.J. • Cornell (ECAC)

- Spent four years at Cornell and posted 37 points on 16 goals and 21 assists in 66 games over his final two seasons in the ECAC
- Registered 41 points in 44 games for the USHL's Youngstown Phantoms in 2020-21 while Cornell did not play due to COVID-19
- Also skated for Youngstown during the 2017-18 and 2018-19 campaigns, collecting 59 points in 57 games in his final season before attending Cornell
- Selected by the Vancouver Canucks in the sixth round of the 2019 NHL Draft

GREG BROWN

Former Boston College All-American defenseman Greg Brown '90 enters his second year leading the program in 2023-24 after being named The Schiller Family Head Hockey Coach on May 6, 2022, becoming just the fifth head coach of BC men's hockey since 1932.

Brown spent 14 seasons behind the bench for the Eagles from 2004-18 as an assistant on former head coach Jerry York's staff, helping to bring three national championships to the Heights in 2008, 2010 and 2012. After eight seasons as an assistant coach, he was elevated to associate head coach following the 2012 NCAA title, BC's third championship in a five-year span.

During his 14 years coaching at Boston College, Brown helped lead BC to six Hockey East Tournament Championships, seven Hockey East Regular Season Championships, 11 NCAA Tournament appearances, and seven NCAA Frozen Four berths. Brown was also selected as an assistant coach for Team USA at three different IIHF World Junior Championships.

Brown served as an assistant coach in the NHL for the New York Rangers for three years from 2018-21, where he coached former Eagle forwards Chris Kreider and Kevin Hayes. During the 2021-22 season as the head coach of Dubuque in the USHL, he led the Fighting Saints to a second-place finish in the USHL Eastern Conference and an increase of 16 wins from the year prior.

While at Boston College, Brown won back-to-back Hockey East Player of the Year Awards in 1989 and 1990. He was named a First Team All-American and a finalist for the Hobey Baker Award both years. In three NCAA seasons, Brown registered 24 goals and 96 assists for 120 points in 119 career games.

He was the captain of the Eagles as a senior in 1989-90 for a team that won 28 games and reached the NCAA Semifinal. BC went 84-33-5 (.709) during his three seasons on the Heights, winning Hockey East Championships in 1987 and 1990.

He was selected to the U.S. Olympic Team during his sophomore year for the 1988 Calgary Olympics and again for the Albertville Olympics in 1992.

Brown was drafted 26th overall by the Buffalo Sabres in the 1986 NHL draft and played four NHL seasons for Buffalo, Pittsburgh, and Winnipeg. He played professional hockey in Europe for eight more seasons before retiring in 2003, and made his return to the Heights in 2004 as an assistant coach for York.

The Brown family has many connections to Boston College men's hockey. Greg's older brother Doug was a four-year standout forward for the Eagles from 1982-86, posting 162 points and earning a spot on two All-America teams. Greg and Doug are members of the BC Varsity Club Athletic Hall of Fame.

Greg's nephews Patrick Brown (2010-14) and Christopher Brown (2015-19) were also forwards at Boston College and both served as captains of the team.

MIKE AYERS

Mike Ayers enters his 11th season on the Boston College coaching staff in 2023-24. He was elevated to the position of Heffes Family Associate Head Coach following the 2020-21 campaign.

During that span, Ayers has guided several players to national recognition. In 2021, goaltender Spencer Knight earned Hockey East Player of the Year and First Team All-America honors. The year prior, Alex Newhook became the first player in program history to win the Tim Taylor Award as the Division I National Rookie of the Year. Matt Boldy (First Team), Drew Helleson (Second Team) and Jack McBain (Second Team) have also been named All-Americans.

Prior to his arrival on the Heights in 2013, Ayers spent two seasons as the goaltending coach with USA Hockey's National Team Development Program. He served as the goaltending coach for the silver-medal winning U.S. Under-18 Team at the 2013 IIHF Under-18 World Championship.

Ayers previously served as the goaltending coach for the gold medal-winning Under-18 Team at the 2012 IIHF Under-18 Championship in the Czech Republic. He was closely involved in goaltender scouting and selection for the U.S. national team that competed in 2013 World Junior Championships in Russia.

As an addition to his international experiences, Ayers was an assistant coach with the U.S. National Junior Team that competed at the 2015 IIHF World Junior Championship in Toronto and Montreal.

While with the NTDP, Ayers' responsibilities included planning, designing and executing the regular on-ice practices for goaltenders at the NTDP, as well as scouting and evaluating the nation's top goaltending prospects (ages 15-20).

In addition to his duties at the NTDP, Ayers was the coordinator of the revolutionary Warren Strelow National Goaltending Mentor Program, which is designed to recruit, develop and produce elite goaltenders in the United States.

Before his time with the NTDP, Ayers spent two seasons (2009-11) as the goaltending coach at St. Cloud State University. Prior to the 2009-10 campaign, he served as goaltending coach for the Iowa Chops, the American Hockey League affiliate of the National Hockey League's Anaheim Ducks.

A four-year standout goaltender at the University of New Hampshire, Ayers earned USA Hockey College Player of the Year honors in 2003 and was named a Second Team All-American. That season, he collected 27 wins with a 2.18 goals against average and a .926 save percentage. Ayers played in 102 games at UNH from 2000-04 and compiled a record of 58-25-12.

A native of Hingham, Ayers enjoyed a four-year professional hockey career (2004-08) in the American Hockey League, East Coast Hockey League and in Europe.

Mike and his wife Kaitlyn have a daughter Frankie and a son Bodie. They reside in Hingham.

Former Boston College captain Brendan Buckley enters his sixth season on the BC coaching staff in 2023-24. Buckley was elevated to the position of Associate Head Coach following the 2020-21 campaign.

During his time back on the Heights, Buckley has guided several players to national recognition. In 2020, Alex Newhook became the first player in program history to win the Tim Taylor Award as the Division I National Rookie of the Year. Matt Boldy (First Team), David Cotton (Second Team), Drew Helleson (Second Team) and Jack McBain (Second Team) have also been named All-Americans during Buckley's tenure.

As a student-athlete, Buckley was a standout defenseman for the Eagles after coming in as part of the first class recruited by Jerry York. He was named assistant captain in 1998 before donning the "C" for the Eagles in 1999.

Buckley played 158 career games as an Eagle, helping the program to back-to-back Hockey East titles and Frozen Four appearances in 1998 and 1999.

Buckley's previous coaching experience came at UConn, where he served as an assistant coach for three seasons for former BC assistant Mike Cavanaugh. With the Huskies, he focused on recruiting and coaching the defensemen.

Buckley was selected by the Anaheim Mighty Ducks in the fifth round of the 1996 NHL Entry Draft. He enjoyed a 12-year professional playing career spanning over 550 games in the American Hockey League (AHL) and in Europe.

A tremendous leader on and off the ice, Buckley served as a captain or assistant captain for four different organizations. He spent four seasons with the Wilkes-Barre/Scranton Penguins, where he was named the 2003 Defenseman of the Year.

After retiring from professional hockey in 2011, Buckley joined Buckley Sports Management where he served as Vice President and Director of Recruiting before joining Cavanaugh's staff in July of 2015.

Buckley graduated from Boston College's Carroll School of Management in 1999.

Brendan and his wife Heidi have three children: Brooks, Hope and Declan. They reside in Swampscott.

ASSISTANT COACH **BRENT DARNELL**

Brent Darnell was hired to join the program as an assistant coach prior to the 2023-24 season. Darnell came to the Heights after serving as the assistant director of player personnel for USA Hockey's National Team Development Program.

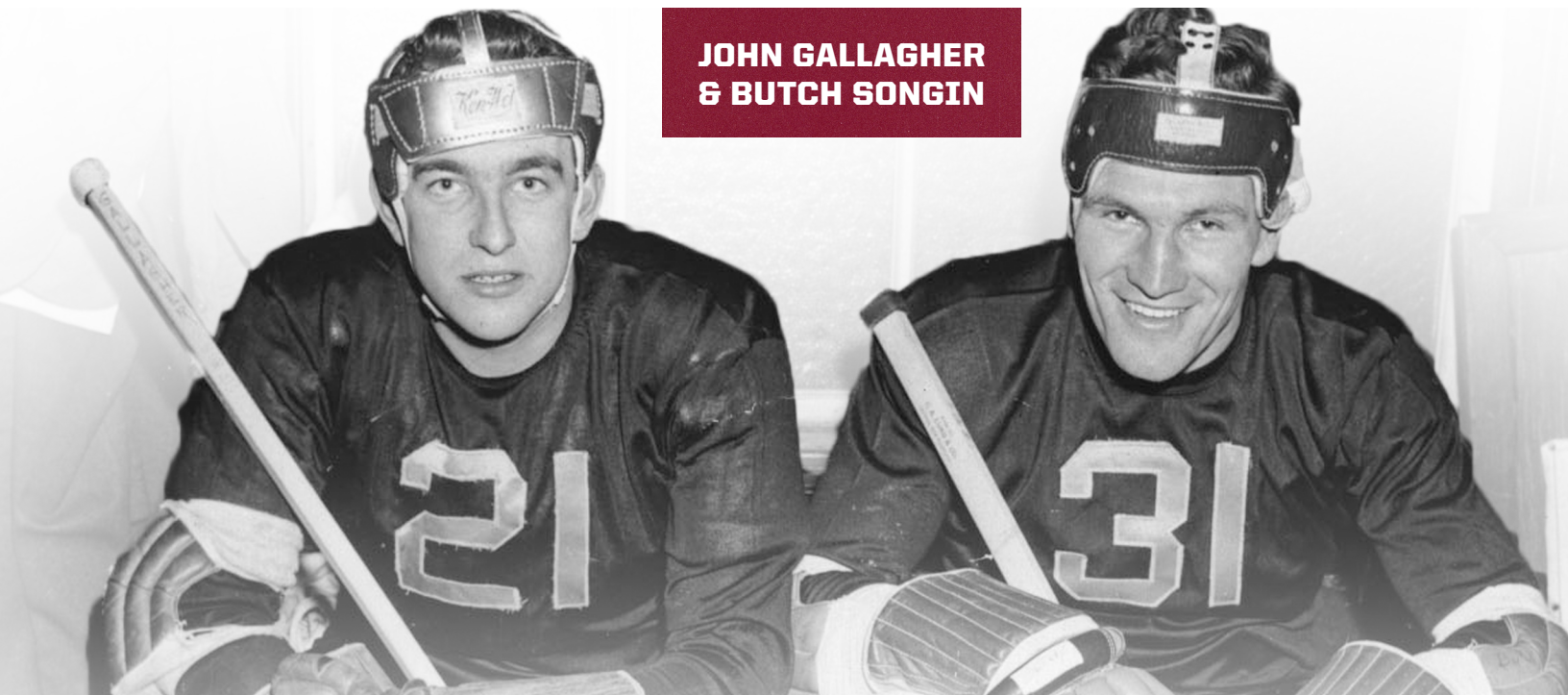

LEGENDS OF BC HOCKEY: SNOOKS KELLEY

When John A. “Snooks” Kelley assumed control of the Boston College hockey program as a volunteer coach in 1933, no one could have imagined the impact Kelley would have on BC and BC hockey.

By the time he retired, few could imagine that anyone would earn more victories than Kelley. Even more remote was the possibility that anyone would change the face of college hockey more than he had.

In fact, during his 60-year association with Boston College, Kelley’s personal dedication to the game had a great impact on many – his players, his assistant coaches and Boston College hockey loyalists. For 36 years, Kelley presented winning teams – and teams that won with class – to the Boston area.

A star player at Boston College High School, Kelley enrolled at BC. He served as hockey team manager for three years before becoming a “playing manager” in his senior year. He also played three years of baseball at the Heights.

Five years after his 1928 graduation, Kelley stopped playing for the Boston Hockey Club and assumed the duties of coach on a volunteer basis. From this point right up until his retirement after the 1971-72 season, Kelley led the Eagles. Only the war years of 1942-46, when he served in the Navy, interrupted his coaching career.

The high point of Kelley’s career came in March 1949, when the Eagles downed Dartmouth 4-3 to capture the NCAA Championship. With this accomplishment, BC became the first Eastern team to win the event. Among the many stars that played on Kelley’s title team were Len Ceglarski, who ultimately succeeded Kelley as the Eagles’ head coach, and Bernie Burke, the team captain and a former assistant coach.

In addition to the title, Kelley’s teams earned berths in eight other NCAA Tournaments and nine ECAC Division I playoffs. They also won eight New England Championships, one ECAC playoff crown and eight Beanpot titles. He also produced numerous All-Americans and U.S. Olympians.

Kelley became the first coach in college hockey history to surpass the 500-victory plateau. On Feb. 23, 1972, BC downed rival Boston University 7-5 at McHugh Forum, handing the coach his 500th win. He finished his career with a 501-243-15 mark.

In 1959, Kelley won the Spencer Penrose Award as college hockey’s coach of the year. Kelley is a charter member of the Boston College Varsity Club Hall of Fame (1970). He also has been inducted into the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame and in 1972 was presented the NHL’s Lester Patrick Award.

It was a sad day for college hockey when Kelley passed away on April 10, 1986.



LEGENDS OF BC HOCKEY: LEN CEGLARSKI

After 20 years behind the Boston College bench, Len Ceglarski decided to call it a career. At the end of the 1991-92 season, the legendary coach retired after 34 years as a collegiate head coach. He left the game as college hockey's all-time winningest coach, but more importantly he left the game as a better game.

Known by many for his wins, he was recognized even more for his class and no award or recognition could ever give Len Ceglarski his just reward. Yet, many have done their best to honor Ceglarski – the coach, the educator and the man. On Oct. 17, 1992, Ceglarski joined an elite group when he was inducted into the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame.

In 1992, the directors of Hockey East announced that the league would honor Ceglarski by naming its annual sportsmanship award after him. In 1990, the National Hockey League gave Ceglarski the Lester Patrick Trophy, which is presented to an individual for outstanding contributions and dedication to the sport of ice hockey.

Needless to say, Ceglarski is a member of the Boston College Varsity Club Hall of Fame. In addition to his coaching career, he was an All-American hockey player who helped the Eagles capture the 1949 NCAA Championship. He captained the Eagles as a senior in 1950-51. Ceglarski also was a standout second baseman on the Eagles' baseball team, teaming with former Red Sox manager Joe Morgan to form one of the best double-play tandems in New England in 1951.

Ceglarski completed his career as college hockey's all-time winningest coach with a final record of 673-339-38. Ceglarski spent 14 years as head coach at Clarkson (1958-72), recording a 254-97-11 mark. He returned to his alma mater prior to the 1972-73 season. In 20 seasons as the Eagles' head coach, he posted a 419-242-27 mark.

In his time behind the bench, Ceglarski earned three Spencer Penrose Trophies as the national coach of the year (1965-66, 1972-73 and 1984-85). He led his teams to eight NCAA Frozen Fours, four NCAA title games, six Hockey East Regular Season Championships (in eight years), and two Hockey East Tournament titles.

LEGENDS OF BC HOCKEY: BRIAN LEETCH

By the time Brian Leetch officially announced his retirement from professional hockey on May 24, 2007, there wasn't a hockey fan on earth who didn't recognize – and often revere – the hockey talents of this stellar blueliner.

Boston College was attractive to Leetch for many reasons, most notably that his father Jack Leetch was an All-American at the Heights, playing three years (1960-63) for legendary coach John A. "Snooks" Kelley.

Brian made his own name – in just one season. As a freshman, he earned All-America First Team honors and All-New England honors. After tallying 47 points – nine goals and 38 assists – in 37 games, Leetch was honored as the 1987 recipient of the Walter Brown Award, which is given annually to the top American born player in New England.

Leetch's next stop was with the U.S. Olympic Team. After months of training and exhibitions (including a game against his former BC teammates), he competed with Team USA in the 1988 Olympic Games in Calgary.

After playing in the first of three Olympics, Leetch made an enormous impact in his official rookie season (1988-89) with 23 goals and 48 assists in 68 games. At year's end, he was awarded the Calder Trophy as the league's rookie of the year. Three years later, Leetch captured the Norris Trophy as the league's best defenseman with 102 points, including a team-record 80 assists.

In 1993-94, Leetch scored a career-best 23 goals and led the New York Rangers to their first Stanley Cup title since 1940. In the postseason, he tallied 34 points – 11 goals and 23 assists – in 23 games and earned the Conn Smythe Trophy as the MVP of the playoffs.

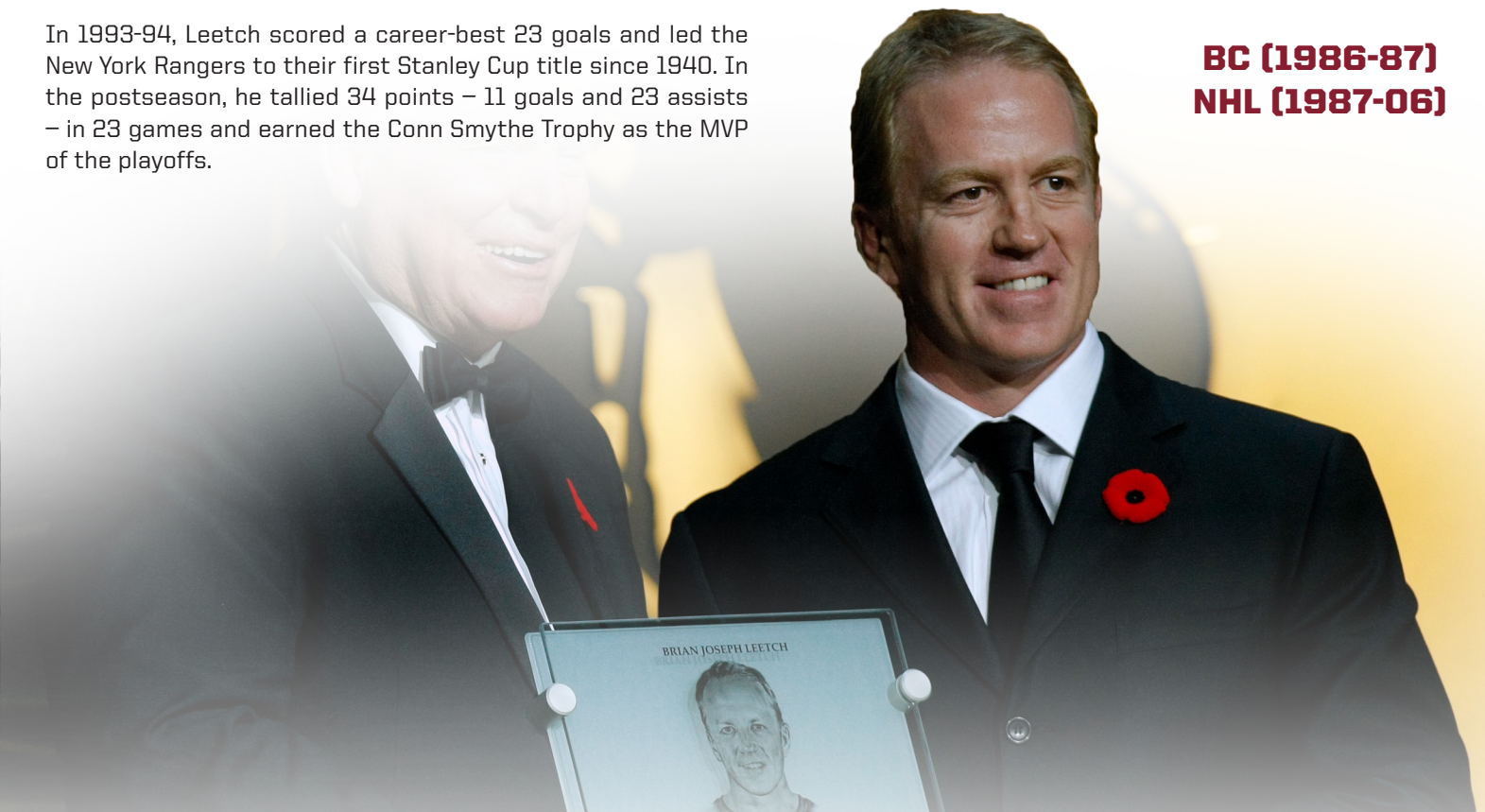
An 11-time All-Star (he missed two because of injury), Leetch enjoyed many more NHL highlights, including serving three years as the Rangers team captain and winning a second Norris Trophy for his play during the 1996-97 season.

During his last trip to Madison Square Garden – as a member of the Bruins – Leetch was greeted with a standing ovation.

LEGENDS OF BC HOCKEY: JOE MULLEN

One of the top American-born players ever to play in the National Hockey League, Joe Mullen '79 retired after the 1996-97 season following a highly successful professional career spanning 18 seasons with four organizations.

His professional achievements were recognized in June 2000 when he was elected to the Hockey Hall of Fame in the players category. The induction ceremony was held on Nov. 13, 2000 in Toronto.

A member of three Stanley Cup teams (Calgary in 1989 and Pittsburgh in 1991 and 1992), Mullen is the all-time leading American point scorer with 1,063 points (502 goals, 561 assists). The first United States born player to score 1,000 points in the NHL, Mullen also became the first American to score 500 career goals (March 14, 1997 vs. Colorado).

A native of New York City's Hell's Kitchen, Mullen starred for the Eagles under the tutelage of legendary head coach Len Ceglarski, leading Boston College to three playoff appearances and a 73-48 (.617) record.

Mullen finished his collegiate career with 212 points, which currently ranks fourth on the all-time list. He was a member of four straight winning teams, including a 1977-78 Eagle squad that made it to the NCAA Tournament after winning the ECAC Championship. In that memorable season, Mullen led the Eagles in scoring with 68 points, the 11th-highest scoring output in the hockey program's history.

Among his many collegiate accolades, Mullen was a two-time All-East, All-New England and All-America selection. At the conclusion of his junior season, Mullen earned the Walter Brown Award, given annually to the most outstanding American-born collegiate player in New England.

Mullen played three seasons with the St. Louis Blues before being traded to Calgary on Feb. 1, 1986. It was in Calgary where Mullen became a superstar. In his first full season with the Flames, Mullen scored 87 points, including 47 goals, a record for American-born players.

Two seasons later in 1988-89, Mullen totaled 110 points (51 goals, 59 assists) for the Stanley Cup champions and captured NHL First Team All-Star honors. In addition, he was awarded the Lady Byng Memorial Trophy for "gentlemanly play" for the second time in three seasons.

Mullen was traded to the Pittsburgh Penguins prior to the 1990-91 season and won two more Stanley Cup rings. After one season with the Boston Bruins, Mullen returned to Pittsburgh in 1996-97 to complete a memorable career.

Mullen was one of three former BC players to have his jersey retired during a ceremony on Feb. 20, 1999 between periods of the Eagles' game against New Hampshire.

1991 HOBEBY BAKER WINNER: DAVID EMMA

On March 30, 1991, David Emma was awarded the 11th Annual Hobey Baker Award in St. Paul, Minnesota. On that day, he was recognized as America's best collegiate hockey player.

The prestigious award was an appropriate ending to Emma's Boston College hockey career. Emma had been a star for four years, completing his collegiate career as the school's all-time leader in points, goals and assists.

Emma came to BC in the fall of 1987 after earning All-State honors as a junior and senior at Rhode Island's Bishop Hendricken High School. As a freshman, the 5-9 center earned Hockey East All-Freshman honors, tallying 19 goals and 16 assists in his first campaign. Included among his goals were a team-high eight power play goals and four game-winning goals. In addition, Emma notched the team's only hat trick of the 1987-88 season, including the game winner in a 6-5 victory over Lowell.

In his sophomore season, Emma picked up the pace, tallying 20 goals and 31 assists and earning Second Team All-Hockey East accolades. For the second consecutive year, the Cranston, Rhode Island native earned a spot playing with Team USA in the World Junior Championships in Anchorage, Alaska. Emma was one of only two players to return from the 1988 team that traveled to Moscow.

As a junior, Emma continued his progress and emerged as one of the nation's best players. Earning All-New England and All-America honors, the center was one of 10 finalists for the Hobey Baker Award. Emma became the fourth Boston College player to win the Hockey East scoring title. In 42 games overall, Emma scored 38 goals to tie Scott Harlow's single season record set in 1985-86 and added 34 assists. He scored the game-winning goal in BC's 4-3 Hockey East Tournament title victory over Maine.

En route to capturing amateur hockey's most prestigious award as a senior, Emma tallied 81 points, the second-highest single season total in school history. For the second consecutive season, he won the Hockey East scoring title. He also led the Eagles to their sixth Hockey East Regular Season title, their third in his four-year career.

During the spring of 1991, Emma's jersey number No. 16 became the first Boston College hockey number to be retired. His jersey was raised to the rafters in Kelley Rink on Feb. 23, 2001. Emma, who was drafted by the New Jersey Devils in the sixth round of the 1989 NHL Entry Draft, played with the Devils and Boston Bruins before competing in six games with the Florida Panthers in 2000-01. Prior to signing with Florida in 2000, he played the previous three years with Klagenfurt AC in the Austrian national league.



2000 HOBEY BAKER WINNER: MIKE MOTTAU

On April 14, 2000, Mike Mottau was awarded the 20th Annual Hobey Baker Award at the Decathlon Club in Bloomington, Minnesota. On that date, the nation came to know what those at Boston College had already known – that Mike Mottau was America's best collegiate hockey player.

Mottau was a three-time All-American, a three-time team MVP, and a three-time All-Hockey East selection. As a senior, he captured Hockey East Co-Player of the Year honors and the league's Best Defensive Defenseman award.

He'd established the Boston College career assist record, surpassing 1991 Hobey Baker Award winner David Emma. He'd also set the school mark for points by a defenseman. Further, he'd rewritten the league record books, becoming the Hockey East career leader in assists and points by a defenseman.

Mottau also became just the fourth player in history to capture the prestigious Walter Brown Award twice (most outstanding American-born hockey player in New England).

In his four years at BC, he represented his country three times in international competition. In 1998, he tallied two goals and two assists in the World Junior Championships in Finland. In 1999 and 2000, he participated alongside professionals in the World Championships. Mottau tallied two goals and one assist in three games in the 1999 tournament in Norway.

Still, Mottau's individual achievements meant little to Mike himself. The rugged defenseman took greater pride in his team's accomplishments.

When Mottau entered Boston College in the fall of 1996, the Eagles had endured five consecutive losing seasons. In short time, Mottau and his teammates reversed the program's fortunes. In his four seasons, Boston College won an amazing 99 games. Before his graduation, he'd patrolled the blueline on two Hockey East Tournament championship teams and three teams that had advanced to the NCAA Tournament's Frozen Four. Twice the Eagles played in the national championship game.

"Mike was truly an ambassador for college hockey. He was an ambassador for the college student-athlete," said Jerry York. "He had an exceptional presence on our campus – whether it was the dining hall or walking to class. He was recognizable, and he had a certain charisma to him. I believe he'll be remembered as one of the cornerstones of Boston College athletics.

When you talk about a Doug Flutie, when you talk about a (former basketball star) Michael Adams, you've got to talk about Mike Mottau in that same breath. That's the type of impact he had on Boston College Hockey and Boston College Athletics."

Mottau's jersey was raised to the rafters in Kelley Rink on Nov. 27, 2016.



2014 HOBEY BAKER WINNER: JOHNNY GAUDREAU

On April 11, 2014, Johnny Gaudreau was awarded the 34th Annual Hobey Baker Award at the Loews Hotel in Philadelphia. Many had already known that everyone else was playing second to Gaudreau. With such an amazing season, the 5-8 forward earned the moniker 'Johnny Hockey.'

Gaudreau left a significant imprint on the Boston College hockey program. In just three years wearing the maroon and gold, he accrued 175 points in just 119 games played, including 78 goals and 97 assists.

He left the Heights a top-10 scorer in program history, one of only two within that group to do so in three seasons.

Gaudreau's freshman year was special, meshing with a talent-laden roster and finishing just one point off the team lead (behind current New York Ranger Chris Kreider), posting 21 goals and 23 assists. His skill and inventiveness helped his famed coach hoist his third national title in five years.

"His ability to make other players better, his hockey sense and hockey IQ are right off the charts," Jerry York said at the time. "Those are just a few of the qualities that make Johnny so special. People talk about his size, but he plays with tons of grit and protects the puck very well. He battles and competes whatever the situation may be. He's going to play 60 full minutes to the best of his ability."

As a sophomore, Gaudreau led all of college hockey in scoring with 51 points, averaging 1.46 points per game. For his exploits, Gaudreau would win his first of two Hockey East Player of the Year awards and made his Hobey Baker debut as a Hat Trick Finalist in Pittsburgh.

In 2013-14, Boston College's storied historical archives were rewritten with a clean sweep of individual awards. Along with becoming BC's third Hobey Baker Award recipient, the New Jersey native won every award he was eligible for. Now a two-time First Team All-American and Hockey East Player of the Year, Gaudreau also won the Walter Brown Award, Leonard Fowle Award and Herb Gallagher Award.

Gaudreau's 80-point campaign in 2013-14 is the third-best individual season in Boston College history and the most of any college hockey player since Peter Sejna's 82-point performance with Colorado College in 2002-03. His 80 points in a season fell just three points shy of the school record set by Craig Janney (28-55-83) in 1986-87.

After one national championship, three Beanpot trophies and a laundry list of individual honors, Gaudreau opted to turn professional and sign with the Calgary Flames. He was flown out to Vancouver from the Hobey Baker ceremony to play in his first NHL game for Calgary on April 13, 2014. His first NHL shot resulted in the Flames' only goal of the night.

TEAM NOTES

- BC is 17-24 in 25 trips to the Frozen Four.

- In 2012, Boston College won its third national title in five years and fifth overall. Boston College is the first team since 1961 to win three championships in five seasons; Murray Armstrong's Denver team won three titles in four years (1958, 1960 and 1961) and BC has captured titles in 2008, 2010 and 2012. The all-time best is five titles in six years, accomplished by Michigan (1951, 1952, 1953, 1955 and 1956).
- The 2012 national championship marked Boston College's fifth NCAA Frozen Four and national championship game appearance in the last seven years. BC fell in the title game in 2006 (to Wisconsin, 2-1) and 2007 (Michigan State, 3-1), but captured the national title in its last three NCAA Championship game appearances – in 2008 (4-1 over Notre Dame), 2010 (5-0 over Wisconsin), and 2012 (4-1 over Ferris State).
- The 2010 NCAA Championship game between Boston College and Wisconsin at Ford Field in Detroit, Mich., was played before 37,592 fans, establishing a world record (at the time) for indoor hockey.
- Goaltender Parker Milner's .982 save percentage (110 saves, two goals against) in the 2012 tournament is third best all-time; it marked the best save percentage since 1972 and the best since the tournament expanded beyond four teams.
- Goaltender Parker Milner's 0.50 goals against average in the 2012 NCAA Tournament ties him for the best all-time with three others (Ken Dryden, Cornell in 1967; Gerry Powers, Denver in 1968, and Tim Regan, Boston University in 1972).
- In three of its most recent National Championship runs (2008, 2010, 2012), Boston College outscored its opponents by a 32-5 margin in the Frozen Four.
- Boston College has won two of its national championships on April 7 – in 2001 and 2012.
- Boston College's 4-1 win over Ferris State on April 7, 2012 marked the team's 19th straight victory that season.
- Boston College advanced to four straight Frozen Fours from 1998-2001. It participated in three straight Frozen Fours twice – 1948-50 and 2006-08.
- Boston College is 5-6 in the national championship game, including a 4-3 record under Jerry York.
- Boston College has a 4-7 overtime record in tournament play.
- Jerry York has led Boston College to 12 Frozen Fours while "Snooks" Kelley guided BC to nine; Len Ceglarski led the Eagles to four Frozen Four appearances.
- Jerry York is 41-24-1 in 24 NCAA Tournament berths, including a 36-14 mark in 18 tournaments at Boston College. York's 41 NCAA Tournament victories is the highest total in Division I history.
- With his five NCAA Championships (four with Boston College, one with Bowling Green), Jerry York has tied Denver's Murray Armstrong for second place among Division I head coaches. Only Michigan's Vic Heyliger (1948-56; six titles) has more championships than York.
- Jerry York is tied for second place with Murray Armstrong with 14 Frozen Four victories. York's 12 Frozen Four appearances are second all-time.
- Jerry York is one of just three coaches to lead two different schools to national titles. York led Bowling Green to the 1984 title, and Boston College to the 2001, 2008, 2010, 2012 titles.
- Jerry York has led BC to 18 NCAA Tournament appearances. Snooks Kelley and Len Ceglarski each led BC to nine NCAA Tournament berths.
- Goaltender John Muse went 8-1 in NCAA Tournament competition in his career. He earned NCAA Championships in 2008 and 2010. He allowed just one goal in two national-title game appearances and is just the fourth goaltender top post a shutout in the championship game (Boston College 5, Wisconsin 0; 2010), joining Denver's Adam Berkhoele (2004), Boston University's Tim Regan (1972) and Denver's Gerry Powers (1968).
- Nathan Gerbe tied the NCAA record with seven goals in four 2008 tournament victories. Additionally, Gerbe's five goals in the 2008 Frozen Four in Denver, marked the first time since Dave Silk in 1977 that a player registered five goals in Frozen Four play. That mark is tied for fourth-most all-time.

ATHLETIC ADMINISTRATION



BLAKE JAMES

Blake James was named the William V. Campbell Director of Athletics at Boston College, effective July 1, 2022.

James is an experienced, nationally respected athletics administrator who established a student-athlete approach at the University of Miami that focused on academic achievement, athletic success, and individual development. James served as the school's director of athletics from 2013-2021, leading the Hurricanes to multiple NCAA and ACC championships across numerous sports.

In his role, he oversaw 18 varsity sports involving more than 400 student-athletes, with a staff of more than 250 individuals and an annual budget of \$123 million.

At Miami, he set records for athletics fundraising and led the completion of major capital projects, including new indoor facilities for football, baseball, and golf, and facility enhancements for men and women's basketball. He negotiated and managed one of the largest collegiate sports apparel deals in the country, and significantly increased ticket sales for the school's football and basketball programs.

A proven leader within the NCAA and ACC, James served on the NCAA Board of Directors (2017-2019), NCAA Board of Governors (2017-2019), the NCAA Football Oversight Committee (2015-2017), and held leadership roles on the NCAA Student Athlete Experience Committee (2019-2021). A graduate of Minnesota State University-Mankato with a degree in marketing, James earned a master's degree in sports administration from St. Thomas University.

He began his athletic career at the University of Miami in tickets sales and development before moving to Providence College to work in athletic development. He later served as director of athletics at the University of Maine where he directed 19 Division I sports programs from 2005-2010, before returning to Miami as interim athletics director and senior associate A.D. for Development and Ticket Operations.

He was named Miami's Director of Athletics in 2013.

Since it opened its doors in October of 1988, Silvio O. Conte Forum has been the heart of the Boston College athletics program. BC men's hockey has won nearly 70% of its games at Conte Forum over the last 35 seasons.

During the 2022-23 season, Boston College led Hockey East with an average of 5,042 fans over its 15 home dates. The Eagles own an all-time record of 374-157-49 (.687 winning percentage) at Kelley Rink.

From October through March, Conte Forum's main arena is the home of the Eagles' men's and women's basketball and hockey teams, and some of the most thrilling sports action in Boston. The arena seats 8,606 for basketball and 7,884 for hockey.

It also houses the newly completed Hoag Basketball Pavilion, as well as offices for Athletic Department staff and varsity coaches, film and conference rooms, the weight training and sports medicine facilities, and locker and equipment rooms.

Conte Forum is also Boston College fan central, where tickets may be purchased for all BC athletics events. Its main concourse contains concession stands and souvenir shops.

Its restrooms serve both Alumni Stadium and the forum arena, and its eight luxury boxes overlook both venues.

All interviews with Boston College hockey players or coaches must be arranged through the athletic communications office. Players are not to be contacted directly, whether by cell phone, e-mail, or direct message on social media. Players will not be asked to miss class time for interviews.

PRESS FACILITIES

Boston College's hockey press box is located above the spectators' seating area on the south side of Kelley Rink. The press box can be accessed by taking the elevator on the building's south side to the fourth level. Writers and game operations personnel will be assigned seats in the two open areas of the fourth-floor press box.

INTERNET ACCESS

Wireless Internet access is available throughout Conte Forum. To gain access to the secure network, connect to the 'Conte Press' WiFi and use the password 'pressaccess'.

MEDIA SUITE

The Conte Forum media suite is located on the building's ground floor. To access the media suite, enter the visitor's skating lobby on the ground floor of the south side and proceed approximately 150 feet down the hallway located directly in the front right.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Photographers will also be issued credentials through the Athletic Communications Office, and will be allowed to shoot from a staging area on the concourse level (south side) of Conte Forum. Shooting from the penalty-box area is restricted to BC-affiliated personnel. Special requests may be made to athletic communications personnel.
