2013 Butler Football Notes

PFL Champ Bulldogs Boast 17 Returning Starters



Quarterback Matt Lancaster was named the Most Outstanding Offensive Player in the Pioneer Football League after leading the Bulldogs to a share of the 2012 league championship.

RETURNING CHAMPS: The Bulldogs head into the 2013 season with a roster that boasts experience and depth. Head coach Jeff Voris, who's led Butler to 28 wins over the past four seasons, can call on 42 returning letterwinners, including 17 returning starters, from last year's squad, which picked up a share of its second Pioneer Football League title in four years. Nine of those returning starters are on offense, including quarterback Matt Lancaster, who was named the Most Outstanding Offensive Player in the PFL last season, running back Trae Heeter, who was named Butler's Offensive MVP, and wide receiver Brendon Shannon, who led the team in both receptions and receiving yards. Voris further has four of five offensive line starters returning, including honorable mention All-PFL performers Charles Perrecone and David Tiwari. Among the eight returning defensive starters are Butler Defensive Lineman of the Year Jeremy Stephens, and defensive backs Sean Grady and Jayme Szafranski. Grady ranked second and Szafranski third on the team in tackles last year. Voris also returns his top placekicker (Jon Treloar) and top punter (Brian Akialis) from a year ago.

Butler returnees accounted for 277 of the Bulldogs' 302 points in 2012.

TITLE RUN: Butler finished the 2012 season in a three-way tie with Drake and San Diego for first place in the Pioneer Football League with a 7-1 record. It was Butler's second PFL championship in four seasons and third overall. The Bulldogs compiled a seven-game winning streak during the championship run and finished the year with an 8-3 overall record. The seven-game winning streak was the longest by any team in the PFL in 2012.

ALL-LEAGUE: The Bulldogs had 12 players named to the 2012 All-Pioneer Football League Team, and ten of those players are back this season. The returnees include four first team picks, quarterback Matt Lancaster, running back Trae Heeter, defensive lineman Jeremy Stephens and defensive back Sean Grady. Wide receiver Brendan Shannon was tabbed second team All-PFL, while defensive back Jayme Szafranski, offensive linemen Charles Perrecone and David Tiwari and defensive linemen Kyle Annis and Glen Somers earned honorable mention. Butler's other All-League players were linebacker Jordan Ridley, who earned first team honors for the third consecutive year, and offensive lineman Matt Storey, who also earned first team honors. Lancaster earned the league's top offensive individual award, while Annis was tabbed as the PFL's Freshman Defensive Lineman of the Year. Butler head coach Jeff Voris was selected as the PFL Coach of the Year.

STUNNING DEBUT: Quarterback Matt Lancaster, who transferred to Butler from Illinois State, made the most of his initial season as the Bulldogs' starter. The Butler signal caller completed 217 of 361 passes for 2,708 yards and 21 touchdowns. He compiled the second-highest single season total for passing yards in Butler football history, and his 21 touchdown throws tied the third-highest single season total ever for the Bulldogs! The West Lafayette, Ind., native became just the fourth quarterback in Butler football history to throw at least 20 touchdown passes in a season. Lancaster further led all Pioneer Football League guarterbacks in rushing with 408 yards on 111 carries.

Matt Lancaster ranked second in the PFL in total offense (3,116) in 2012.


RUSH HOUR: Running Back **Trae Heeter** became the first Butler player in more than a decade and just the fourth Butler player ever to lead the Pioneer Football League in rushing in 2012. Heeter gained 1,103 yards on 166 attempts in 10 games to pace the 10-team

conference. He rushed for more than 100 yards in five different games, including two contests with over 200 yards, and he had a league-high 10 rushing touchdowns. Other Butler players to lead the PFL in rushing were All-American Arnold Mickens (1994 & 1995) and Naim Sanders (1996 & 1998), who each topped the league twice, and Richard Johnson (1993), who led the PFL once.


Trae Heeter had Butler's 11th-highest single season rushing total in 2012.

ATTACK MODE: Defensive lineman Jeremy Stephens made the switch from tackle to end in 2012 and emerged as one of the top pass rushers in the Pioneer Football League. Stephens led the Bulldogs and ranked second in the PFL in tackles for loss with 14, and he finished third in the conference in quarterback sacks with 8.5. A former Lawrence Central High School player, Stephens sat out the 2010 season after transferring to Butler from Thomas More. He started all 11 games in 2011 and finished fifth on the team in tackles (54). He was in the starting lineup in all 11 games again last season, finishing fourth on the team in tackles (71). In his two seasons with the Bulldogs, Stephens has racked up 21.5 tackles for loss and 11.5 quarterback sacks.

ACADEMIC AWARD: Defensive back Jayme Szafranski became the fifth Butler player all-time to be named an Academic All-American in 2012. A finance major and honor student from Barrington, III., Szafranski was chosen to the second team of the 2012 Capital One Academic All-America Division I Football Team. The Bulldogs' third-leading tackler last season, Szafranski became Butler's first football Academic All-American since 2009, when defensive end Grant Hunter earned the national honor. He's Butler's fourth defensive player to be named to the Academic All-America team and the first defensive back.

BULLDOG BITS:

- •Sean Grady ranked third among defensive backs in the PFL in tackles in 2012 with 84 total stops. He's Butler's top returning tackler in 2013.
- •Wide receiver **Brendan Shannon** led the Bulldogs with 62 receptions for 864 yards and eight touchdowns in 2012. He posted the seventh-highest single season total for catches in school history and the eighth-highest season total for receiving yards.
- •Running back **Rico Watson** was named Butler's Newcomer of the Year last season. He led the team in kickoff return yards (467) and finished fourth on the team in rushing yards (118), while playing in all 11 games.

- •Placekicker **Jon Treloar** tied Butler's single game record with eight successful PAT kicks against Valparaiso last season.
- •Butler head coach **Jeff Voris** has been named PFL Coach of the Year twice in the past four seasons.

Head Coach Jeff Voris



Jeff Voris is entering his eighth season as Butler's head coach and for the second time in four years, he's coming off a championship campaign. He guided the Bulldogs to an 8-3 record, including a sevengame winning streak, and a share of the Pioneer Football League crown in 2012. It was Butler's third title as a Division I football program, and it came in a year when the Bulldogs were picked seventh in the PFL's preseason poll.

Voris, who stands fourth on Butler's all-time list for coaching victories (41), is no stranger to success. He owns Butler's single season record for victories, and he's the only coach in school history to lead the Bulldogs to a

postseason victory! Both of those accomplishments came in 2009, when he directed the most successful football season in school history! Voris, who improved the Bulldogs' win total in each of his first four seasons, took the 2009 Butler team, picked fifth in the Pioneer Football League preseason poll, and guided it to an 11-1 campaign, a tie for the PFL championship and Butler's first-ever post-season victory. The 11 wins set a Butler single season record and tied the PFL single season mark, and the league title was Butler's first since 1994. Butler also tied the existing PFL record for league wins (7), while setting a record for home wins (7) and completing an unbeaten Butler Bowl slate. The Bulldogs picked up the post-season win with a 28-23 victory over Central Connecticut State in the 2009 Gridiron Classic, a post-season game matching the champions of the PFL and the Northeast Conference. Voris guided the Bulldogs to nine straight wins to start the season, matching the Butler record for consecutive victories and making the 2009 Bulldogs just the third football squad in school history to own a 9-0 record. Included in that opening stretch was a 23-14 victory over Valparaiso in the annual Hoosier Helmet Trophy game. Appropriately, Voris was named the PFL Coach of the Year.

The historic 2009 Butler campaign came one year after Voris guided the Bulldogs to a 6-5 record, the program's first winning season in more than a decade! The six wins were Butler's most since 1997 and the second-most since the Bulldogs moved to Division I in 1993. And Butler's four league wins tied the Bulldogs' highest PFL win total to that point! The successful campaign came just one year after Voris guided Butler to a 4-7 mark in just his second season at the helm. The four victories were the most by a Butler football team since 2002 and marked another step forward for the program. In 2006, his first season as Butler's head coach, Voris guided the Bulldogs to a 3-8 mark and a tie for fifth place in the PFL. His first victory at Butler snapped an 18-game losing streak by the Bulldogs, and the team's three total wins matched Butler's victory total for the previous three seasons combined.

A former record-setting quarterback at DePauw University, Voris was named the 24th head football coach at Butler in December of 2005. He previously had served as head coach at Carroll (Wis.) College for five seasons, following assistant coaching stints at Edinboro, DePauw, Texas and Illinois.

Voris spent five seasons rebuilding the football program at Carroll. His first team in 2001 had just 51 players. In 2005 with the squad size up to 111 players, he guided the Pioneers to a 6-4 record and a third place finish in the Midwest Conference. It was Carroll's first winning season since 1996, and the Pioneers' six league wins tied the school record for most MWC wins.

During his five campaigns at Carroll, Voris coached one second team All-American, one honorable mention All-American, 11 first team all-conference players and 30 academic all-conference performers. He coached an all-conference quarterback in four of his five seasons. Carroll teams broke 10 school records for offense and special teams during his tenure, and his 2005 squad ranked fourth in the NCAA Division III in punt return average.

Voris took the Carroll head coaching position after

spending one season on the staff of head coach Lou Tepper at Edinboro. He previously served under head coach Nick Mourouzis at DePauw. During his four seasons as offensive coordinator at DePauw, the Tigers compiled a 29-11 record, won one conference championship and posted four consecutive wins over Wabash in the Monon Bell Classic. He coached an all-conference quarterback in 1996 and 1997, and DePauw ranked eighth in the NCAA Division III in passing offense in 1996. DePauw also ranked first in Division III in turnover margin in 1996 and eighth in turnover margin in 1998. He was the head junior varsity coach at DePauw in 1994-95, and he served as strength and conditioning coach for the Tigers in all six seasons.

Voris began his collegiate coaching career in 1990 as a graduate assistant at Illinois. During his two seasons with the Illini, he assisted with defensive backs and outside linebackers. He later spent two seasons at Texas, where he worked with wide receivers and the offensive line.

The Butler coach was a four-year starting quarterback at DePauw, 1986-89. He was a three-time team Most Valuable Player and a team captain in 1989. He earned honorable mention All-America recognition in 1988 and 1989, and he still holds DePauw career football records for most passing yards (6,035), most touchdown passes (56), most pass completions (504), most pass attempts (910) and total offense (5,754). He set single game records with 38 completions against Findlay in 1987 and five touchdown passes against Taylor in 1988, and he's the only player in DePauw football history to lead the Tigers in passing for four consecutive seasons! He was inducted into the DePauw Athletic Hall of Fame in 2009.

Voris earned a bachelor's degree in health, physical education and recreation from DePauw in 1989 and a master's degree in athletic administration from Illinois in 1991. He and his wife, Julie, are parents of three children, Jenna (17), Josie (15) and Jessy (12).

Joe Cheshire Co-Defensive Coordinator

Joe Cheshire is in his ninth season as a full-time assistant coach, following one season with the Bulldogs as a part-time assistant. He serves as Butler's recruiting coordinator and Co-Defensive Coordinator, while also working with the Bulldogs' defensive secondary. Cheshire joined the Bulldogs in 2004, after spending two seasons as offensive backs coach at DePauw University. In his final season at DePauw, the Tigers led the Southern

Collegiate Athletic Conference in rushing yards per game. The son of former Butler football player Jim Cheshire ('75), Joe was a four-year football letterwinner at DePauw. He was the Tigers' offensive Most Valuable Player in 1997, and he served as a football team captain in 1998. He earned all-conference recognition as a junior, when he led DePauw in pass receiving. Cheshire received a B. A. degree from DePauw in 1999 and began a brief business career before returning to the football field in 2002. He and his wife, Ashleigh, have two children, Griffin and Charlotte.

Tim Cooper Co-Defensive Coordinator

Former Miami (Ohio) and Carroll College football assistant Tim Cooper was named an assistant football coach at Butler in March, 2010. He serves as a Co-Defensive Coordinator and Special Teams Coordinator, while working directly with Butler's linebackers. Cooper was the defensive secondary coach at Miami (Ohio), 2004-2008, helping the RedHawks to three Mid-American Conference East championships. He previously had

served as defensive secondary and linebackers coach at Carroll, 2001-2003, where he worked under current Butler head coach Jeff Voris. Most recently, Cooper served as defensive quality control-secondary at Indiana University. Cooper began his coaching career as a graduate assistant coach/recruiting coordinator at DePauw University in 1997. He accepted a position assisting with the secondary at the University of Rhode Island in 1999 and then took a graduate assistant position at the University of Connecticut in 2000. Cooper also served one season as a graduate assistant coach at Miami (Ohio) in 2003, helping the RedHawks to a 13-1 record, a Mid-American Conference championship, a berth in the GMAC Bowl and a #10 national ranking.

À three-year defensive starter as a player at DePauw, Cooper earned four varsity letters and helped the Tigers to the 1996 Indiana Collegiate Athletic Conference championship. He was the Defensive Most Valuable Player for the 101st Monon Bell Game, and he served as team captain for the 1996 squad, which broke 27 school records and led the NCAA Division III in turnover margin. Cooper earned a B.A. degree from DePauw in 1997 and a master's degree from Indiana State University in 1999.

Tom Dilley Tight Ends

Tom Dilley is in his first season with the Bulldogs, and he's working with Butler's tight ends. Dilley served as head coach at Bishop Chartard High School in Indianapolis from 1990 to 2002 and as head coach at Lawrence North High School from 2003 to 2012. He guided Chatard to a pair of state championships, including a 15-0 season in 2002, and he finished in second place on the all-time wins list at Lawrence North. He was the Nike Coach

of the Year in 2001, the *Indianapolis Star* Super Team Coach of the Year in 2002 and a three-time *Bloomington Herald-Times* 3A Coach of the Year. He's the first person in the history of the IHSAA football playoffs to win state championships as a player, assistant coach and head coach.



Kyle Conner Co-Offensive Coordinator

Kyle Conner is in his third tour with Butler's football program. The former Butler player and assistant coach returned to the Bulldogs in 2012 as offensive line coach and co-offensive coordinator. Conner rejoined Butler's staff after spending five seasons as an assistant football coach at Indiana (2006-10) and one season on the staff at Valparaiso (2011). He served in several offensive capacities with the Hoosiers, including

Offensive Quality Control (2006), tight ends coach (2007-08), assistant offensive line coach (2009) and offensive tackles/tight ends coach (2010). He was part of the staff that led Indiana to its first bowl game in 14 years in 2007. During his one season at Valparaiso, he served as secondary coach and special teams coordinator. Conner was a standout wide receiver at Butler, 1997-2000, and he finished his career in third place on Butler's all-time list for pass receptions (124) and in fourth place in all-time receiving yards (1,801). He remains on Butler's "Top 10" list in both categories, as well as the Bulldogs' single season lists for both receptions and receiving yards, and he still holds the Butler single game record with 260 receiving yards against San Diego in 2000. The 2001 Butler graduate first joined the Bulldogs' football staff in 2002 as tight ends coach, before serving as wide receivers coach (2003-04) and co-offensive coordinator (2005). Kenan Smith Receivers

Kenan Smith is in his third season as an assistant coach at Butler, and he's responsible for the Bulldogs' receivers. He joined the Butler staff after spending one season as a graduate assistant coach in charge of wide receivers at Anderson University. He also served as a football operations volunteer intern at Ball State during the summer of 2010. A two-sport athlete at Sacramento State (1999-2003), Smith began his post-graduation career as

a marketing intern in the athletic department at the University of Michigan. He served as Assistant Director of Marketing & Promotions at Michigan from 2006 to 2009. His duties at Michigan included working with football, men's basketball, women's basketball, corporate hospitality, print/design projects and managing the student intern program. Smith was an all-conference wide receiver in football and a sprinter on the track team as an undergraduate at Sacramento State. He served as a football team captain as a senior and finished his collegiate career ranked in the school's "Top 10" list for all-time receptions. Off the field, he served for three years on the NCAA Division I Student-Athlete Advisory Committee. Smith earned a degree in business administration from Sacramento State in 2005, and he's done additional work toward a master's degree in business administration at Anderson.

Located on the northeast side of Butler's campus just east of storied Hinkle Fieldhouse, the Butler Bowl project took a major step forward with the addition of new bleacher and chairback seats on the west side, visitor's seating on the east side and a new brick press box stretching between the 30-yard lines. The new seats boosted the stadium capacity to 5,647, and the new press box added main level areas for media, radio, coaches and boosters as well as an upper level video area and observation deck.

The facelift continued in 2011 with the addition of lights to the Butler Bowl, allowing the Bulldogs to play night games on campus for the first time.

The renovation of the Butler Bowl, part of a plan to build new student housing along the east side of the stadium, began during the summer of 2005 with the removal of the Hilton U. Brown Theatre, located in the south end zone, and the demolition of the east stands. A new field turf surface replaced the former grass field and a new scoreboard was added to the south end zone. The field itself was raised by nearly eight feet and moved slightly to the south.

The original Butler Bowl was designed as part of a massive project developed to give Butler University one of the finest athletic plants in the nation. Construction on the Bowl was completed in time for the start of the 1928 football season, and Butler inaugurated the stadium by defeating Franklin, 55-0.

The Bowl opened with seating for 36,000 spectators. The first major change to the Bowl came in 1955, when the Hilton U. Brown Theatre was constructed in the south end zone. The huge outdoor theater replaced 16,000 seats and gave Butler one of the premier open-air stage facilities in the Midwest. For years, the Hilton U. Brown Theatre served as the summer home for Starlight Musicals, which brought the best in off-Broadway performances to Indianapolis.



The 2013 season marks the 21st year for the Pioneer Football League – the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Subdivision conference.

The PFL is one of only two conferences that sponsor football as its only sport (the Missouri Valley Football Conference being the other). However, the PFL is a truly national conference with members on each coast and throughout the nation's heartland. The league still retains four of its charter members – Butler University, the University of Dayton, Drake University and Valparaiso University, plus the University of San Diego (joining in 1992) – which were joined in 2001 by Davidson College, Jacksonville University and Morehead State University. Campbell University joined the PFL in 2008, its first season of intercollegiate football. Marist College, which joined for the 2009 season, further extended the league's footprint into the northeast.

In January 1991 the NCAA passed legislation to require Division I institutions to sponsor all intercollegiate sports at the Division I level. The five charter members (Evansville the fifth before dropping football in 1997), each dedicated to the enhancement and sound management of intercollegiate football as an integral part of the student-athletes' collegiate experience, joined together to form the Pioneer Football League. From the league's inception it has been a proponent of the creation of a non-scholarship football classification within Division I and adopted the moniker of Pioneer based on the intent to become the first league in that new division. The PFL's original membership was comprised of NCAA Division I universities that previously sponsored intercollegiate football at other levels.

In recent years the league has attracted those institutions committed to the principles of the PFL model when beginning their football program, including Jacksonville which started its program in the non-scholarship mold in 1998 and Campbell which did so in 2008. In 2013, the league expanded is footprint in the Southeast when Mercer University and Stetson University – which each restarted long dormant programs – join the league.

The PFL began play in 1993 with Dayton winning the league's first crown. The league spent its first season in 1993 under the administrative guidance of the Midwestern Collegiate Conference and the office moved to St. Louis in 1994 when current commissioner Patty Viverito was named the PFL commissioner, a leadership position she continues to fill.





Butler University

The five faculty and 113 students present when Butler University opened in 1855 laid a solid foundation for 157 years of creative change and progress. Today's more than 4,000 students continue to look ahead while treasuring the traditions unique to Butler.

The young school, originally named North Western Christian University, was unusually innovative. It was the first in Indiana, and only the third in the nation, to admit women on an equal basis with men. With the appointment in 1858 of Catherine Merrill as Demia Butler Professor of English, the institution became the second in the country to appoint a woman faculty member, the first to establish an endowed chair specifically for a female professor and the first to establish a professorship in English literature. The school was also the first in Indiana to allow its students, with parental consent, to choose subjects under a new "elective" system.

As Indianapolis grew, the city's commercial district began to penetrate the heavily-wooded campus at what is now the corner of Thirteenth Street and College Avenue. In 1873, the board of directors decided to sell the downtown campus and accept a gift of 25 acres in Irvington, then a suburb east of Indianapolis. In 1877, North Western Christian University became Butler University, taking the name of its founder, Indianapolis attorney Ovid Butler.

Butler moved again 50 years later, as the "Circle City" continued to grow. In 1928, classes were held for the first time in Jordan Hall, an imposing new Gothic structure erected on the beautiful Fairview Park Site, a wooded tract north of the city on the White River and the Inland Waterway Canal.

Today's students come from nearly every state in the nation and from many foreign countries to enroll in degree programs in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, or in one of four professional colleges -- Business Administration, Education, Fine Arts or Pharmacy and Health Sciences. Butler is one of only 21 private schools in the



country offering a pharmacy program.

True to the vision of its founders, the University continues to offer an array of professional and pre-professional programs within the context of a strong commitment to the traditional arts and sciences and to the values of liberal education. Butler continues to welcome highly motivated, intellectually curious men and women, and to prepare them for lives of professional and community service and creative, ethical action. Butler is one of the top 20 U. S. colleges for producing business executives, is in the top 10% for preparing future Ph.D.s and is located in the #2 city for college graduates starting a career.
