COACHING STAFF

KIP SIMONS

HEAD COACH

Kip Simons, a decorated head coach and Olympic performer, was announced on Sept. 14, 2015 as the new head gymnastics coach at Navy. Simons came to Annapolis after 10 years as the head coach of an Air Force team that became a perennial top-10 program. He is beginning his ninth season with the Navy Gymnastics program in



Simons has had a near flawless transition to Navy and has seen his Midshipmen teams

make an immediate impact on the national scene. Over his first eight years in Annapolis, the Mids have qualified for and competed at the NCAA Championship Meet in each campaign. (Navy was on its way to a fifth straight trip before the COVID-19 pandemic halted the 2020 season in mid-March). Regionally, Simons and the Mids have captured the ECAC Championship in 2016, 2018, 2019, 2021, 2022 and 2023. Prior to Navy's ECAC title in 2016, the last time the team had been atop the podium was 1989. Additionally, the Mids won the 2019, 2022 and 2023 USAG Collegiate Championships and have been victorious over Air Force and Army in the All-Academy Championship in 2019, 2020, 2021 and 2022.

His Midshipmen teams have also shown themselves to be top-notch scholars in the classroom as six times in his first eight years, Navy has ranked amongst the top-10 national in the CGA All-America Scholar-Athlete program for team GPA. All together, 78 Mids have earned individual honors for posting GPAs above 3.2; 10 in 2023; 11 in 2022; 13 in 2021; nine in 2020, eight in 2019, eight in 2018, nine in 2017 and 10 in 2016.

The 2023 Navy team re-loaded on the fly and saw its large sophomore and junior classes push to the forefront of regular season, postseason and international competitions, as well as in the classroom. Under Simons' leadership the Mids went 11-6 in regular season and 5-0 against ECAC foes with a 394.05-393.15 victory over the Army Black Knights highlighting the slate. In the postseason, Navy swept both the USAG and ECAC Championships for the second consecutive season. The cumulation of the Mids' growth under Simons came at the NCAA Championships when seven gymnasts advanced to the championship finals and two, Isaiah Drake and Syam Buradagunta garnered NCAA All-American honors for their respective efforts in the all-around and floor exercise disciplines. Those accolades are the first for the program at the NCAA Championships since Eric Swanson in 1973. Internationally, Drake, who was a member of the U.S. Senior National Development Team, competed at the 2023 DTB Pokal Gymnastics Festival on March 17-19 in Stuttgart, Germant with the American Mixed Cup Team. In the summer of 2023, Drake, Buradagunta and Ronan McQuillan all turned in top-flight scores at the the 2023 Core Hydration Classic (formerly known as the U.S. Classic). Away from the competition gym, Ian Dinmore was named the 2023 NCAA ELITE 90 Award for collegiate men's gymnastics. A leader in the USNA's Class of 2024, Dinmore became just the second-ever Naval Academy student-athlete to earn this exclusive honor.

Personally, Simons was named the 2023 USAG Co-National Coach of the Year following the national meet.

After COVID heavily impacted the 2020 and 2021 seasons, Simons and the 2022 Midshipmen squad found their next gear and was turning in top-level results throughout the regular season and later into the postseason. Navy finished the regular seaon with an overall record of 14-3 with their

only losses to the Big Ten's Penn State twice and Illinois once. In the annual Star Meet, Navy cruised to a 17.7-point victory over Army. The win was the fourth straight over Army. Navy also earned its fourth straight All-Academy Championship over Army and Air Force with a 12.25-point advantage over the Black Knights and a 13.6-point edge over the Falcons. The Mids' momentum carried over into the postseason where they finished atop the standings at the USAG Collegiate Championship and a week later at the ECAC Championship. The USAG team title was the second in a row for program, while the ECAC crown extended Navy's win streak to four straight league championships. All together, Navy gymnasts collected five individual titles at the USAGs and six more at the ECACs.

Navy's campaign culminated at the 2022 NCAA Championship in Norman, Oklahoma where more history was made. Competing at the national championship for the seventh time in program history, the Mids posted a team-best seventh-place result with 399.023 points. Among the field of 12 squads, Navy outscored Penn State, Cal, Air Force, Springfield and Army. The Mids' previous team-best result was tenth place. Josh Williams (R) and Giovanni Gambatese (HB) challenged for All-American honors as Williams was 10th, just 0.067 out of eighth, while Gambatese was 0.234 points out in

During the offseason, the program was once again on the national stage as Isaiah Drake represented the Naval Academy at the 2022 U.S. Classic and the 2022 U.S. Men's Gymnastics Championship. His efforts at the latter earned him one of the highly sought after spots on the United States' Men's Senior National Development Team. Drake is the first member of the Navy men's gymnastics team in modern history to earn a position with either the senior national or senior development teams for U.S. Gymnastics.

Simons garnered accolades as the USAG Varsity and CGA East Regional Coach of the Year. Additionally, the Navy gymnastics program was awarded the 2021-22 NAAA Director of Athletics Cup.

Simons had a pivotal role in leading the program through a tricky COVID-19 impacted 2021 slate. Competing in both in-person and virtual meets, as well as around a month-long restriction of movement for the Naval Academy, the Mids won the 2021 All-Academy Championship before recording 397.8 points at the ECAC Championship to win its third straight league title. At the NCAA Championship Qualifying Meet, Navy turned in a score of 390.9 to rank 11th in the nation. Individually, six Mids advanced to the event final and three, Ryan McVay (10th in AA), David Toussaint (10th on PH) and Giovanni Gambatese (14th on HB) nearly attained All-American status. Both Toussaint and Gambatese were 0.1 points out of eighth place. while McVay posted a career-best AA score. McVay added to his resume as he concluded his career at the 2021 U.S. Gymnastics Championship. Competing for a chance to represent the United States at the Tokyo Olympics, McVay placed 23rd in the all-around.

In an abridged 2020 campaign, Navy was on its way to a season to remember as the program collected a win the Star Meet over Army (its fourth in five years) and placed first at the All-Academy Championship for the second consecutive year over Air Force and Army. Consistent throughout the year, the Mids scored 402.0 points or more in five of their seven competitions and eventually concluded the shortened season with the fifth-best scoring average in the NCAA ranks at 406.63. Individually, four Mids earned CGA All-American honors. Ben Provost (HB), Cash Buske (HB), Josh Williams (R) and Connor Van Loo (V). As a whole, Navy gymnasts garnered an additional 24 All-ECAC and 12 USAG Collegiate All-America awards.

Simons was recognized as the ECAC, USAG Varsity and CGA East Regional Coach of the Year for his efforts in 2020.

The success for Simons and the Midshipmen hit new levels during the 2019 season when the program won the Star Meet on the road in front of a hostile Army crowd, won the All-Academy Championship for the first time since 2009, placed first at the USAG Collegiate Championship for the first time since 2008, repeated as ECAC champions and then set a program-record with a 10th place result at the NCAA Championship Meet. The team scored a 393.123 in its respective qualifying session to usurp California. Navy's score also placed ahead of Army's result in the second session. Ryan McVay (HB), Ryan Orce (PB), Dan Clark (PH) and David Toussaint (FX) all advanced to the NCAA Championship Meet.

Simons garnered accolades as the ECAC, USAG Varsity and CGA East Regional Coach of the Year in 2019.

Academically, Simons had the Midshipmen performing at a high level in the classroom as well as they posted a cumulative GPA of 3.131 for the 2018-19 school year to rank eighth in the nation. Individually, eight Mids earned CGA All-American Scholar-Athlete nods. Team captain Christian Correale led the way once again as he was voted a Google Cloud Second Team All-American.

As a third-year head coach in 2018, the Mids qualified for the NCAA Championship with the 10th-highest National Qualifying Average (401.550) in the nation. At the competition at UIC, the Mids finished in fifth place in session one with a score 390.921. Overall, that ranked the Mids 11th out of 12 teams. Lucas Beltran (V), Frank Bradley (V), Trevor North (PB), and David Toussaint (PH)) all advanced to the NCAA Championship Meet and the individual event finals. Simons garnered the CGA East Regional Coach of the Year and the ECAC Coach of the Year awards.

In the classroom. Christian Correale was selected as a Google Cloud Academic All-American Third Team honoree. As a team, Navy ranked tenth in the nation with a cumulative GPA of 3.049.

During his second year in Annapolis in 2017, the Mids recreated the magic of 2016 and qualified as a team for the NCAA Championship for the second straight season. Seeded 12th in the field, Navy surpassed that mark and netted 400.65 points in the second session at West Point, N.Y. to finish 11th overall at the meet, edging California by 0.4 points. A pair of championship final qualifiers in Jonny Tang (AA) and Lucas Beltran (FX, V) led the Mids to the highest finish in program history at the national competition.

While competing at the 2017 USAG and ECAC Championships, Navy gymnasts secured five individual event titles: Jonny Tang (ECAC - AA, FX), Tanner West (ECAC - PB), Lucas Beltran (USAG - V) and Ben Provost (USAG - HB).

For its work outside the gym, Navy ranked seventh in the nation with a cumulative GPA of 3.21. The program also earned 2017 Academic Progress Rate (APR) public recognition from the NCAA.

Simons was recognized as the 2017 CGA East Regional Coach of the Year.

In his first season as the Mids' head coach in 2016, the team incurred new levels of success both in and out of the gym. Simons and Navy captured the program's first ECAC Championship since 1989 with a score of 423.4 to tie with Army West Point for the title. A program-record 424.1 score at the All-Academy Championship helped the team earn the league's automatic qualifying spot for the NCAA Championship and break the tie for ECAC supremacy. The Mids' spot as a team at the NCAA Championship was just the second ever in program history and first since 2009. In the national meet in Columbus, Ohio, Navy competed in the first team session and recorded a 410.1 score. Three individuals from the team advanced to the events finals: Jonny Tang (AA), Connor Gonzales (R) and Eric Poletti (R).

Prior to the NCAAs, Navy earned 15 All-ECAC honors for top-six performances at the ECAC Championship with Mitchell Larios (V and PB), Eric Morrison (PH) and Gonzales (R) taking home event titles.

In the classroom, Connor Westrick was selected as a CoSIDA Academic All-American Third Team honoree. As a team, Navy ranked fifth in the nation in with a team grade point average of 3.355.

Simons was recognized as the 2016 CGA East Regional Coach of the Year, as well as the ECAC Men's Gymnastics Co-Coach of the Year.

An internationally renown gymnast since 1988, Simons was a four-year member of the United States Senior National team and competed on two world championship teams, as well as with the gold medal winning teams at the 1994 Goodwill Games and 1995 Pan-American Games. His competitive career culminated with a spot on the 1996 United States Olympic team. At the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta, Simons was a member of the U.S. team that finished fifth overall.

After retiring from international competition, Simons moved into collegiate coaching at the University of California in 2001. In five seasons from 2001 to 2005, the Bears twice finished in third place at the NCAA Championships and had four individuals win national championships. Simons was named Associate Head Coach of the Bears for his final season in Berkeley.

Beginning with the 2005-06 season, Simons started a 10-year reign in charge of the gymnastics program at the United States Air Force Academy. A five-time USAG Varsity Head Coach of the Year, the Falcons thrived under his leadership and expertise. In both 2012 and 2014, Air Force earned rankings as high as eighth nationally. Simons took a team to the NCAA National Qualifying Meet and saw 15 gymnasts advance into the NCAA Championships in each of his final five years in Colorado Springs. On three occasions under his tutelage Falcon athletes earned NCAA All-American nods, Greg Stine twice in 2008 (all-around and rings) and Tim Wang in 2014 (pommel horse).

In USAG National Championship competition, Simons and Air Force won six straight team titles from 2010 through 2015 and collected 28 individual event titles.

While at Air Force, Simons was the recipient of four CGA Collegiate Division National Head Coach of the Year awards (2010, 2011, 2012, 2013), as well as two NCAA Regional Head Coach of the Year (2008, 2010) and Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Coach of the Year (2006, 2014) honors, respectively.

A 1994 graduate from Ohio State University, Simons earned numerous honors throughout his four years with the Buckeyes, including Big Ten Freshman of the Year and the Nissen-Emery Award, as the nation's top senior gymnast. He was a four-year member of the All-Big 10 and earned conference titles on the parallel bars (1992, 1994), still rings (1992) and high

bar (1993). Simons garnered two NCAA All-America nods during his time in Columbus. In September 2006, the Varsity "O" Association inducted him into Ohio State's Athletic Hall of Fame.

For his work and success throughout the sport, Simons was inducted into the USA Gymnastics Hall of Fame in the summer of 2010. He was joined in that induction class by 1996 Olympic team gold medalist Dominique Moceanu, 1992 Olympic team bronze medalist Wendy Bruce-Martin, 2000 Olympian Jennifer Parilla, two-time U.S. Men's Olympic team head coach Kevin Mazeika and 2000 U.S. Olympic trampoline coach Robert Null.

CRAIG HOLT ASSISTANT COACH

Craig Holt enters his 25th season with the Navy program in 2024. After 16 years as an assistant coach with Dr. Sho Fukushima through 2015, he stayed on staff under the leadership for new head coach Kip Simons. Holt is directly involved in the coaching of Navy's rings and high bar units.

Combining his talents with Simons since the fall of 2015, Holt and the program have reached new heights with seven trips to the NCAA Championship (Navy was on its way to a



fifth straight trip before the COVID-19 pandemic halted the 2020 season in mid-March). Prior to this run of competition on the highest national stage, Navy had only been to the NCAAs in 2009. Navy's success has resulted Holt earning CGA East Regional Assistant Coach of the Year honors in 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020 and 2022.

Regionally, the Mids have captured the ECAC Championship in 2016, 2018, 2019, 2021, 2022 and 2023. Prior to Navy's ECAC title in 2016, the last time the team had been atop the podium was 1989. Additionally, Holt and the Mids have earned four consecutive All-Academy Championship titles in 2019, 2020, 2021 and 2022 and the 2008, 2019, 2022 and 2023 USAG Collegiate Championships.

Navy kept breaking new ground under Holt's tutelage in 2023 as the team swept the Star Meet, USAG and ECAC Championships once again. The 2023 NCAA Championship saw Navy gymnasts breakthrough at the All-American level as Syam Buradagunta and Isaiah Drake finished top-eight and garnered the program's first All-American honors since 1973.

The 2022 season was one for the record books as Holt and the Mids as they cruised in the regular season with Star Meet and All-Academy Championship wins before rolling to USAG and ECAC Championships in the postseason. All total, Navy gymnasts earned five individual titles at the USAGs and six more at the ECACs. At the 2022 NCAA Championship, the Mids posted a team-best result of seventh place as nine individuals advanced to the NCAA Championship Finals. Josh Williams (R) and Giovanni Gambatese (HB) challenged for All-American honors as Williams was 10th, just 0.067 out of eighth, while Gambatese was 0.234 points out in 13th. Additionally, Williams was selected as a finalist for the 2022 Nissen-Emery Award; he was the first Mid since Andrew Faulk in 2012 to make it to the final round of the national honor.

In his 22nd season on staff with the Mids, Holt helped the program navigate a tricky COVID-19 impacted slate. Competing in both in-person and virtual meets, as well as around a month-long restriction of movement

for the Naval Academy, the Mids won the 2021 All-Academy Championship and scored a regular season-high of 398.6 points against Penn State. In the postseason, Navy won its third straight ECAC title. At the NCAA Championship Qualifying Meet, Navy finished 11th in the nation. Individually, six Mids advanced to the event final and three, Ryan McVay (10th in AA), David Toussaint (10th on PH) and Giovanni Gambatese (14th on HB) nearly attained All-American status. Both Toussaint and Gambatese were 0.1 points out of eighth place, while McVay posted a career-best AA score.

In an abridged 2020 campaign, Navy was on its way to a season to remember as the program collected a win the Star Meet over Army (its fourth in five years), placed first at the All-Academy Championship, scored 402.0 points or more in five of their seven competitions and eventually concluded the shortened season with the fifth-best scoring average in the NCAA ranks at 406.63.

In his 20th season on staff, Holt and the Mids achieved nearly every goal set in front of them in 2019 as they were victorious over Army in the Star Meet and later Air Force and Army at the All-Academy Championship. In the postseason, Navy rolled to team titles at the USAG Collegiate Championship and the ECAC Championship meets. The final touch on Navy's 2019 season was a 10th-place result at the NCAA Championships. For Navy's success, Holt was named the CGA East Regional, USAG Varsity and ECAC Co-Assistant Coach of the Year with his fellow Navy assistant coach Colin Payne.

In 2018, the Mids competed at the NCAA Championships for the third straight year as Navy tallied the 10th-highest national qualifying average during the regular season. At the NCAAs, Navy placed 11th overall. Four Mids earned their way into the event finals of the NCAA Championship, while four athletes won five combined individual titles over the USAG or ECAC Championship meets.

The recipient of the 2017 CGA East Regional and ECAC Men's Gymnastics Assistant Coach of the Year awards, Holt and the Mids had another standout campaign during the 2017 season. Navy qualified for and competed as a team at the NCAA Championship for the second straight year and came away with a program-best 11th place finish. Individual highlights from 2017 include five event titles at the ECAC and USAG Championships.

2016 was a banner year for Holt and the Navy program as the team captured the ECAC Championship and an automatic bid into the NCAA Championship. Navy's ECAC crown was its first since 1989, while a team appearance in the NCAAs had only occured once prior back in 2009. Three Mids advanced from the team qualifying meet to the events finals of the NCAA Championships, Jonny Tang (AA), Connor Gonzales (R) and Eric Poletti (R). For the team's stellar performance during the season, Holt was recognized as the CGA East Regional Assistant Coach of the Year, as well as the ECAC Men's Gymnastics Co-Assistant Coach of the Year.

During 2013-15 seasons, Holt helped three athletes qualify for and compete in the NCAA Championships. In April of 2015, Jonny Tang was an entrant in the all-around, while Mitchell Larios took on the nation's best on the vault in 2014. Chris Junghans finished 12th overall in the all-around in 2013 and missing the top-10 by just 0.4 points.

Prior to Junghans, Holt helped Andrew Faulk to his spectacular 2012 senior campaign, which included a 13th-place finish at the NCAA Championships. In 2011, Holt was named ECAC Tri-Assistant Coach of the Year as he helped guide Dylan Parrott and Faulk to the NCAAs.

In 2009, Holt assisted in helping the Midshipmen to a memorable season, as they finished with an impressive 15-4 record and a N-Star victory at Army. In addition, the Mids won their second-straight All-Academy Championship.

placed second at the ECAC Championship and advanced as a team to the NCAA Qualifying Meet for the first time in program history.

His efforts in the gym have not gone unrecognized, as he has been named the NCAA East Region Assistant Coach of the Year (2007), USAG Collegiate Division Assistant Coach of the Year (2006, 2008, 2019, 2020 and 2022), ECAC Assistant Coach of the Year (2003, 2007, 2011-Tri, 2016-Co, 2019 and 2020) and CGA Regional Assistant Coach of the Year (2007-Co, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020 and 2022).

During the summer of 2005, Holt coached the United States team in the 2005 Maccabiah Games in Israel. Holt guided the United States to a secondplace team finish with gold medal performances in the floor exercise and pommel horse. In addition to his coaching duties, Holt also served as a judge at the Maccabiah Games.

Holt came to the Academy after serving as an assistant coach for one season at William & Mary and two years at his alma mater, Syracuse.

As a gymnast, Holt was an NCAA finalist on the rings in 1994. He is a 1995 graduate of Syracuse, where he earned a degree in physical education. Holt earned his master's degree in exercise physiology from Syracuse in the summer of 2002.

MIKE REID **ASSISTANT COACH**

Mike Reid, a two-time NCAA Champion and multiple-time international championship competitor joined the Navy men's gymnastics program as an assistant coach in November of 2021. Reid comes to Annapolis after a decorated collegiate career at Oklahoma, while still competing internationally with the Jamaican National Team. Most recently, he coached at the Texas Dreams Academy in Coppell, Texas.



in pommel horse and parallel bars action saw a pair of Mids finish the regular season ranked among the nation's top-25 as Ronan McQuillan ('24) had the ninth-best national qualifying average (NQA) on the pommel horse, while Isaiah Drake ('25) was 21st in the final standings for NQA on the p-bars. Drake's collegiate season culminated with All-American honors at the 2023 NCAA Championship for his work in the all-around competition; Navy's first

A-A since 1973. During the off-season, both McQuillan and Drake showcased their talents at the 2023 U.S. Classic in August. Directly involved with the coaching of the Mids' pommel horse and parallel

bars teams during his first season in 2022, Navy finished the season ranked ninth in the national standings for the pommel horse and tenth on the p-bars. Individually, Daniel Clark ('22) and Ronan McQuillan ('24) finished top-20 on the pommel horse for scoring average, while Dhiren Lutchman ('22) completed the regular season with the 12th-best average on the parallel bars. Syam Buradagunta ('24) and McQuillan qualified for and competed in the NCAA Championship Event Finals for the pommel horse. As a team, Navy earned its highest-ever finish at the NCAA Championships as the Mids came in seventh overall in the field.

A standout technician on the pommel horse, Reid broke through on the national scene at the University of Oklahoma earning All-America nods in 2013 and 2014 before capping his collegiate career with an individual

NCAA Championship on the pommel horse in 2015. At the time he was just the third-ever OU gymnast to win a national title on the pommel horse. He concluded his career in Norman with five of the top-seven scores on the pommel horse in program history. Additionally, Reid competed on the parallel bars with great success. As a program, the Sooners finished second at the NCAA Championships in Reid's first three seasons before reaching the pinnacle and capturing the team title in 2015.

Since graduating from Oklahoma in 2015 he has tested himself in international competition as a member of the Jamaican National Team, while breaking into the field of amateur coaching. Reid has competed with the Jamaican National Team at the 2019 World Championships the 2021 Central American Championships and most recently at the 2022 Pan-American and Commonwealth Games. At CAC championship in El Salvador in November of 2021, Reid won gold on both the pommel horse and parallel bars.

Reid's amateur coaching career has seen him make stops at three of the more prominent academies in the Midwest. His first coaching assignment was with the Bart Conner Gymnastics Academy in Norman, Oklahoma as he was an assistant from 2013 to June of 2016. Reid then took his talents south as he became the head coach of the Southlake Gymnastics Academy in Southlake, Texas. During his time at Southlake, he guided the program to new heights as they surpassed the program record for Junior National qualifiers and had two gymnasts reach the U.S. National Championships. In 2018, Reid helped Morgan Seyler receive an NCAA scholarship to compete at Oklahoma. In June of 2019, Reid took a position at the Texas Dreams Academy and was mentored at the Coppell, Texas gym by Japanese Olympian Nori Iwai. At Texas Dreams, he coached Alan Camillus, who received a scholarship from Oklahoma.

Reid earned a bachelor's degree in Health and Society with a minor in Psychology from the University of Oklahoma in December of 2015.

GYMNASTICS NAVY 2024

SEASON PREVIEW

Coming off another record-breaking year for the program, the Navy gymnastics team will kick off its 2024 campaign with two days of action at the West Point Open on January 12-13. The Mids are coming off a season that saw two of their gymnasts attain All-American status for the first time in 50 years after seven qualified for and advanced to the second day of competition at the 2023 NCAA Championship. Additionally, three Mids received the opportunity to test themselves against the nation's best professional and amateurs at the 2023 U.S. Classic over the summer. These outstanding performances mixed with a strong 13-member upperclass and 11 additional underclassmen should result in another banner year for Kip Simons' program.

The goals once again for the Midshipmen in 2024 are to defeat Army in the annual Army-Navy Star Meet, reign supreme in the All-Academy Championship before defending their titles at the USAG Collegiate and ECAC Championships in the postseason. Securing a spot for their team at the NCAA Championship Qualifying Meet and potentially a berth into the Championship Finals as a team or with as many individual competitors remains the final checkmark. Since taking over the program prior to the 2016 season, Simons has led Navy to the NCAA Championship in seven of his first eight seasons, with the only outlier being 2020 when the COVID-19 pandemic abruptly curtailed the Mids march to the NCAAs. At last year's national meet the team netted 392.491 points to finish fifth in session one and tenth overall. Individually, seven Mids advanced to event finals with Isaiah Drake and Syam Buradagunta garnering NCAA All-American honors for their efforts in the all-around and floor exercise competitions. Drake and Buradagunta's top-eight results gave the program its first All-American since Eric Swanson in 1973.

WHO'S BACK

The make-up of the 2024 roster is fairly evenly dispersed with seven seniors, six juniors, seven sophomores and four freshmen. The senior class will be led by team captain lan Dinmore, who came on in 2023 as a key contributor in the Mids' floor exercise and pommel horse lineups. He'll be joined by six other battle-tested classmates; Syam Buradagunta, Erik Engelke, Caleb Hickey, Ronan McQuillan, Matthew Rosendahl and John Wendeborn, that have raised their hand in competition a combined total of 132 times coming into this season. The Class of 2025 will move into upperclass leadership roles this season now with two years of collegiate experience under their belts. A member of the 2023 U.S. Senior National Development Team, Isaiah Drake will headline a talented group of juniors that consists of William Champagne, Sabastian Gordon, Vishal Mandava, Riley Rose and RJ Spears.

Navy's sophomore class received important reps in competition and in the gym during practices through the 2022-23 academic year. Matthew Petros (VT, PB, HB), Aaron Stein (FX, R) and Danilo Viciana (FX, PH, R) earned regular starts as member of the Mids' six-event lineups. The trio was up for the task early on as all three contributed at least one top-eight result a piece at the 2023 Army-Navy Meet in February, including a second on the parallel bars by Petros. While not seeing collegiate action, Garrett Lawless, Colton McCormack, Colby Prince and Benjamin Venters have been grinding away in the offseason to hone their skill sets and break into the weekend starting lineup.

In total, nine of the 20 returners earned at least one ECAC All-Conference honor for their performance at the year-end conference championship that was held in Annapolis last April; Buradagunta (3x), Dinmore, Drake (4x), Gordon, Hickey, Mandava, McQuillan, Petros and Rose. At the sports' grandest collegiate stage, Buradagunta, Champagne, Dinmore, Drake, Hickey, and Rosendahl all qualified for and competed as individuals on the final night of the NCAA Championships.

WHO'S NEW

Having to replace three 2023 graduates, Kip Simons and his assistant coaches Craig Holt and Mike Reid have brought in four talented freshmen who are looking to make their mark in the collegiate gymnastics world. The quartet of plebes will bring diverse talents to the program as they've all been raised in gyms from across the United States ranging from California on the West Coast and Texas to the south to as close as Columbia, Maryland. Navy's Class of 2028 consists of Julian Galvez (Md.), Daniel Gurevich (Texas), Brian Solomon (Mass.), Ben Thurlow Lam (Calif.).

2024 SEASON AT A GLANCE

Action at the West Point Open will be the first of five straight weeks of early season action. This early run of competition includes three straight home competitions: the 2024 Navy Open on Jan. 20, a home duel with William & Mary on Jan. 27 and the annual Army-Navy Star Meet on Feb. 3 in Halsey Fieldhouse. The following weekend, service academy glory will be up for grabs at the 2024 All-Academy Championship in Frisco, Texas on Feb. 10. After a break for the Winter Cup (Feb. 22-24), the Mids' regular season slate closes with head-tohead meets at Oklahoma on March 9 and William & Mary on March 16.

Following the regular season, Navy will head to the United States Air Force Academy for the 2024 USAG Collegiate Championships on the weekend of March 22-23 before coming to the East Coast for the ECAC Championship on April 6 at Springfield College. This year's NCAA Championship will be hosted by the Penn State University on the weekend of April 19-20.

- Finished 10th at the 2023 NCAA Championship with 392.491 points.
 Competing at its eighth NCAA Championship, Navy outscored Springfield and Army and came just 2.564 points shy of surpassing California in the field.
- Seven Navy gymnasts advanced from the qualifying meet and competed in the NCAA Championship Finals. ... Junior Syam Buradagunta placed eighth on the floor exercise, while sophomore Isaiah Drake finished eighth in the all-around competition. Buradagunta placed eighth on the floor exercise, while Drake finished eighth in the all-around competition. The duo are the first Navy gymnasts to garner NCAA Championship All-America honors since 1973 when Eric Swanson finished on the podium for the pommel horse ... Additionally, Ian Dinmore (Floor Exercise), Matthew Rosendahl (Floor Exercise), Connor Van Loo (Vault), William Champagne (Parallel Bars) and Caleb Hickey (High Bar) also competed in the event finals of the NCAA Championship.
- Dinmore was named the recipient of the 2023 NCAA ELITE 90 Award winner for the Men's Gymnastics Championship. A chemistry major with a 4.00 GPA, he's first in the USNA Class of 2024 and is the second-ever Navy recipient as Micah Oh was honored with the 2020-21 ELITE 90 Award at the men's swimming & diving championship.
- Dinmore was selected CSC First Team Academic All-American in June.
- Won the 2023 USAG Collegiate Championship in come-from-behind fashion as Navy trailed Air Force by 0.95 points at the mid-way point of the competition. The Mids pulled ahead by 0.15 points after the fifth rotation and salted away the victory over the Falcons with a strong turn on the rings, in which all five Navy gymnast finished amongst the top-11. The title is the third in a row for Navy and fifth all-time at the competition that dates back to 1983. The team held off second-place Air Force by 1.3 points with a season-high of 396.80 points.
- Collected 10 medals at day two of the USAG Championship. Van Loo (FX-2nd), Buradagunta (FX-3rd), Drake (PH-2nd), Ronan McQuillan (PH-3rd), Drake (R-3rd), Drake (VT-3rd) and Giovanni Gambatese (HB-3rd) highlighted the team's effort with individual top-three results.
- After the meet, head coach Kip Simons was named the USAG Co-National Coach of the Year. He shared the honor with Springfield's Matthew Davis.
- Finished atop the ECAC Championship standings for the fifth straight year
 with a 7.7-point margin of victory over the field of Springfield, William & Mary,
 Army, Greenville and Simpson in the meet that was held at the Halsey Field
 House Gymnastics Facility. Navy posted a final score of 394.45 points.
- Navy gymnasts garnered five individual titles led by Drake's first-place results in the all-around, floor exercise and parallel bars. The freshman dominated the field in the all-around and won by 3.1 points, 80.35 to 77.25 for Springfield's Dominic Ramalho. McQuillan (PH) and Gambatese (HB) also won gold at the meet. Of note, McQuillan's pommel horse routine earned a career-best 14.45 score.
- Finished the regular season with 11-6 record. Went undefeated versus ECAC league opposition (5-0).

- Went toe-to-toe with Army as every routine was closely scrutinized at the 2023
 Star Meet at West Point. After 60 hard-fought combined routines, a 1.5-point
 swing over the parallel bars rotation pushed Navy into the lead and onto a
 394.05-393.15 victory for its fifth straight Star win in the Army-Navy rivalry.
 Hickey (FX), Drake (R) and Van Loo (VT) all finished first on events versus
 Army.
- Came in second place at the All-Academy Championship with 393.00 points.
 Air Force was victorious with 396.55 points, while Army placed third at 389.15.
 Freshman Matthew Petros (VT) and Drake (HB) both posted event-winning scores versus the field of service academy gymnasts.
- Over the weekend of Feb. 24-26, Drake participated at the 2023 Winter Cup in Louisville, Kentucky. Competing as one of the nation's 33-best individual gymnasts, he posted a trio of top-10 results as he finished fourth on the vault, sixth on the rings and eighth on the parallel bars. That performance earned him a spot for the U.S. Mixed Cup team at the 2023 DTB Pokal Gymnastics Festival.
- Drake, a member of the United States' Senior National Development Team, competed at the DTB Pokal Gymnastics Festival, March 17-19 in Stuttgart, Germany. Suiting up for the co-ed team of American gymnasts in the Mixed Cup event, Drake helped the squad place fourth at the international event.
- In the final NCAA statistical standings (pre-NCAAs), the team was ranked ninth overall with a national qualifying score of 394.575.
- Among the standings for individual gymnasts: McQuillan finished the regular season ranked ninth on the pommel horse (13.775), Van Loo was 12th on the floor exercise (14.050), Buradagunta was 16th on the floor exercise (13.938) and Drake was 17th on the rings (13.663).
- Navy gymnasts claimed nine ECAC weekly honors, four of which were won by Petros (four-Rookie of the Week selections). Additionally, Van Loo was a three-time Specialist of the Week, while Drake (Gymnast) and McQuillan (Specialist) earned accolades one time each.
- 12 Mids were announced as part of the 2023 ECAC All-Academic Team for posting cumulative GPAs of 3.0 or better. The list consists of Van Loo, juniors Buradagunta, Dinmore, Erik Engelke and Rosendahl, sophomores Champagne, Sabastian Gordon, Vishal Mandava and RJ Spears, and freshmen Garrett Lawless, Petros and Benjamin Venters.
- In early August, the trio of Buradagunta, Drake and McQuillan turned in topflight scores at the 2023 Core Hydration Classic (formerly known as the U.S. Classic). Taking on high level opposition in the form of gymnasts from the United States' National Team and National Development Team, as well as top NCAA competitors, all three Midshipmen turned in at least one top-11 score in the action at NOW Arena in Chicago.
- Later in August, Drake finished 19th overall in the all-around competition at the 2023 U.S. Championships in San Jose, California ... Competing against 48 junior, senior, collegiate, professional and Olympic-level gymnasts at the SAP Center as part of a two-part event Drake placed 19th overall with a cumulative all-around score of 156.20.

TEN MIDSHIPMEN EARN 2023 ALL-AMERICA SCHOLAR-ATHLETE ACCOLADES

The College Gymnastics Association announced its 2023 national academic teams as well as its All-America Scholar-Athletes. 10 individual Midshipmen were amongst the 119 national student-athletes recognized as All-American Scholar-Athletes on either the first or second teams.

May graduate Connor Van Loo, rising seniors Syam Buradagunta, Ian Dinmore, Erik Engelke, Caleb Hickey and Matthew Rosendahl, rising juniors William Champagne, Vishal Mandava and Sabastian Gordon and rising sophomore Matthew Petros all received accolades for posting GPAs above 3.2 during the 2022-23 school year.
