THE OPENING KICK

The Ohio football team (6-2, 3-1 MAC) are set to host the Battle of the Bricks against the Miami RedHawks (6-2, 3-1 MAC) this Saturday (Oct. 28). Kickoff is set for 3:30 p.m. ET at Frank Solich Field at Peden Stadium. The game can be seen on CBSSN with Jason Knapp and Malik Zaire on the call.

The Bobcats' matchup can also be heard on the Ohio Sports Network from Learfield. Russ Eisenstein returns for his 16th season as the "Voice of the Bobcats" and will be joined by Rob Cornelius, who has been a part of the broadcasts for two decades.

SERIES HISTORY VS. MIAMI

The Bobcats and the RedHawks have met 98 times since 1908 with a series record of 42-54-2. The two teams last met in Oxford during the 2022 season, where Ohio won 37-21 to mark their second consecutive victory over the RedHawks.

The last time the two teams faced off on a Saturday was on Oct. 1, 2016, at Yager Stadium; holding Miami to one touchdown in the third quarter, Ohio won 17-7. The Bobcats last hosted the RedHawks on a Saturday in 2015,

where they won in dominant fashion, 34-3.

SCOUTING MIAMI

The RedHawks are currently 6-2 overall and 3-1 in MAC play, falling to Toledo last week, 21-17. Saturday's matchup against the Bobcats marks their third road MAC matchup of the season.

On the season, Miami averages 29.75 points on 154.1 rushing yards and 211.75 passing yards per game.

Individually, running back Rashad Amos leads the RedHawks on the ground, scoring four rushing touchdowns on 98 carries and 421 yards. Running backs Kenny Tracy and Keyon Mozee both have two touchdowns on the season. In the air, quarterback Brett Gabbert is 111-for-187 with 14 touchdowns, throwing five interceptions in 1,634 yards. Quarterback Aveon Smith has played in five games so far this season, throwing four completions in 60 yards. Smith is also a threat on the ground, netting 49 rushing yards in eight attempts.

Defensively, linebacker Matt Salopek has a team-best 79 tackles— including 45 solo stops— and is

currently ranked 20th in the country with an average of 9.9 tackles per game. He also has 4.5 tackles for loss, two sacks and one pass break up. Defensive lineman Caiden Woullard leads the team in sacks (6) while defensive back Michael Dowell is the only RedHawk defender with two interceptions.

Kicker Graham Nicholson has perfect record this season, going 25-for-25 in PATs and 14-for-14 in field goals. Punter Alec Bevelhimer has 28 punts on the season, with his longest clocking in at 64 yards.

LAST TIME OUT

Last Saturday (Oct. 21), the Bobcats hosted the Western Michigan Broncos, winning 20-17. This victory marked Ohio's 10th consecutive victory in Athens.

The Bobcats' defense remains a force to be reckoned with, holding Western Michigan to their fewest rushing yards so far this season (79). Individually, linebackers Keye Thompson and Bryce Houston led the way, recording 13 and 12 tackles, respectively.

Wide receiver Sam Wiglusz recorded a personal-best 155 receiving yards, passing her previous record (144), which he set against Akron in 2022. On the day, he had 10 catches and one touchdown. Quarterback Kurtis Rourke went 24-for-39 on 275 yards with one touchdown.

Two field goals by kicker Gianni Spetic gave Ohio a 6-0 lead heading into halftime. After a 43-yard RedHawks field goal cut Ohio's lead to three points, running back Sieh Bangura wrapped up a nine-play, 75 yard drive with the first touchdown of the day, putting the Bobcats ahead 13-3.

The Broncos answered with their own rushing touchdown, trailing Ohio by three points as they started the last 15 minutes of play. A Wiglusz touchdown and a Broncos touchdown on the ensuing drive put the final score at 20-17.

SCOUTING OHIO

Currently, the Bobcats are 6-2 overall and 3-1 in MAC play. They average 22.5 points per game on 143.3 rushing yards and 207 passing yards per game.

In the air, Kurtis Rourke is 122-for-194 on 1,343 yards, throwing nine touchdowns in seven games. Parker Navarro has participated in four games, going 7-for-10 with two passing touchdowns. Both are threats on the ground as well and are currently third and fourth, respectively, on the team in rushing yards. Rourke has two rushing touchdowns while Navarro claims the longest rush this season (52 yards).

Running backs Sieh Bangura and O'Shaan Allison lead the Bobcats on the ground. Bangura has a team-best three rushing touchdowns on 448 yards and 108 carries while Allison is right behind him with 104 carries and one touchdown on 346 yards. Bangura has also tallied one receiving touchdown on 14 receptions.

Wide receiver Sam Wiglusz has recorded three touchdowns on 39 receptions and 440 yards while wide receiver Miles Cross has a team-best four receiving touchdowns on 338 yards.

Defensively, linebacker Bryce Houston leads the team with 82 total tackles and 39 solo stops, putting him second in the MAC and ranked 11th in FBS football. He's also recorded eight tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks, two interceptions and three quarterback hurries.

Linebacker Keye Thompson is right behind Houston with 51 tackles; against Bowling Green, he recorded a 71-yard fumble recovery for a touchdown. Defensive end Vonnie Watkins has a team-best seven quarterback hurries while defensive tackle Rayyan Buell is tied for first in the league in tackles for loss (10).

Kicker Gianni Spetic is 10-for-15 on field goals and 19-for-19 on PATs while kicker Alex Kasee is 1-for-2 on field goals, 2-for-2 on PATs and has accumulated 2,242 yards in 39 kickoffs. Punters Jack Wilson and Jared Wheatley have both made appearances this season, with Wilson's longest of 10 clocking in at 57 yards while Wheatley has 19 punts on the season, averaging 36.79 yards per punt.

WATCH OUT FOR WIGZ

Wide receiver Sam Wiglusz had a record-setting day last Saturday (Oct. 21) against Western Michigan. He recorded a personal-best 155 receiving yards, passing the previous record he set against Akron during the 2022 season (144 yards). He scored his only touchdown of the day with 4:36 left on the clock, extending Ohio's lead to 10 points and allowing the Bobcats' to maintain a tight lead when the Broncos scored the following drive. On the day, Wiglusz finished with a team-leading 10 catches.

Nationally, he recorded the third-highest receiving yards in all of college football, trailing Ohio State's Marvin Harrison Jr. (162) and Washington State's Lincoln Victor (161). Wiglusz was the only Group of 5 athlete to make the top five, finishing ahead of Utah's Sione Vaki and UNC's Devontez Walker.

DOMINANT DEFENSE

With opponent offenses averaging just 13.88 points and 260.6 yards per game, Ohio's defense leads the MAC and is No. 5 in FBS football. Individually, linebacker Bryce Houston is ranked 11th in FBS football in total tackles (82).

The Bobcats' defense was lights out in Boca Raton. As a team, they held the Owls to five rushing yards, averaging only 0.3 yards per attempt. The next week, they held Power 5 opponent Iowa State to just seven points, keeping them scoreless into the fourth quarter. Against Bowling Green, the defense held the Falcons to 206 yards, averaging only 3.8 yards per attempt.

During their Homecoming game, the Bobcats' defense held Kent State to 17 points on 228 yards of total offense. The next time on the Frank, Ohio defense held WMU to their lowest number of rushing yards so far this season (79).

MAC EAST SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Redshirt junior punter Jack Wilson earned Mid-American Conference East Special Teams Player of the Week accolades for his performance on Saturday (Oct. 21).

Wilson recorded three punts for the Bobcats last Saturday against Western Michigan. The redshirt junior recorded 144 total yards, averaging 48 per punt. His longest of the day clocked in at 55 yards.

MAC EAST DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Graduate student linebackers Bryce Houston and Keye Thompson have both earned MAC East Defensive Player of the Week honors this season.

Houston helped the defense hold the LIU Sharks, allowing one touchdown and one field goal in the Bobcats' 27-10 victory (Sept. 2). The graduate student linebacker led the team with 11 tackles, four of which were solo, while recorded a team-best two tackles for loss. Houston snagged one of two interceptions of the day and registered one of the team's three sacks.

Houston continued his strong 2023 season, leading the defense as they held the Iowa State Cyclones to seven points in the Bobcats' 10-7 victory over the Power 5 school at Frank Solich Field at Peden Stadium (Sept. 16). The linebacker finished the game with a team-best 15 tackles, matching his career record that he set against Buffalo in 2021. Of his 15 tackles, Houston recorded five solo stops.

Thompson played an integral part in Ohio's strong defensive performance against Bowling Green (Sept. 23), holding the Falcons to just seven points. The graduate student finished the game with four tackles, half of which were solo stops, but more notably snagged one interception and one fumble recovery. After recovering the ball, Thompson ran 71 yards to score his first career touchdown and give the Bobcats a 21-point lead before the end of the first quarter.

MAC EAST OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Reigning MAC Freshman of the Year Sieh Bangura has already been named MAC East Offensive Player of the Week once junior wide receiver Miles Cross earned the title for the first time this season.

Ohio's first home game of the 2023 season marked their first win and Bangura's first game of the year passing 100 rushing yards. The redshirt sophomore running back net 107 yards on 19 carries, leading the Bobcats on the ground. His longest rush was 20



yards and he averaged 5.6 yards per attempt.

Cross blazed the trail during the Bobcats' Homecoming game against Kent State (Oct. 7), scoring two of their six touchdowns in the 42-17 victory. He led the receivers with a season-best 125 yards on seven receptions and was one of two Bobcats to score two touchdowns.

TIGHT END TDs

Redshirt sophomore tight end Will Kacmarek recorded his first collegiate touchdown last Saturday (Sept. 9), wrapping up an 11-play, 75-yard drive with a picture-perfect catch to cut FAU's lead to three points.

Kacmarek isn't the only Bobcat recording career-firsts. Redshirt sophomore tight end Bryce Butler and freshman tight end Mason Williams both scored for the first time as Bobcats during Ohio's 27-10 victory over LIU (Sept. 2).

O'SHAAN IN THE END ZONE

Running back O'Shaan Allison is back on the field after an injury early in 2022 Fall Camp sidelined him for the entire season.

Allison scored his first touchdown since 2019 against FAU (Sept. 9), giving the Bobcats their first lead of the game with a five-yard rushing touchdown in the third quarter.

ROURKE'S RETURN

After a season-ending injury in the Bobcats' 11th game of the 2022 season, Kurtis Rourke is set to return as Ohio's first-string quarterback.

In the air, Rourke went 244-for-353, throwing 25 touchdowns in 3,256 yards over 11 games. He made program history against Fordham (Sept. 24), going for 527 yards in the air, breaking a record that was set in 1983. He is also second in program history in passing yards in a season as well as passing touchdowns in a season.

Rourke's performance earned him numerous accolades, highlighted by being named the MAC Offensive Player of the Year, earning the Vern Smith Leadership Award and getting named the 2022 Comish Trophy runner-up as well as earning First Team All-MAC honors. He was named one of the Manning Award "Stars of the Week" twice, was a Davey O'Brien Award semifinalist and was also named to the 2022 Phil Steele First Team Offense in addition to earning MAC Offensive Player of the Week three times. Off the field, he was named Academic All-MAC, 2022 Academic All-America® Second Team and earned MAC Scholar Athlete of the Week honors once.

So far this pre-season, Rourke has made

four watch lists: Allstate Sugar Bowl Manning Award, Davey O'Brien, Maxwell Award and Walter Camp Player of the Year.

DEPTH IN THE RUNNING BACK ROOM

Rourke isn't the only Bobcat set to make an appearance in 2023. After getting hurt early in 2022 Fall Camp, running back O'Shaan Allison missed the entire 2022 season.

Allison hit the ground running in 2023 Fall Camp and has returned to the Bobcats' depth chart, now behind 2022 MAC Freshman of the Year Sieh Bangura.

NO. 1 CFL DRAFT PROSPECT

Graduate student quarterback Kurtis Rourke headlines the Fall Edition of the Canadian Football League (CFL) Scouting Bureau. The native of Oakville, Ont., sits in the No. 1 spot among prospects eligible for the 2024 CFL Draft.

The CFL Scouting Bureau, comprising CFL scouts, as well as player personnel directors and general managers from the league's nine clubs, annually releases its rankings in the fall, winter and, for a third and final time, in the spring ahead of the coming draft.

HOUSTON NOMINATED FOR WILLIAM V. CAMPBELL TROPHY

The National Football Foundation (NFF) and College Football Hall of Fame announced 2023 William V. Campbell nominees (Sept. 5). Representing Ohio is graduate student linebacker Bryce Houston.

The William V. Campbell Trophy is college football's premier scholar-athlete award that annually recognizes an individual as the absolute best in the nation for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership. Nominees must be either a senior in his final year of playing eligibility or a graduated player enrolled in school at least three years, have a minimum 3.2 undergraduate GPA, be a starter or a significant contributor on the football field and show exemplary leadership on the field, in the classroom and within the community.

HOUSTON RECEIVES BOB JAMES MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

Ohio's Bryce Houston was one of two recipients of the 2023 Bob James Memorial Scholarship Award by the Mid-American Conference Faculty Athletics Representatives as announced by the league office today (Aug. 25).

Houston is the first Ohio football student-athlete to receive this award as well as the first Bobcat to be recognized with the Bob James award since 1994.

In its 35th year, the Bob James Memorial

Scholarship Award recognizes one female and one male student who have achieved a minimum grade point average of 3.50 and have displayed good character, leadership and citizenship. The students are nominated during the year in which they complete their final season of eligibility. The \$5,000 post-graduate scholarship is awarded in honor of Bob James, the second commissioner in Mid-American Conference history (1964-71).

AYE AYE, CAPTAIN

The Ohio football team named five graduate student captains for the 2023 season — wide receiver Sam Wiglusz, linebacker Keye Thompson, quarterback Kurtis Rourke, linebacker Bryce Houston and defensive tackle Rodney Mathews.

Houston and Rourke are both entering their third season as captains, while Wiglusz, Thompson and Mathews are entering their first. In addition to the five captains, coaches will vote an additional captain every game based on "brickworthy" leadership. "Brickworthy" leaders are those who exhibit the program's core values.

CONTINUITY ON THE COACHING STAFF

With head coach Tim Albin at helm, all 11 coaches returned for the 2023 season.

Additionally, three were promoted. John Hauser is now the Defensive Passing Game Coordinator and Safeties Coach, Brian Metz is the Recruiting Coordinator and Tight Ends Coach and Brian Smith is now the Associate Head Coach, Passing Game Coordinator and Running Backs Coach.

UNDEFEATED ON THE FRANK

The Ohio University Board of Trustees agreed to name the football field in Peden Stadium to honor long-time Ohio head coach Frank Solich, as announced by the program on Aug. 18, 2022.

The Bobcats opened the 2022 season against FAU on Frank Solich Field, snagging their first victory of the season and on the newly-named field. Ohio continued this streak, taking a 6-0 record when in Athens, Ohio and closing the regular season with a 38-14 victory over Bowling Green to clinch the MAC East title. This winning streak has continued into the 2023 season, with the Bobcats defeating LIU, Iowa State, Kent State and Western Michigan at home.

Solich owns a career coaching record of 173-101. His 173 overall wins rank as the fourth most among active NCAA FBS head coaches. He is the winningest head coach in Mid-American Conference history with 115 overall victories while his 77 conference-only wins rank second to former Central Michigan head coach Herb Deromedi's 90. His 16

years of service match Deromedi's (1978-93) for the most in MAC history. Ohio is 115-82 during the Solich era. His 115 victories are the second-most in program history behind Don Peden (121; 1924-46). Ohio has gone 77-46 in conference play since Solich's arrival in Athens in 2005.

Ohio has had a run of 12-straight non-losing seasons that has included 11 winning campaigns and six years with at least nine victories -- including a 10-win campaign in 2011. The 2012 season began with the Bobcats earning a signature win at Penn State, upsetting the Nittany Lions by a score of 24-14. Ohio captured division titles in 2006, 2009, 2011 and 2016. Solich led the Bobcats to 11 of their 13 bowl appearances and the first five bowl victories in program history, with back-to-back wins in the 2011 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl and '12 Independence Bowl and back-to-back-to-back victories in the 2017 Bahamas Bowl, '18 DXL Frisco Bowl and '20 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl (2019 season).

YEAR THREE FOR ALBIN

Tim Albin enters his third season as head coach in 2023 after serving as Ohio's offensive coordinator for 16 years under Frank Solich.

The 2022 football team finished the season as MAC East (7-1) and Arizona Bowl Champions with a 10-4 record, marking its first 10-win season since 2011 and the second-best turnaround in FBS football last year. The Bobcats were also undefeated at home, posting a 6-0 record on Frank Solich Field at Peden Stadium, and wrapped up the regular season with a seven-game winning streak.

This performance earned Albin MAC Coach of the Year honors, quarterback Kurtis Rourke MAC Offensive Player of the Year honors as well as the Vern Smith Leadership Award and running back Sieh Bangura MAC Freshman of the Year accolades.

Albin joined the Ohio Football coaching staff as offensive coordinator in 2005, reuniting with Frank Solich after four seasons together at Nebraska. The 2021 season will mark Albin's 17th year in Athens. Since his arrival in Athens, Albin has produced offensive units that have consistently ranked among the top of the Mid-American Conference. He also has directed an offensive attack that has practically rewritten all of Ohio's rushing, passing records, and scoring records. In the past 10 seasons, Albin's offensive units rank No. 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, 7, and 8 on the Ohio all-time Top-10 single season scoring list. The Bobcats 368 points in 2018 rank fourth on the all-time list.

Albin spent the 2004 season as offensive coordinator and running backs coach at North Dakota State, helping the Bison to an 8-3 record and No. 25 national ranking in their first season at the Division I-AA level. NDSU finished the season averaging 378.5 yards of total offense,

including 192.4 on the ground, and had four offensive players named first-team All-Great West Football Conference. Albin served with Solich at Nebraska from 2000 to 2003. He started with the Cornhusker program as a graduate assistant, a position he held for three seasons before being promoted to running backs coach and passing game coordinator for the 2003 season. Prior to his stint at Nebraska, Albin was the head coach at Northwestern Oklahoma State for three seasons, winning the NAIA national championship in 1999 with a 13-0 record. He was named NAIA Football Coach of the Year by Rawlings and American Football Coach Magazine as the Rangers recorded their first undefeated season in history.

BOBCATS IN THE CFL

Three former Bobcats are currently active in the CFL. Defensive tackle **Casey Sayles** is with the Hamilton Tiger-Cats while running back **De'Montre Tuggle** plays for the Ottawa RedBlacks.

Running back **AJ Ouellette** plays for the Toronto Argonauts, who are the 109th Grey Cup Champions. Sayles, who was a member of the Winnipeg Blue Bombers at the time, competed in the same Grey Cup.

While with the BC Lions, **Nathan Rourke** was named Most Outstanding Canadian (Nov. 17, 2022). He is the first BC Lions' quarterback and the third quarterback in CFL history to earn the honor.

Ohio football alumnus **Chip Cox** is apart of the 2022 CFL Hall of Fame class, earning the honor in his first year of eligibility. Cox played 13 seasons for the Montreal Alouettes, wrapping up his career with the fourth highest total defensive tackles in CFL history (979).

BOBCATS IN THE NFL

Multiple former Ohio football student-athletes are representing the Bobcats at the highest level of the sport.

QB **Nathan Rourke** signed to the Jacksonville Jaguars' practice squad after playing in multiple preseason games. On Oct. 18, Rourke was promoted to the Jaguar's active roster.

After signing as an undrafted free agent in April 2022, former Ohio quarterback **Armani Rogers** made the Washington Commanders' 53-man roster as a tight end (Aug. 30, 2022).

OL **Austen Pleasants** was signed to the Los Angeles Chargers' practice squad on Nov. 9, 2022. He signed a reserve/futures contract in Jan. 2023. As of Aug. 30, he is on their practice squad.

Tim Albin was named the head football coach at Ohio on July 14, 2021.

The 2022 football team finished the season as MAC East (7-1) and Arizona Bowl Champions with a 10-4 record, marking its first 10-win season since 2011 and the second-best turnaround in FBS football last year. The Bobcats were also undefeated at home, posting a 6-0 record on Frank Solich Field at Peden Stadium, and wrapped up the regular season with a seven-game winning streak.

This performance earned Albin MAC Coach of the Year honors, quarterback Kurtis Rourke MAC Offensive Player of the Year honors as well as the Vern Smith Leadership Award and running back Sieh Bangura MAC Freshman of the Year accolades.

Since his arrival in Athens, Albin has produced offensive units that have consistently ranked among the top of the Mid-American Conference. He also has directed an offensive attack that has practically rewritten all of Ohio's rushing, passing records, and scoring records. In the past 10 seasons, Albin's offensive units rank No. 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, 7, and 8 on the Ohio all-time Top 10 single season scoring list. The Bobcats 368 points in 2016 rank fourth on the all-time list.

In 2016, the Bobcats had the most pass attempts (458) and second-most completions (250) in school history. The offense totaled 5,492 yards of total offense which is third all-time at Ohio. The Bobcats also compiled the second-most pass yards in school history (3,142) and the fourth most touchdown passes (22).

In 2015, the offense totaled 5,378 yards, which ranks third all-time in program history. The Bobcat quarterbacks passed for 3,026 yards, which ranks third all-time in program history as well.

In 2014, the offense totaled 4,443 yards of offense which ranked fifth all-time in program history. The combination of Derrius Vick and JD Sprague proved to be dynamic through the air as the quarterbacks combined to pass for 2,474 yards for the season which is sixth all-time in program history.

The Bobcat offense found a balanced attack with AJ Ouellette in the backfield. The freshman ran for 785 yards ranking him only behind Kareem Wilson for most yards on the ground for a freshman.

In 2013, under Albin's watchful eye, Ohio's offensive attack averaged 379.4 yards per game and surpassed 400 yards of total offense in seven games during the 2013 campaign. The Bobcats

closed the year with 4,932 yards of total offense. The 2013 campaign also marked the final season of Ohio's most prolific offensive trio in school history as quarterback Tyler Tettleton, running back Beau Blankenship and wide Donte' Foster all concluded their respective collegiate careers.

Albin recruited all three players and all three players flourished in his offensive scheme. At the end of their respective careers, Tettleton, Blankenship and Foster accounted for over 25,000 yards of total offense and 128 touchdowns.

Tettleton finished his career at Ohio with 27 school records and once again passed for over 2,500 yards through the air. He is the only quarterback in school history to pass for over 2,500 yards in three-consecutive seasons.

Blankenship closed his senior campaign with 910 yards rushing and five touchdowns. He finished his career fifth on the all-time rushing list with 2,976 yards.

Foster concluded his senior campaign with his best single-season of his career as he finished with 1,018 yards receiving and seven touchdowns. The Guthrie, Okla., native became just the second wide receiver in school history to surpass 1,000 yards receiving. He also finished his career with the most all-time touchdown receptions (21). Following the year, Foster was selected to the All-MAC Second Team.

In 2012, Albin's offensive unit that accounted for 5,782 yards. In fact, Ohio was one of just four teams in the Mid-American Conference to post 5,500-yards or more of total offense in 2012 (Northern Illinois, Ball State and Toledo). Ohio had seven games in which it surpassed 450 yards of total offense.

Albin's offensive unit played a major role in Ohio's 45-14 victory in the Advocare V100 Independence Bowl. In the win, the Bobcats' 556 yards of total offense served as an Independence Bowl record, while their 45 points tied the Bowl record. Following the game, Blankenship and Tettleton were named Co-Offensive Most Valuable Players of the Independence Bowl.

Ohio's 2012 offensive unit averaged over 30 points per game for the second straight season and the third time in the last six years. In addition, the Bobcats scored 40-or-more points in four different games.

The 2012 campaign also saw Blankenship rush for a single-season school record 1,604 yards and 15 touchdowns. He became the eighth running back in school history to rush for over 1,000 yards in a single season. Following the year, Blankenship was named All-MAC Second Team. Offensive lineman Skyler Allen and Eric Herman joined Blankenship on the All-MAC Second Team. Since taking over as offensive coordinator in 2005, Albin has coached 26 All-MAC players and All-Americans LaVon Brazill (2009) and Joe Flading (2011).

Tettleton once again posted a memorable season under Albin's direction as he passed for 2,844 yards and 18 touchdowns, while throwing just four interceptions in 12 games.

In April of 2013, Herman became the third offensive player to be selected in the NFL Draft over the last four years as he was drafted by the New York Giants in the seventh round.

In 2011, Albin's offensive scheme led to the most prolific year in school history. Ohio set eight team single-season offensive records, posting school standards for most yards gained (6,241), most passing yards gained (3,482), most offensive plays (1,026), average yards per game (445.8), passing attempts (429), most points scored (427), most passing completions (276) and most passing yards per game (248.7).

Under Albin's watchful eye, Tettleton re-wrote the Bobcats' single season record book in his first-year as a starting quarterback as he set 12 school standards, while becoming the first signal caller in program history to throw for over 3,000 yards. In addition, Tettleton accounted for 38 total touchdowns (28 passing and 10 rushing) and nearly 4,000 yards of total offense (3,960) en route to being named All-MAC Third Team.

The 2011 Ohio offensive unit also produced record-breaking performances from Brazill and Donte' Harden as the two combined to set eight single-season records. Brazill would go on to finish his career as the program's all-time leader for receiving yards (2,511) and receptions (189).

At the end of the year, a league-best six Bobcats were named to the MAC's All-League team on the offensive side of the ball.

In April of 2012, Brazill was selected in the sixth round of the NFL Draft by the Indianapolis Colts.

In 2010, Boo Jackson finished his career as Ohio's career leader in completion percentage (.604), pass efficiency (136.3), total offense per play (6.18), passing yards per attempt (7.7) and touchdown passes (38). He also finished the season responsible for 26 touchdowns, 48 in his career, which is fourth all-time, and with 18 passing touchdowns in 2010 (fourth all-time on the single-season list).

Ohio also had the best red zone efficiency among all MAC teams in 2010, converting 88.4 percent of its tries inside the 20-yard line. The Bobcats converted 38 times on 43 occasions, scoring 38 touchdowns and five field goals. Ohio was also outstanding at running the football, finishing second in the conference with 1,416 yards on the ground (177.0 per game average) for the 2010 season and 19 touchdowns.

In 2009, Albin's offense took aim at more of Ohio's all-time marks. Quarterback Theo Scott threw 20 touchdown passes, which stood as a school record until the 2011 season, while receiver Terrence McCrae tied Andrew Mooney's then single-season touchdown reception mark of nine.

The 2009 team also finished with passing yards (2,774), completions (228) and total offense (4,342) all of which rank among the program's top five all-time marks.

Albin mentored running back Calvin McRae who earned first-team All-MAC honors in 2005, 2006 and 2007. McRae is the first Bobcat in history to crack the 1,000-yard mark in three straight sea-

sons. Under Albin's tutelage, McRae rushed for 4,398 yards and 45 touchdowns. McRae owns the second, fourth and sixth-highest single-season rushing totals in school history after setting the single-season rushing, touchdown and points scored records.

Albin spent the 2004 season as offensive coordinator and running backs coach at North Dakota State, helping the Bison to an 8-3 record and No. 25 national ranking in their first season at the Division I-AA level. NDSU finished the season averaging 378.5 yards of total offense, including 192.4 on the ground, and had four offensive players named first-team All-Great West Football Conference.

Albin served with Solich at Nebraska from 2000 to 2003. He started with the Cornhusker program as a graduate assistant, a position he held for three seasons before being promoted to running backs coach and passing game coordinator for the 2003 season. Working with the Nebraska tight ends as a graduate assistant, Albin helped Tracey Wistrom earn third-team All-America status in back-to-back seasons.

Prior to his stint at Nebraska, Albin was the head coach at Northwestern Oklahoma State for three seasons, winning the NAIA national championship in 1999 with a 13-0 record. He was named NAIA Football Coach of the Year by Rawlings and American Football Coach Magazine as the Rangers recorded their first undefeated season in history. Six of his players earned NAIA All-America honors. Albin's three squads improved every season going from 5-5 in 1997 to 7-3 in 1998.

Returning to his alma mater in 1994, Albin served as Northwestern Oklahoma State's offensive coordinator and head men's and women's cross country and track and field coach prior to his promotion to head coach of the football program.

He earned Oklahoma Intercollegiate Conference Coach of the Year honors twice for his work with the men's track program, leading them to back-to-back league titles. Albin got his start in coaching at Northeastern State (Okla.) in 1989 where he won two conference titles as an assistant football coach and two more as head of the men's track program.

As a player, Albin was a first-team All-Oklahoma Intercollegiate Conference selection as a wide receiver in each of his final three seasons as a member of the Northwestern Oklahoma State squad. He added to those honors by becoming the first Rangers' player to earn All-District IX status three times.

Albin received His bachelor's of science in business administration from Northwestern Oklahoma State in 1989 and a master's of science from Northeastern State in 1991. A native of Woodward, Okla., Albin was born on Sept. 13, 1965. He and his wife, Brooke, have two children - daughter Tori, and son Treyce.
