42—WARFIELD, Paul, 18, 6-0, 182, sophomore . . . from Warren . . . an All-Ohio and All-America performer in high school . . . blessed with outstanding speed and a rare sense of balance . . . Ohio State's best break-away threat in recent years . . . without practice ran an indoor 60 yard dash in 6.3 seconds . . . was tried briefly at quarterback early in spring drills, but was moved back to left halfback to take advantage of his running ability . . . is an excellent defensive player and will likely be used some both ways . . . high school coach was Gene Slaughter, Buckeye backfield coach last year . . . scored 30 touchdowns in high school, many on long runs . . . gave an exhibition of his broken field running in the spring game, when he caught a screen pass and raced 80 yards to score . . . hobby is reading sports magazines . . .

41—SNELL, Matthew, 20, 6-2, 208, sophomore . . . from Locust Valley, New York . . . was an All-Metropolitan, All-New York and All-America halfback in high school, scoring 17, 14 and 16 touchdowns per year . . . is a rare blend of speed and power . . . is another ideal two-way player, but will battle Bob Klein for the starting right halfback berth on offense . . . can be used as a corner linebacker on defense . . . is taking pre-dentistry . . . hobbies are dancing and attending movies . . . admires Jimmy Brown, Cleveland professional great . . . captained his high school football and track team . . . does construction work during the summer . . . ambition is to become a dentist . . .
