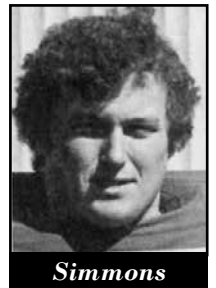

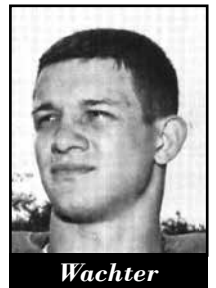

CARNIE SMITH STADIUM

Pittsburg State University plays its home football games at Brandenburg Field/Carnie Smith Stadium, widely recognized as one of the finest venues in NCAA Division II.

Affectionately referred to as both "The Pitt" and "The Jungle" by Gorilla players and fans, Brandenburg Field/Carnie Smith Stadium provides one of the strongest home field advantages in college football.

Entering the 2023 campaign, Pittsburg State has won 165 of its last 197 regular season home games, posting a 165-31-1 record (.840) over the last 38 seasons.

The Gorillas have won 72 percent of their home games during the 99-year history of the facility, with a 366-137-12 all-time home record since the facility opened in 1924.

PSU's home field advantage strengthened in 2001 with the completion of a \$5.7 million expansion project to Carnie Smith Stadium. With the improvements, all made possible by private funding, an additional 2,300 seats were added to Carnie Smith Stadium, including new club seating on both the East and West stands. The stadium capacity grew from 5,611 permanent seats to 7,950.

Additionally, 16 luxury sky boxes were added to the East side of the stadium. New restroom, concession stand and ticket booth facilities were created, an elevator, handicap accessibility and other ADA improvements were made.

Both the home and visitor locker room facilities underwent major improvements, and a new media room was added to the East side for PSU players and media personnel to utilize.

An additional eight luxury sky boxes and elevator service were added to the West side in the summer of 2006. The \$2.5 million project was made possible by private funding.

In 2008, PSU unveiled its new "Jungletron" video scoreboard — the largest replay board in Division II at the time — in the south end zone of the stadium. This \$1.7 million project was made possible entirely by private funding. In August 2019 a new "Jungletron" video scoreboard replaced the initial model. Once again, the upgrade was made possible entirely by private funding.



Brandenburg

The facility was originally named Brandenburg Stadium, in honor of William Aaron Brandenburg, the first president of the University. It was built in 1923 with volunteer labor and money donated by students, alumni, faculty and citizens of Pittsburg.

In 1987, the University announced that the field would continue to bear the name of PSU's first president, but the stadium would be called Carnie Smith Stadium, in honor of the legendary PSU football coach who led the Gorillas to two NAIA national championships (1957 and 1961) and six conferences titles during his tenure from 1949-66.

Construction of the facility began with volunteer labor during the summer of 1923, after a successful fund drive raised the necessary \$100,000 to build the stadium. To ensure its completion by the start of the 1924 season, PSU faculty members were required to help work up to eight hours per week.

On October 11, 1924, the first varsity football game was played at the new facility between PSU (known as Kansas State Teachers College) and Baker University, in front of approximately 4,000 fans. The team didn't disappoint all of those who worked so hard to build the new facility, earning a 6-0 victory. KSTC went on to post a 7-0-1 record that year earning the Kansas Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (KIAC) title under head coach Garfield W. Weede.

During the last 22 seasons, Pittsburg State University has averaged 8,359 fans per home game (1,262,300 fans in 151 games). In 2022, PSU averaged 8,162 fans in seven home games, ranking fourth nationally in attendance — PSU's ninth straight season in the top 10.

ROBERT W. PLASTER CENTER



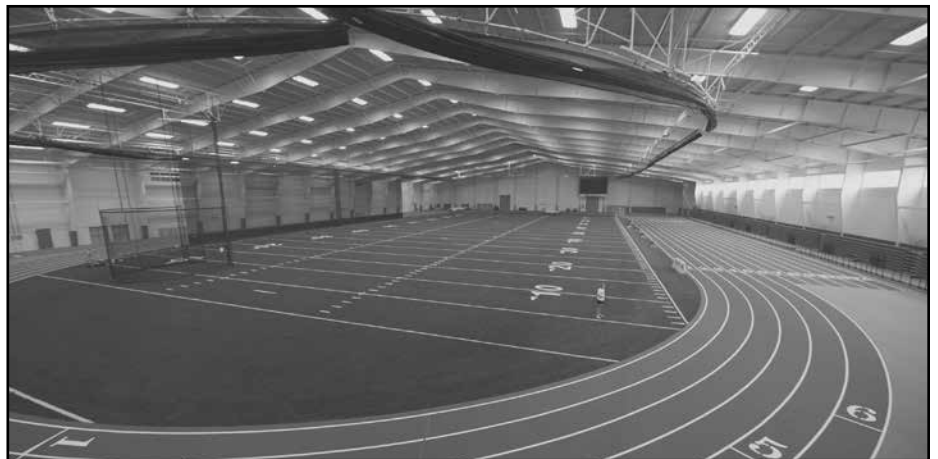
The Robert W. Plaster Center at Pittsburg State University is a state-of-the-art facility that hosts a variety of university and community events.

The \$13 million, 154,000-square-foot facility, completed in Spring 2015, includes a 100-yard turf football field, an 11,000-square-foot modern strength facility, a 300-meter track and seating for up to 1,500. It also includes locker rooms for men's and women's track & field and football, offices and meeting rooms.

The Plaster Center was funded through a unique partnership of private donors, student fees and a \$5 million investment from the City of Pittsburg.

University, city and state officials broke ground on the Plaster Center during a special ceremony on Tuesday, Feb. 25, 2014, and PSU celebrated the Plaster Center's ribbon cutting ceremony on Tuesday, Apr. 21, 2015.

PROMAXIMA STRENGTH & CONDITIONING CENTER

One of the major components to the Plaster Center is the ProMaxima Strength and Conditioning Center.

At 11,000 square feet, the new center more than tripled the size of athlete's previous weight room; and through the generosity of ProMaxima's donation it has been filled with brand-new equipment – an amazing 10 tons of equipment overall – emblazoned with either the split-face Gorilla logo or the "Pitt" symbol.

FOOTBALL LOCKER ROOM

The spacious new inner sanctuary of Gorilla football – the team locker room – features 120 custom lockers, shower facilities, a player lounge complete with flat screen televisions and a kitchen area, as well as a fully-equipped computer center.

The lockers were designed and manufactured by Hollman, the nation's premiere locker manufacturer. Other clients of Hollman include the Dallas Cowboys, Chicago Bulls, University of Arkansas, Oklahoma State University and the Naval Academy. Each locker includes a keyless entry pad, exotic wood veneers and USB and power outlets.

PITT STATE: 2022 SHRINE BOWL HOST

Brandenburg Field/Carnie Smith Stadium served as the site of the 2022 Kansas Shrine Bowl, Kansas' East-West High School All-Star Football Game on July 23.

The 2022 game marked the sixth time that the Kansas Shrine Bowl all-star classic was played in Pittsburg and hosted by Pittsburg State University.

Pittsburg State also hosted the 2002, 2006, 2012, 2014 & 2018 Kansas Shrine Bowl.

Since the Kansas Shrine Bowl's inception in 1974, a total of 175 high school seniors who signed letters of intent to play football at Pittsburg State University have competed in the event.

The Shrine Bowl of Kansas is an incorporated 501(c) 3 fundraising organization. All profits from operations are sent to Shriners Hospitals for Children. The principle fundraising event of the Shrine Bowl of Kansas is the Kansas Shrine Bowl Game.

To date, the Kansas Shrine Bowl has sent more than \$3.5 million to Shriners Hospitals.

PSU HAS SERVED AS HOST FOR EIGHT KANSAS H.S. STATE TITLE GAMES

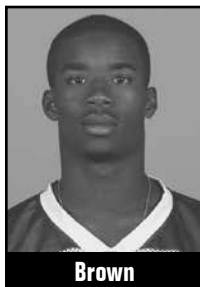
Brandenburg Field/Carnie Smith Stadium also has served as the host site for nine Kansas High School State Championship football games.

The Kansas State High School Activities Association awarded PSU the host site for the 2001, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2021 Kansas Class 5A high school football state championship games as well as the 2002 and 2004 Kansas Class 4A high school football state championship games.

PSU continues to actively pursue hosting additional Kansas High School State Championship events.

GORILLAS IN THE PROS

Pittsburg State University has been well-represented in the professional football ranks throughout the history of the program. Two former Gorillas are on active professional rosters. De'Vante Bausby, a practice squad member of the 2017 Super Bowl champion Philadelphia Eagles, played two seasons for the Denver Broncos (2019-20) and signed with the Washington Commanders in July 2022. Dallis Flowers signed as a free agent for the Indianapolis Colts for the 2022 season. Additionally, John Brown was selected in the third round (91st pick) of the 2014 NFL Draft by the Arizona Cardinals. He has played in the league for eight years and enters the 2022 season as a free agent.

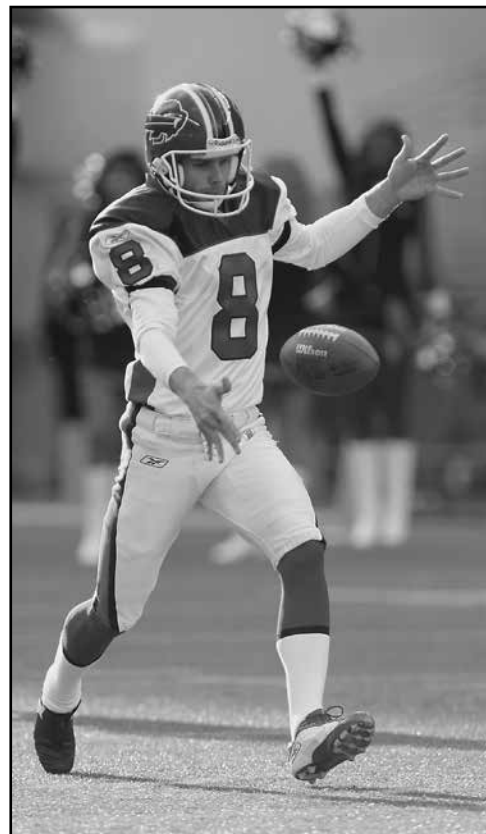

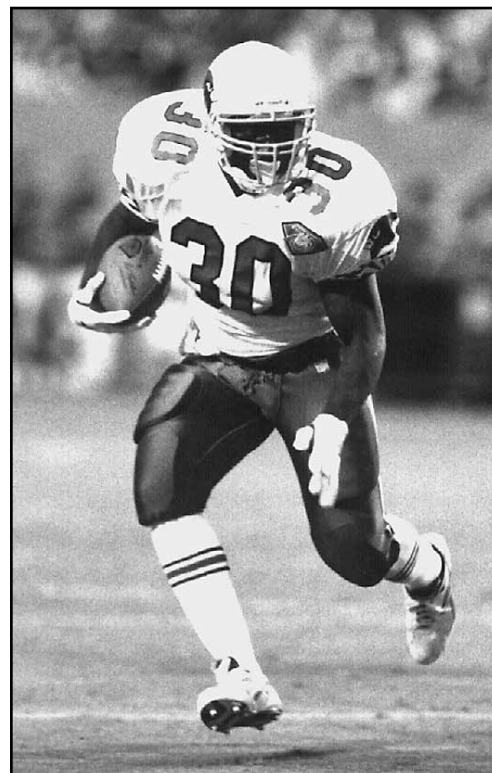

HARLON HILL TROPHY

MOORE, WEST HAVE EARNED DIVISION II NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR HONORS

Two former Pittsburg State University football players have been presented the Harlon Hill Award, which is given annually to the NCAA Division II Player of the Year.

Running back Ronald Moore won Division II's highest honor in 1992, after Pittsburg State wide receiver Ronnie West received the award in 1991. It marked the first time in the award's seven-year history that two players from the same school earned the coveted trophy in successive years.

As a senior, Moore rushed for 2,585 yards and scored 41 TDs, leading the Gorillas to a 14-1 overall record and the program's second straight national championship game appearance. Moore had the finest post-season series in history, setting at least 10 Division II playoff records. He rushed for 379 yards on 37 carries in the semifinal game at Portland (Ore.) State, scoring five touchdowns for the second straight week.

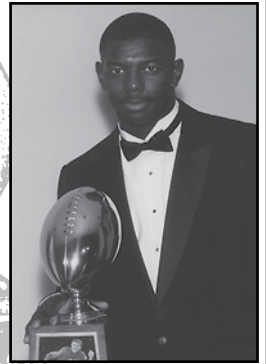
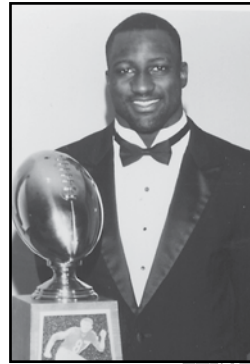
West was the recipient of the prestigious award in 1991. He led PSU to the program's first NCAA National Championship and a 13-1-1 record as a senior, setting numerous receiving records.

The Harlon Hill Award is named in honor of legendary Chicago Bears wide receiver Harlon Hill, who played collegiately at the University of North Alabama.

The award is selected each year by NCAA Division II Sports Information Directors.

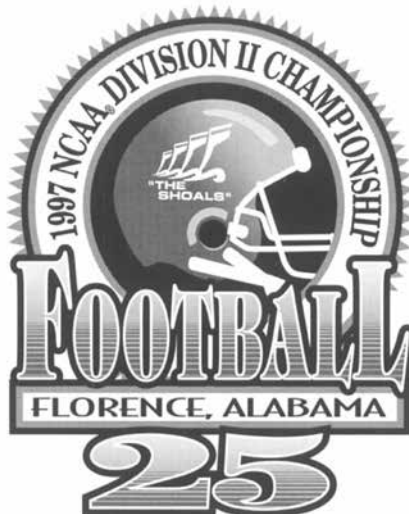

This big, fast, aggressive end was such a football player that at one time serious thought was given to erecting a statue to his memory... he was the first player considered (for) picking a 50th Anniversary team...

100TH ANNIVERSARY TEAM

The 100th Anniversary squad was selected in the Fall of 2003 by a vote of all living PSU football lettermen, in conjunction with Pittsburg State University's Centennial celebration. A total of 129 former PSU greats were eligible for consideration on the ballot. Any one of three criteria had to be met to be eligible for the ballot: 1. earn NAIA or NCAA Division II All-America honors, 2. earn induction into the PSU Athletics Hall of Fame (as an individual player), 3. be a member of the 50th Anniversary Football Team which was selected in 1953.

Pittsburg State University is pleased to announce its 2022 induction class into the Intercollegiate Athletics Hall of Fame.

PSU's Class of 2022 is headlined by a cast of decorated athletes and coaches: **Caleb Farabi** (2005-08), a two-time NCAA Division II All-American running back in football; **Chris Grantham** (1981-84), an All-America offensive lineman in football; **Steve High**, the Gorillas women's basketball coach from 1990 to 2007

and the winningest coach in program history; **Kiara Jones** (2008-12), an eight-time All-America performer in the horizontal jumps for the Gorillas in track & field; **Tommy Myers** (1996-98), an NCAA-II All-Region and record setting outfielder in baseball; and **Sammie Williams** (2005-08), the first two-time All-America performer in the history of the Pitt State volleyball program.

Ed Nealy (1956-57), a first-team All-CIC men's basketball performer who helped lead Pitt State to a 27-2 record and a third-place finish at the 1956 NAIA National Tournament, and **Dennis Watson** (1963-66), an All-America offensive lineman in football for the Gorillas, will be inducted in the Hall of Fame's "Legacy" category.

The Legacy category, created in 2005, focuses solely on individuals who completed their athletic eligibility 50 years from the current calendar year in an attempt to bolster the school's rich heritage from earlier years.

FOOTBALL HONOREES

1957 FOOTBALL TEAM, NAIA NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

The 1957 Gorilla football team captured the University's first NAIA National Championship on December 21, 1957. Pittsburg State, then known as Kansas State Teachers College, defeated Hillsdale College of Michigan, 27-26, in the Holiday Bowl at St. Petersburg, Fla., to complete a perfect 11-0-0 season under Head Coach Carnie Smith. The Gorillas built a 20-0 first quarter lead and then held on in the second half to snap the Dales' 34-game winning streak and bring home the national title.

1961 FOOTBALL TEAM, NAIA NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

The 1961 Gorilla football team captured the University's second NAIA National Championship in five years on December 9, 1961. Pittsburg State, then known as Kansas State College, defeated Linfield College of Oregon, 12-7, in the Camelia Bowl at Sacramento, Calif., to complete a perfect 11-0-0 season under Head Coach Carnie Smith. The Gorillas scored on their first offensive play, took a 12-0 lead early in the fourth quarter and then held off the Wildcats down the stretch to win the coveted national title.

1981 FOOTBALL TEAM, NAIA NATIONAL RUNNER-UP

The 1981 Gorilla football team finished as the NAIA National Runner-up as the squad made the program's third all-time appearance in the NAIA National Championship Game. The Gorillas dropped a hard-fought, 3-0, decision to Elon College on Dec. 19 at Burlington, N.C., in the title game to finish the season with a 10-2 record under head coach Ron Randleman. The Gorillas captured the CSIC title in 1981.

1991 FOOTBALL TEAM, NCAA DIVISION II NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

The 1991 Gorilla football team captured Pittsburg State University's first NCAA Division II National Championship on December 14, 1991. Pittsburg State defeated Jacksonville State University, 23-6, in the NCAA-II National Championship game at Florence, Ala., to complete a 13-1-1 season under Head Coach Chuck Broyles. The Gorillas built a 13-6 halftime advantage, pulling ahead in the final seconds of the second quarter then pulling away with 10 more unanswered points in the second half. PSU won its final 11 games of the 1991 season, after a 2-1-1 start, to bring home the nat'l title.

1992 FOOTBALL TEAM, NCAA DIVISION II NATIONAL RUNNER-UP

The 1992 Gorilla football team finished as the NCAA Division II National Runner-up as the squad made its second consecutive appearance in the NCAA Division II National Championship Game. The Gorillas dropped a 17-13 decision to Jacksonville State University on Dec. 12 at Florence, Ala., in the title game to finish the season with a 14-1 record under head coach Chuck Broyles. The loss snapped a school record 25-game winning streak between 1991 & 1992. The Gorillas captured the MIAA title in 1992.

2004 FOOTBALL TEAM, NCAA DIVISION II NATIONAL RUNNER-UP

The 2004 Gorilla football team posted a 14-1 record in finishing as the NCAA Division II National Runner-up under head coach Chuck Broyles. The Gorillas dropped a 36-31 decision to Valdosta State University at Florence, Ala., on December 11, 2004, in the National Championship Game. Pitt State's high-octane offense broke the NCAA's 118-year-old single-season scoring record. The Gorillas scored 837 points in 15 games, averaging 55.8 points per game. The squad also set NCAA all division records for rushing (5,320 yards) and total offense (8,976 yards) during their historic season. The Gorillas captured the MIAA title in 2004.

2011 FOOTBALL TEAM, NCAA DIVISION II NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

The 2011 Gorilla football team captured Pittsburg State University's second NCAA Division II National Championship on December 17, 2011. Pittsburg State defeated Wayne (Mich.) State University, 35-21, in the NCAA-II National Championship game at Florence, Ala., to complete a 13-1 season under head coach Tim Beck. The Gorillas built a 27-14 halftime advantage, pulling ahead by scoring twice in the final 6:35 of the second quarter. PSU sealed the victory with a touchdown with 2:38 to play in the game. The Gorillas captured the MIAA title in 2011.

**GLEN MERLIN BROWNE (1930-32)***Western, Nebraska*

Glen Merlin Browne was an outstanding lineman earning All-Central Intercollegiate Conference honors three times. Brown was a second-team All-CIC performer in 1930 and earned first-team All-CIC his final two years (1931-32). He also was named to the All-Kansas team in 1932.

**ELDON V. DANENHAUER (1955-57, '59)***Clay Center, Kansas*

Eldon V. Danenhauer is generally regarded as one of the greatest players in the history of the PSU football program. Danenhauer earned All-America honors at tackle in 1959. He went on to play with the Denver Broncos in the NFL from 1960-65.

**THOMAS ARTHUR LESTER (1947, '49-51)***Drumright, Oklahoma*

Thomas Arthur Lester earned honorable mention All-America honors on the Associated Press Little All-America team in 1951. Lester was a two-time first-team All-CIC performer at defensive end. He later served as head football coach at his alma mater from 1967-75, compiling a 48-38-5 record that included the 1970 RMAC title.

**CARNIE HENRY SMITH (1949-66)***Arma, Kansas*

Carnie Henry Smith led PSU to a pair of undefeated NAIA National Championship seasons on the football gridiron during a decorated 18-year career. Smith compiled a 116-52-6 record, leading the Gorillas to the national title in 1957 and again in 1961. His squads won or shared six conference titles during his tenure. Smith later served as Athletic Director at PSU. PSU's football facility, Brandenburg Field/Carnie Smith Stadium, now bears his name.

**TED THOMAS STAHURA (1955-58)***Gary, Indiana*

Ted Thomas Stahura was a three-time first-team All-CIC performer at tackle (1955-57) for the Gorillas. Stahura earned honorable mention NAIA All-America honors and honorable mention Associated Press Little All-America honors during Pitt State's 1957 NAIA National Championship season.

**PHIL JOHN VOGRIN (1959-62)***Kansas City, Kansas*

Phil Vogrin earned honorable mention NAIA All-America and honorable mention Associated Press Little All-America honors while quarterbacking PSU to the NAIA National Championship in 1961. Vogrin earned second-team All-CIC honors in 1960 and first-team All-CIC accolades in 1961. He was voted the MVP of PSU's 12-7 Camellia Bowl victory over Linfield College for the 1961 NAIA national title by the Sacramento Press.

**LEONARD LEROY MANSFIELD (1954-57)***Licking, Missouri*

Leonard Leroy Mansfield was a first-team NAIA All-America selection at tackle on PSU's 1957 NAIA National Championship team. He was voted team MVP in 1957 and also earned first-team All-CIC honors that year. Mansfield was selected by the Philadelphia Eagles in the seventh round of the NFL draft in the spring of 1958.

**GARY WILLIAM SNADON (1958-61)***Lockwood, Missouri*

Gary William Snadon earned first-team Associated Press Little All-America honors at fullback in leading PSU to the 1961 NAIA National Championship. Snadon, who was a two-time All-CIC performer (1960-61), finished his career as the school's second-highest career rusher with 1,559 yards.

**THOMAS SPIEWAK (1957-58, '61-62)***Kansas City, Kansas*

Thomas Henry Spiewak was a first-team NAIA All-America selection at guard as a senior in 1962. Spiewak was a member of both PSU's 1957 and 1961 NAIA National Championship football squads. He also earned first-team All-CIC honors during his senior season.

**HARLAN LEE HESS (1959-62)***Adrian, Missouri*

Harlan Lee Hess was a first-team NAIA All-America selection at tackle as a member of PSU's 1961 NAIA National Championship squad. Hess was a two-time first-team All-CIC (1960-61) performer and a four-year letterwinner (1959-62). He was selected the Outstanding Lineman in the Gorillas NAIA playoff victory over Northern State in 1961.

**KENNETH PAXTON GIRE (1938-41)***Pittsburg, Kansas*

Kenneth Paxton Gire earned first-team All-CIC honors at center each of his last three seasons (1939-41). Gire helped lead PSU to a CIC title his senior season. Additionally, he was named captain of PSU's 50th Anniversary Football Team in 1953 by coaches Carnie Smith, Garfield W. Weede and Charles H. Morgan.

**THOMAS JAMES MILLER (1957-58)***Pittsburg, Kansas*

Thomas James Miller was a second-team NAIA All-America selection at guard on PSU's 1957 NAIA National Championship football team. Miller also earned first-team All-CIC honors that year.

**JOHN ROBERT PETERSON (1964-67)***Clearwater, Kansas*

John Robert Peterson was PSU's first three-time All-America football player. Peterson earned honorable mention NAIA All-America honors in 1965 and first-team NAIA All-America honors his final two years (1966-67). He also was a three-time first-team All-CIC performer (1965-67).

**JERRY EDISON ARCHER (1959-62)***Sarcoie, Missouri*

Jerry Edison Archer was a two-time NAIA All-America football player for the Gorillas. Archer earned second-team NAIA All-America honors at linebacker in 1960 and first-team NAIA All-America recognition at linebacker on PSU's NAIA National Championship squad in 1961. Archer was a two-time first-team All-CIC performer on both sides of the ball (center, linebacker). He was selected by the Detroit Lions in the 1961 NFL draft.

**RICHARD LEON OVERTON (1977-80)***Boonville, Missouri*

Richard Leon Overton was a two-time first-team NAIA All-America running back for the Gorillas (1979-80). Overton earned All-CSIC honors all four years, earning honorable mention recognition in 1977-78 and first-team accolades in 1979-80. Overton finished his collegiate career as PSU's career rushing (3,704) leader as well as PSU's career leader in rushing TDs (47). He also finished his career holding the PSU single game scoring (30) and rushing (257 yds) records.

**RICHARD WILLIAM BEAL (1958-61)***Fredonia, Kansas*

Richard William Beal was a first-team NAIA All-America tackle for the Gorillas on their 1961 NAIA National Championship squad. Beal also was a two-time first-team All-CIC performer (1960-61) and a team captain during his senior season in 1961.

**MICHAEL ANTHONY POTCHAD (1967-70)***Kansas City, Kansas*

Michael Potchad was a first-team NAIA All-America offensive lineman in 1970. Potchad was a second-team All-CIC performer as a freshman in 1967. He earned first-team All-CIC in 1968 and he was a two-time first-team All-RMAC selection (1969-70) as well. Potchad was a fourth-round pick of the Atlanta Falcons in the 1971 NFL draft, but he chose not to pursue a professional career.

**BRIAN K. BYERS (1977-78)***Waterloo, Iowa*

Brian K. Byers was a two-time All-America offensive lineman for the Gorillas. Byers earned second-team NAIA All-America honors in 1977 and he was a first-team NAIA All-America and first-team Kodak/AFCA All-America in 1978. Byers also was a two-time first-team All-CSIC performer (1977-78).

**RONALD DEAN FREEMAN (1978-81)***Boonville, Missouri*

Ronald Dean Freeman was a first-team NAIA All-America defensive lineman at PSU as a senior in 1981. Freeman also was a two-time All-CSIC performer, earning second-team honors in 1980 and first-team accolades in 1981. He recorded 17 QB sacks his senior season. Freeman competed in the USFL with the Pittsburgh Maulers and the Orlando Renegades for two seasons (1984-85).

**GENE STEGEMAN (1984-87)***Overland Park, Kansas*

Gene Stegeman was a second-team NAIA All-America quarterback as a senior in 1987. Stegeman also was a three-time All-CSIC selection, earning second-team honors in 1985 and first-team accolades his final two years (1986-87). He rushed for 1,517 yards and 37 touchdowns, recording the highest rushing total for a PSU quarterback at the time. Stegeman also passed for 2,157 yards and 20 TDs and posted a 30-4-0 record as the Gorillas' starting quarterback.

**MONTE WEATHERS (1984-87)***Riverton, Kansas*

Monte Weathers was a two-time All-America running back for the Gorillas. Weathers earned first-team NAIA All-America honors as a senior in 1987, after earning honorable mention All-America recognition in 1986. He also was a four-time All-CSIC performer. Weathers rushed for 3,192 yards, averaging 9.53 yards per carry for his career. He also was a three-time NAIA All-America in track & field and a member of PSU's 1987 NAIA National Championship 4x100m relay team.

**SAM PITTMAN (1980-83)***Grove, Oklahoma*

Sam Pittman was a first-team NAIA All-America defensive end as a senior in 1983. Pittman also was a three-time All-CSIC performer (1981-83), earning first-team honors his final two seasons. He set the PSU school record for quarterback sacks (44) and finished his career among the school's all-time tackle leaders with 263 career stops.

**JESSE WALL (1985-88)***Midwest City, Oklahoma*

Jesse Wall was a two-time first-team NAIA All-America offensive lineman for the Gorillas (1987-88). Wall also earned first-team All-America honors from the AFCA and Football Gazette and honorable mention All-America on the Associated Press Little All-America team in 1988. Additionally, he was a two-time first-team All-CSIC performer those two seasons, helping PSU lead the nation in rushing, scoring, and total offense in 1987.

**RICK CLARK (1969-70)***Chanute, Kansas*

Rick Clark broke nearly every significant quarterbacking record during his two-year career at Pittsburg State. Clark was a two-time first-team All-Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference and NAIA All-District 10 selection, leading the Gorillas to the RMAC title in 1970. He finished his career with 2,355 passing yards, including 1,251 yards and 15 touchdowns as a senior in 1970.

**JOHN RODERIQUE (1986-89)***Webb City, Missouri*

John Roderique was a two-time All-America linebacker at Pittsburg State. Roderique was a consensus NCAA Division II All-America selection as a senior in 1989, after earning honorable mention NAIA All-America accolades as a junior in 1988. He finished his career with 305 career regular season tackles, including 126 stops during his senior campaign. Roderique added 60 more tackles in post-season play during his four-year career.

**BRUCE STANCELL (1983-86)***Anderson, Missouri*

Bruce Stancell earned honorable mention All-America honors at fullback in 1986. A two-time All-CSIC pick, Stancell finished his career with 2,750 yards — the second-highest career rushing total in school history at the time. He helped pave the way for PSU's entire starting backfield to earn All-America honors in 1986, as PSU led the NAIA in rushing (385.7 ypg), scoring (43.5 ppg) and total offense (490.7 ypg). He also earned NAIA All-America honors in the discus in track & field in 1986.

**DARRYL WREN (1986, '88-90)***Tulsa, Oklahoma*

Darryl Wren was a first-team NCAA Division II All-America selection at defensive back as a senior in 1990. Wren also was a two-time All-MIAA selection (1989-90). He finished his career with 112 tackles, 13 INTs and 17 PBUs. Wren also was a three-time NAIA All-America performer in track & field at PSU. He was a member of PSU's NAIA National Champion 400 meter relay in 1987 and also earned All-America honors in the 200 meters and the 60 yard dash.

**ALAN SPENCER (1969-72)***Webb City, Missouri*

Alan Spencer earned honorable mention NAIA All-America honors at the end position as a senior in 1972. Spencer finished his career as the school's all-time leading receiver with 62 catches for 1,241 yards. He had 36 receptions for 678 yards and five TDs his senior year, earning first-team All-GPAC and first-team NAIA All-District 10 honors in addition to his All-America accolades. He had 26 receptions for 563 yards and nine TDs as a junior in 1971.

**MIKE MEEK (1985-88)***Louisburg, Kansas*

Mike Meek earned first-team NAIA All-America honors at running back as a senior in 1988. He finished his career as the school's eighth-leading all-time rusher, despite playing just two seasons in the backfield. He accumulated 1,896 yards during his junior and senior seasons, earning first-team All-CSIC honors each year. Meek also twice earned NAIA All-America honors in track & field — in the pole vault and the 400 meter relay. He also was a GTE Academic All-American.

**RONNIE WEST (1990-91)***Pineview, Georgia*

Ronnie West captured the Harlon Hill Award as the NCAA Division II National Player of the Year as a senior in 1991, leading PSU to the NCAA-II Nat'l Championship. West finished his career as PSU's all-time leading receiver, with 85 receptions for 1,779 yards and 21 TDs. He was a two-time first-team NCAA-II All-America selection. As a senior in 1991, he caught 50 passes for 1,044 yards and 12 TDs. West also was a two-time first-team All-MIAA selection, earning MIAA Offensive Player of the Year honors in 1991.

**DARREN DAWSON (1988-91)***Paola, Kansas*

Darren Dawson finished his career in 1991 as the school's all-time leading rusher. Dawson rushed for 4,565 yards (including playoffs) and 61 TDs, twice earning NCAA Division II All-America honors in the Pitt State backfield. Dawson was an honorable mention All-America selection as a junior in 1990 when he rushed for 1,415 yards and 18 TDs. He earned second-team All-America honors as a senior in 1991 when he rushed for a school record 1,698 yards and 22 TDs.

**DON FRANK GERMAN (1941-42, '46-47)***Pittsburg, Kansas*

Don German earned All-Central Intercollegiate Conference honors as a halfback three times during a collegiate career which was interrupted by three years of military service during WWII. German earned honorable mention All-CIC accolades as a sophomore in 1942, before returning to campus to earn first-team All-CIC honors his final two years in 1946-47. In 1953, German was named to Pittsburg State University's prestigious 11-man 50th Anniversary Football Team.

**TROY WILSON (1989-92)***Topeka, Kansas*

Troy Wilson finished his career in 1992 as a three-time NCAA Division II All-American at defensive end for the Gorillas. Wilson was an honorable mention All-America selection as a sophomore in 1990. He then earned second-team All-America honors as a junior in 1991 when he recorded 104 tackles with a school record 23 quarterback sacks. Wilson earned first-team All-America honors his senior season when he recorded 112 tackles with 32 TFLs and 14 QB sacks. He finished his career with 317 tackles and 45 QB sacks. Wilson also was a three-time NCAA-II All-American in the shot put and discus in track & field at PSU.

**REX GARNER (1975-76)***Pittsburg, Kansas*

Rex Garner finished a two-year career at PSU as the fourth-leading rusher in school history, despite appearing in just 19 games for the Gorillas. Garner rushed for 1,786 yards and 12 touchdowns on 385 carries, twice earning first-team NAIA All-District 10 and honorable mention NAIA All-America honors. He carried the ball 185 times for 931 yards (5.0 ypc) and seven TDs as a junior in 1975. As a senior in 1976, he carried the ball 200 times for 855 yards (4.3 ypc) and five TDs.

**TIM SINCLAIR (1987-90)***Iola, Kansas*

Tim Sinclair earned second-team NCAA Division II All-America honors as a senior in 1990, capping a four-year career for the Gorillas. He twice earned first-team All-MIAA honors as the starting center for PSU (1989-90). Sinclair started the 1989 season as a back-up offensive guard, before becoming the starting center in week five. He started all 13 games at center for the Gorillas in 1990, earning second-team All-America honors from Football Gazette.

**GERALD "NATE" BEAMAN (1947-50)***Uniontown, Kansas*

Nate Beaman was an accomplished hurdler in track & field and a two-time All-Conference end in football during his playing days at Pittsburg State University. He captured the Central Intercollegiate Conference (CIC) title in the 120-yard hurdles in 1949, winning five meet crowns in the event that year. Beaman earned honorable mention All-CIC honors in football in 1948, before garnering first-team All-CIC accolades as a senior in 1949.

**CHARLES J. PURMA (1921-25)***Wilson, Kansas*

Charles Purma completed a decorated football and track & field career at Pittsburg State University in 1925. In football, Purma was widely considered the greatest PSU player of his era. He twice earned first-team All-KIAC honors as an end in 1923-24. Purma was named to PSU's 11-man 50th Anniversary Team in 1953. In track & field, Purma won KIAC shot put titles in 1923 and 1924. He medaled in the event at the KIAC meet again in 1925, when he recorded the 13th-best mark in the world in the shot put.

**EDWARD S. "STEVE" SIMMONS (1973-76)***Lenexa, Kansas*

Steve Simmons twice earned NAIA All-America honors at linebacker for the Gorillas in the mid 1970s. He earned first-team NAIA All-America and second-team Associated Press Little All-America honors as a senior in 1976, recording 94 tackles (39 solo) with three interceptions. Simmons received honorable mention NAIA All-America honors as a junior in 1975. He finished as the team's second-leading tackler and logged three INTs that year. Simmons earned first-team All-GPAC honors in 1975 and first-team All-CSIC honors in 1976..

**GEORGE A. SWEATT (1919-22)***Humboldt, Kansas*

George Sweatt was a ground-breaking pioneer as Pittsburg State University's first African-American student-athlete to letter in the sports of basketball, football and track & field. Sweatt earned numerous honors in the sprints and set a school record in the shot put in track & field. He lettered in football in 1921, missing All-KIAC honors when an injury cut short his playing season. Sweatt also lettered in basketball in the 1920 and 1922 seasons. After college, he embarked upon a professional baseball career and became the only regular player to appear in each of the first four Negro League World Series with the Kansas City Monarchs and the Chicago American Giants (1924-27).

**BUDDY BALL (1948-51)***Riverton, Kansas*

Buddy Ball completed a standout career as a quarterback by earning honorable mention All-America honors on the Associated Press Little All-America team as a senior in 1951. He twice earned All-CIC honors, grabbing second-team accolades in 1950 and first-team recognition in 1951. In 1950, Ball helped guide the Gorillas to a post-season appearance in the Mirza Shrine Bowl Classic. Following his playing career, Ball was named to Pitt State's prestigious 11-man 50th Anniversary Team in 1953.

**CHRIS BROWN (1992-95)***Liberal, Kansas*

Chris Brown became just the second football player in school history to earn All-America honors three times, doing so between 1993-95. He was named a consensus first-team NCAA Division II All-American as a senior in 1995, recording 149 tackles on the year. Brown also earned first-team All-America honors in 1993 and 1994 and he was a three-time first-team All-MIAA selection (1993-95), garnering MIAA Defensive Player of the Year honors in 1995. Brown finished his career with a school record 470 tackles. He set an NCAA-II playoff record with 21 tackles in the 1992 National Championship Game. Following his career, Brown was named to the NCAA-II All-Quarter Century Team (1973-96) in 1997.

**GENE A. WAYENBERG, JR. (1980-81)***Mission, Kansas*

Gene Wayenberg, Jr., finished a prolific two-year career as the school's all-time leading receiver in 1981. He caught 68 career passes for 1,718 yards (25.3 ypc) and 14 touchdowns. Wayenberg earned second-team NAIA All-America honors in 1981, catching 41 passes for 1,015 yards and 10 TDs that year. He twice earned All-CSIC honors, snaring second-team recognition in 1980 and first-team accolades in 1981. Wayenberg also set the school's single-game receiving total on Nov. 1, 1980, when he caught eight passes for 215 yards and one TD against Missouri Western.

**DOUG BULLARD (1990-93)***Galena, Kansas*

Doug Bullard garnered first-team NCAA Division II All-America honors as a senior in 1993. He was named to the first-team squad by the AFCA, Football Gazette and Daktronics. Bullard, a three-year starter at center for the Gorillas, earned All-MIAA honors in each of his final three seasons. He earned third-team All-MIAA recognition as a sophomore in 1991, helping PSU capture the NCAA-II national title. Bullard garnered second-team All-MIAA honors as a junior in 1992 and first-team All-MIAA accolades in 1993.

**KENDALL GAMMON (1988-91)***Rose Hill, Kansas*

Kendall Gammon garnered first-team NCAA Division II All-America honors as an offensive guard from Football Gazette as a senior in 1991, helping the Gorillas to a 13-1-1 record and the NCAA Division II National Championship. He earned first-team All-MIAA honors in each of his final three seasons (1989-91). Following his collegiate career, Gammon was selected to Pitt State's 100th Anniversary Football Team in 2003.

**THOMAS B. STRINGER (1979-82)***Topeka, Kansas*

Tom Stringer earned first-team NAIA All-America honors as an offensive lineman for the Gorillas as a junior in 1981, helping Pitt State to a 10-2 record and the NAIA Division I National Runner-up finish that season. He twice earned All-CSIC honors. He was a first-team All-CSIC selection in 1981, and Stringer was named to the second-team All-CSIC squad as a senior in 1982.

**BLAISE BAUER (1985-88)***Monett, Missouri*

Blaise Bauer twice earned honorable mention NAIA All-America honors as a tight end for the Gorillas. Bauer caught 44 career passes for 1,248 yards and a school record 18 touchdowns. His receiving total stood as the third-highest mark in school history at the time. Bauer also set school records for career yards per catch (29.2 ypc) and season yards per catch (31.4 ypc) from the 1986 season. He finished his career as a three-time All-CSIC performer.

**JAMES R. JOLGEN (1948-49)***Everett, Washington*

James "Jim" Jolgen was named to Pitt State's prestigious 11-man 50th Anniversary Football Team following his playing days for the Gorillas. During his senior season, Jolgen became the first football player in school history to garner All-America honors when he was named to the 1949 A.P. Little All-America Team as an honorable mention selection. He also earned first-team All-CIC honors at tackle in 1949, helping first-year coach Carnie Smith's squad to an 8-2-1 record and the CIC co-championship.

**BRIAN D. MOORMAN (1995-99)***Sedwick, Kansas*

Brian Moorman left Pitt State as the most decorated male athlete in school history in 1999. Moorman became the first four-time All-American football player in school history (1995-98), and he was named to PSU's 100th Anniversary Football Team in 2003. In track & field, Moorman earned All-America honors on 10 occasions, including three straight national championships in the 400 meter hurdles (1997-99). He also claimed eight MIAA individual event titles. Additionally, Moorman was a six-time Academic All-America® selection, earning the accolades in three consecutive years in both football and track & field.

**RONALD MOORE (1989-92)***Spencer, Oklahoma*

Ronald Moore earned Division II's highest individual honor while helping Pitt State to 25 consecutive wins in 1991 and 1992. Moore earned the 1992 Harlon Hill Award as the top player in the country his senior season. He finished his career as the school's all-time leading rusher and set single season records for rushing and rushing touchdowns in 1992 on his way to earning consensus All-America honors. The three-time All-MIAA performer and 1992 conference offensive player of the year was drafted in the fourth round of the 1993 NFL draft.

**BEN PETERSON (1995-98)***Clay Center, Kansas*

A two-time All-American selection, Ben Peterson played four years at defensive end for the Gorillas. He recorded 241 career tackles and 29.0 quarterback sacks. He was a three-time All-MIAA selection, including first-team honors in his final two seasons.

**ALBERT SCHMIDT (1968-71)***Caldwell, Kansas*

Albert Schmidt earned honorable mention All-America at running back on the Associated Press Little All-America Team as a senior for the Gorillas in 1971. He finished his as the school's third-highest leading rusher. Schmidt helped the Gorillas to a 9-2 record and an RMAC Championship. Following his senior season, Schmidt was drafted in the 11th round of the 1972 NFL Draft by the Los Angeles Rams.

**CHUCK BROYLES (1965-68, 1990-2009)***Mulberry, Kansas*

Chuck Broyles enjoyed a decorated 20-year tenure as the Gorillas head football coach (1990-2009). He helped the Gorillas to the 1991 NCAA Division II National Title and earned 198 wins in his tenure at Pittsburg State. Broyles earned Division II national coach of the year honors three times - from the American Football Coaches in 1991, from Schutt Sports in 2004 and from Liberty Mutual in 2008. He led the Gorillas to four appearances in the NCAA Division II National Championship Game (1991, 1992, 1995, 2004), including a school record 25 straight wins between 1991-92. He also led Pitt State to nine MIAA titles and 15 trips to the NCAA-II playoffs. Additionally, Broyles served as athletics director at his alma mater for 14 years, from 1996 - 2010. As a four-year football letterwinner for the Gorillas (1965-68), Broyles earned honorable mention NAIA All-America and first-team All-CIC honors as a senior in 1968.

**WES BAKER (1997-2000)***Latygne, Kansas*

Wes Baker earned NCAA Division II All-America honors in each of his final three seasons, including consensus first-team All-America honors as a senior in 2000. He finished his career with 314 stops, ranking sixth on the Gorillas' all-time tackles chart. Baker earned first-team All-MIAA honors from 1998-2000. Following his career, Baker was selected to the school's 100th Anniversary Football Team in 2003.

**B.J. MCGIVERN (1992-95)***Topeka, Kansas*

B.J. McGivern earned first-team NCAA Division II All-America honors as a senior in 1995 when he recorded a single-season record 172 tackles for the Gorillas. McGivern garnered first-team All-MIAA honors and was selected the 1995 MIAA Defensive Player of the Year while helping Pitt State to a 12-1-1 record and a national runner-up finish. He received first-team All-America honors from Daktronics and Football Gazette. Following his playing career, McGivern was selected to PSU's 100th Anniversary Football Team in 2003.

**AARON MCCONNELL (2000-03)***Midwest City, Oklahoma*

Aaron McConnell became just the second player in the history of the Pitt State football program to earn All-America honors in each of his four playing seasons from 2000-03. McConnell was a consensus first-team All-America selection as well as the MIAA Defensive Player of the Year as a senior in 2003. He also earned first-team All-America honors in 2001 (AFCA) and 2002 (A.P.), after garnering honorable mention All-America recognition as a freshman in 2000. A four-time first-team All-MIAA performer, McConnell recorded 232 tackles (116 solo) with 75.0 tackles-for-loss and 21.0 quarterback sacks in 48 career games.

**CHARLES H. MORGAN (1936-48)***Girard, Kansas*

Charles Morgan served in the department of intercollegiate athletics between 1931-48. Morgan compiled a 44-43-15 (.505) record as head football coach from 1936, '38-48, leading his 1941 and 1942 Pitt State teams to CIC titles. His 1943 squad, comprised mostly of former football players from Texas colleges in Navy training, posted the school's first unblemished record (6-0-0) during a war-shortened season. Morgan also served as the Gorillas' interim head basketball coach in 1935 when Pitt State's John Lance took a leave of absence. He guided that squad to a CIC co-championship.

**BRIAN HUTCHINS (1990-93)***Pittsburg, Kansas*

Brian Hutchins earned honorable mention NCAA Division II All-America honors at quarterback as a junior in 1992, after leading the Gorillas to consecutive trips to the NCAA Division II National Championship Game. Hutchins compiled a 27-5 record as Pitt State's starter, leading the Gorillas to the 1991 NCAA Division II National Championship and the 1992 national runner-up finish. He rushed for 2,007 yards and passed for 3,053 yards and 25 touchdowns.

**NEAL PHILPOT (2001-04)***Norton, Kansas*

Neal Philpot earned NCAA Division II All-America honors at quarterback in each of his final two seasons for the Gorillas (2003-04). Philpot earned second-team All-America as well as MIAA Offensive MVP recognition while directing one of the most prolific offenses in NCAA history as a senior in 2004. A four-time All-MIAA performer, Philpot set conference records for career QB rushing yards (4337) and career total offense (10,168). He also posted a 41-8 record as a four-year starter for the Gorillas.

**MARVIN ACKERSON (1954-56)***Parsons, Kansas*

Marvin Ackerson earned honorable mention All-America honors on the Associated Press Little All-America Team as a junior in 1955. Ackerson garnered All-Central Intercollegiate Conference accolades in each of his final two seasons, earning first-team recognition in 1955 and second-team honors as a senior in 1956. Ackerson was Pitt State's third all-time football All-America honoree.

**MATT HOWARD (1998-2001)***Yukon, Oklahoma*

Matt Howard earned NCAA Division II All-America honors on the offensive line in each of his final two seasons for the Gorillas (2000-01). Howard earned first-team All-America honors as a senior in 2004. A three-time first-team All-MIAA selection (1999-2001), Howard was named to Pitt State's 100th Anniversary Squad in 2003.

**PAUL SCHLEICHER (1956-59)***Kansas City, Kansas*

Paul Schleicher completed his decorated playing career as Pittsburg State's all-time leading rusher in 1959 with 1,626 career yards. Schleicher also set the school's single season rushing record (797 yards) in 1959 as well as the Gorillas' single season scoring record (92 points) his senior season. He also set Pitt State's single game rushing record with 204 yards in his final collegiate game against Northeastern State on Nov. 14, 1959. Schleicher was a two-time All-CIC honoree, earning first-team honors in 1959.

**LARRY BASKY (1963-65)***Ottawa, Illinois*

Larry Basky became just the second player in the history of the Pitt State football program to earn All-America in two playing seasons. Basky garnered honorable mention NAIA All-America recognition as a defensive lineman as a sophomore in 1963 and honorable mention NAIA All-America accolades at center as a senior in 1965. He earned second-team All-CIC recognition as a defensive lineman in 1963, before claiming first-team All-CIC honors at center his final two seasons.

**CHARLES "CHUCK" NORRIS (1957-58)***Ellinwood, Kansas*

Chuck Norris set single season rushing and scoring records as a junior in 1957 while helping Pitt State capture the school's first NAIA National Championship. Norris, who transferred to Pitt State from Kansas State, rushed for 662 yards and scored 90 points as the Gorillas posted an unblemished 11-0 season. He earned second-team All-CIC honors that year. Norris finished his two-year career with 931 rushing yards and 18 touchdowns.

**JERMAINE CARPENTER (2003-06)***Waco, Texas*

Jermaine Carpenter earned third-team NCAA Division II All-America honors at wide receiver as a senior in 2014. Carpenter caught 69 passes for 1,671 yards and 23 touchdowns during his two-year football career for the Gorillas (2003-04). He also garnered All-America honors on nine occasions in track & field, including a national runner-up finish in the 200 meters in 2005 and a national runner-up finish in the 100 meters in 2006. A two-time All-MIAA football player, Carpenter captured nine MIAA titles in track & field and earned All-MIAA honors on 21 occasions.

**JOSH LATTIMER (2002-05)***Fort Scott, Kansas*

Josh Lattimer finished his decorated career as a two-time NCAA Division II All-America linebacker for the Gorillas. Lattimer earned second-team All-America honors as a senior in 2005 and honorable mention All-America recognition as a junior in 2004 when he helped lead the Gorillas to a 14-1 record and a berth in the NCAA Division II National Championship Game. He also earned All-MIAA honors in each of his final three seasons (2003-05). Lattimer compiled 394 career tackles — the second-highest career total in school history at the time. He also garnered All-MIAA three times in the javelin in track & field (2002-04).

**ANDREW POLING (1996-99)***Saint Francis, Kansas*

Andrew Poling earned NCAA Division II All-America honors in each of his final two playing seasons (1998-99). Poling received honorable mention All-America recognition as a junior in 1998, before claiming first-team All-America honors his senior season. A four-time All-MIAA performer, Poling was named the 1996 MIAA Freshman of the Year. He finished his decorated career with 356 tackles — the fourth-highest total in school history at the time. Following his playing career, Poling was selected to PSU's 100th Anniversary Football Team in 2003.

**CHAD WEEKS (2002-05)***Oologah, Oklahoma*

Chad Weeks twice earned first-team NCAA Division II All-America honors as an offensive lineman for the Gorillas (2004-05). Weeks helped pave the way up front for Pitt State's 2004 offensive unit to set NCAA all-time scoring (837 pts) and total offense (8976 yds) and DI1 all-time rushing (5320 yds) records as the Gorillas posted a 14-1 record and reached the NCAA Division II National Championship Game. He earned All-MIAA honors in each of his final three seasons, including first-team All-MIAA accolades in final two years (2004-05).

**GERMAINE RACE (2003-06)***Warrensburg, Missouri*

Germaine Race rushed for an NCAA Division II record 6,985 yards and scored an NCAA all-division record 107 touchdowns during his decorated playing career for the Gorillas (2003-06). Race earned first-team NCAA Division II All-America honors in each of his final three seasons. A four-time All-MIAA performer, he was selected the MIAA's Offensive MVP in 2005 and 2006. Race finished third in balloting for the Harlon Hill Trophy as the Division II Player of the Year in 2006.

**JEFF MORELAND (1991-95)***Blue Springs, Missouri*

Jeff Moreland earned honorable mention NCAA Division II All-America honors at quarterback for the Gorillas as a senior in 1995. Moreland compiled a 30-2-2 (.912) record as Pitt State's starting quarterback, including a 27-0-1 (.982) record in regular season games. He set the Gorillas QB rushing record with 2,075 yards and he passed for an additional 3,300 yards. His 5,375 yards of total offense ranked second among QBs in school history at the time of his graduation. Moreland led Pitt State to an 8-0-0 record in the Gorillas 1991 National Championship season and directed the Gorillas to a 12-1-1 record and the 1995 National Runner-up finish.

**CHUCK STURDEVANT (1961-62)***Neosho, Missouri*

Chuck Sturdevant earned honorable mention NAIA All-America honors as a defensive back on Pitt State's 1961 NAIA National Championship football team. Sturdevant made eight tackles and an interception in the Gorillas' 1961 Camillia Bowl victory. A two-sport stand-out, Sturdevant also was selected the Most Valuable Player on Pitt State's inaugural baseball team in 1962.

**BILL PRESSON (1957-61)***Kansas City, Kansas*

Bill Presson earned second-team All-Central Intercollegiate Conference honors as a senior for the Gorillas in 1961. Presson helped Pitt State capture the program's first two NAIA National Championships during undefeated campaigns in 1957 and again in 1961. He rushed for a team-leading 640 yards in 1961. Presson also set school single season punt return (17.25 ypr) and kickoff return (31.89 ypr) records as a junior in 1960. He set the school career punt return record (17.25 ypr) as well. Presson also was a three-time All-CIC performer in track & field for the Gorillas.

**NATHAN BAKER (2001-04)***Parsons, Kansas*

Nathan Baker garnered consensus first-team NCAA Division II All-America honors and captured the inaugural Gene Upshaw Award as the Division II Lineman of the Year as a senior in 2004. The offensive tackle helped the Pitt State offense set NCAA all-time scoring (837 pts) and total offense (8976 yds) records and the Division II all-time rushing record (5320 yds) as the Gorillas posted a 14-1 record and finished as the NCAA Division II National Runner-up in 2004. Baker was a two-time All-MIAA performer (2003-04).

**JOE TAYLOR (2002-05)***Pittsburg, Kansas*

Joe Taylor earned second-team NCAA Division II All-America honors at fullback as a senior for the Gorillas in 2005. Taylor garnered All-MIAA recognition in three of four years in the Pitt State backfield, including first-team All-MIAA accolades in 2005. Originally a tailback, Taylor moved to fullback in 2003 and helped teammate Germaine Race ultimately set the NCAA Division II rushing record. For his career, Taylor carried the ball 208 times for 1,243 yards (5.98 ypc) and 21 touchdowns.

**CHRIS GRANTHAM (1981-84)***Grandview, Missouri*

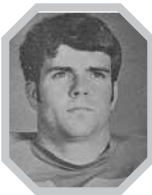
Chris Grantham earned first-team NAIA All-America honors as an offensive lineman as a senior for the Gorillas in 1984. Grantham garnered first-team All-Central States Intercollegiate Conference (CSIC) in each of his final three seasons (1982-84). A four-year starter, Grantham played on Pitt State's 1981 NAIA National Runner-up squad as a freshman. Following his collegiate career, Grantham joined the U.S. Navy, retiring as a Petty Officer First Class in 1991.

**CHRIS HANNA (1990-93)***Springfield, Missouri*

Chris Hanna earned NCAA Division II All-America honors as a defensive lineman for the Gorillas as a junior in 1992. Hanna garnered All-MIAA accolades all four seasons from 1990-93, including first-team All-MIAA recognition in 1992. He made 120 career tackles (42 solo) with 7.0 tackles-for-loss and 5.0 quarterback sacks. Hanna posted 46 stops (13 solo) in 1992 while helping the Gorillas post a 14-1 record and reach the NCAA Division II National Championship Game.

**DENNIS WATSON (1963-66)***Kansas City, Kansas*

Dennis Watson earned honorable mention NAIA All-America honors as an end as a senior for the Gorillas in 1966. Watson also garnered first-team All-Central Intercollegiate Conference (CIC) honors his senior season. Additionally, Watson played baseball for the Gorillas from 1964-67. Following his collegiate career, Watson served as a long time high school teacher and coach at Pittsburg High School (1968-98), Frontenac and Girard.

**BOB HOMER (1968-71)***Meade, Kansas*

Bob Homer earned first-team NAIA All-District 10 honors in each of his final two seasons in 1970-71. Homer garnered second-team All-CIC accolades as a freshman in 1968 and he earned first-team All-RMAC recognition as a junior in 1970. Homer started 41 consecutive games at linebacker for the Gorillas. He is generally recognized as the school's career tackles leader at the time of his graduation (defensive statistics were not kept in his era).

**ANDY MAJORS (2002-05)***Lenexa, Kansas*

Andy Majors earned NCAA Division II All-America honors at quarterback as a senior for the Gorillas in 2005. Majors set Pitt State single game (358 yards) and single season passing records in 2005, when he compiled 3,065 yards and 20 touchdowns. He earned All-MIAA honors at wide receiver in 2003 and at quarterback in 2004-05. Majors finished his career completing 352 of 597 passes for 5,531 yards and 43 touchdowns.

**RON RANDLEMAN (1976-81)***Carlisle, Iowa*

Ron Randleman was named the 1981 NAIA Division I National Coach of the Year after leading Pitt State to a 10-2 record and the NAIA National Runner-Up finish. He served for six years as the Gorillas head coach, from 1976-81, helping revive the proud program. Randleman enjoyed a 36-year career as a collegiate head coach, compiling a 218-157-4 record. He led his teams to nine conference titles, was named Conference Coach of the Year seven times and NAIA District Coach of the Year four times.

**CALEB FARABI (2004-08)***Pittsburg, Kansas*

Caleb Farabi earned NCAA Division II All-America honors at running back in both his junior and senior seasons in 2007-08. Farabi rushed for 3,292 yards and 43 touchdowns during his decorated career, posting the seventh most rushing yards in school history. He also caught 101 passes for 945 yards and three scores. Farabi also garnered CoSIDA Academic All-America honors twice during his career and he was selected the 2007-08 MIAA Ken B. Jones Award winner as the conference's male student-athlete of the year.

PSU ALL-AMERICA FACTS

- 123 PSU players have earned NCAA Division II All-America honors on 165 total occasions in the last 34 years (1989-2022).
- 3 PSU players have earned All-America honors in all four of their playing seasons: (Brian Moorman, 1995-98; Aaron McConnell, 2000-03; Nate Dreiling, 2010-13)

- PSU has produced at least 1 All-America offensive lineman in 26 of the last 34 years, and 54 All-America offensive lineman overall.

Pittsburg State University has built a tradition as one of the finest small-college football programs in the nation. Two NAIA national championships and a pair of NCAA Division II national titles highlight an illustrious gridiron history that dates back to the early 1900s.

After competing for 81 years as an NAIA program, PSU joined the NCAA Division II ranks and the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association in 1989. The Gorillas have captured the MIAA football championship in 12 of 32 seasons, after winning four straight championships in the NAIA's Central States Intercollegiate Conference, from 1985-88.

Pittsburg State has qualified for the national playoffs in 22 of the last 36 years, including a then NCAA Division II record nine straight post-season appearances from 1989-97.

PSU reached the Division II National Championship Game three times in the 1990s. The Gorillas captured the 1991 National Championship and finished as the national runner-up in '92. PSU won a school-record 25 straight games during that two-season span. The Gorillas finished the '95 season as the national runner-up.

Pitt State returned to the Division II National Championship Game again during a record-breaking 2004 campaign and the Gorillas captured the school's second NCAA Division II National Championship in 2011 (and the program's fourth all-time national title).

THE WINNINGEST ALL-TIME NCAA DIVISION II PROGRAM

Pittsburg State became the winningest NCAA Division II football program in 1995.

Pitt State passed Hillsdale College, Mich., at the top of the all-time victories list in the 1995 season on its march to the national runner-up finish. The Gorillas, in 113 seasons of intercollegiate competition, have accumulated 729 victories — posting a 729-359-48 overall mark. Tuskegee University is currently second with 691 victories.

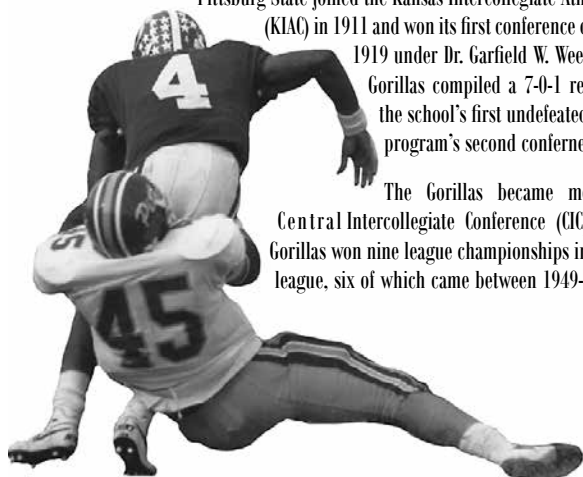

Pittsburg State has recorded only 22 losing seasons during its 114-year history and the Gorillas notched 31 straight winning seasons between 1978 and 2008. PSU has won a total of 31 league titles, including 16 championships in the last 37 years.

PITT STATE'S CONFERENCE AFFILIATION CHRONOLOGY

Pittsburg State joined the Kansas Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (KIAC) in 1911 and won its first conference championship in 1919 under Dr. Garfield W. Weede. In 1924, the Gorillas compiled a 7-0-1 record, recording the school's first undefeated season and the program's second conference title.

The Gorillas became members of the Central Intercollegiate Conference (CIC) in 1928. The Gorillas won nine league championships in 41 years in the league, six of which came between 1949-66 under Carnie

Smith. As the winningest coach in PSU history (until 2001 when he was passed by Chuck Broyles), Smith guided the Gorillas to 116 wins, 52 losses and six ties in his 18 seasons as the school's head coach.

Under Smith, Pittsburg State won two NAIA National Championships, achieving perfect 11-0-0 seasons in 1957 and 1961 to win the coveted national crowns.

In 1969, Pittsburg State joined the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference. The Gorillas competed in the conference for three seasons, winning the RMAC title in 1970.

Pittsburg State then competed in the Great Plains Athletic Conference from 1972-75 before joining the Central States Intercollegiate Conference (CSIC) in 1976. Pitt State won or shared the CSIC championship in seven of 13 years in the league.

From 1980-88, Pittsburg State won six CSIC championships, appeared in the NAIA national playoffs five times and produced 34 NAIA All-Americans.

In 1989, Pittsburg State joined the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association and the NCAA Division II ranks.

Since then, the Gorillas won the MIAA title 10 times and qualified for the Division II playoff field in 16 of the 20 seasons under head coach Chuck Broyles. The Gorillas won the NCAA-II national title in '91 and finished as the national runner-up in 1992, 1995 and 2004.

Head coach Tim Beck led Pitt State to a pair of MIAA titles as well as the 2011 NCAA Division II National Championship during his tenure from 2010-19.

Pitt State has posted a 235-65-1 (.782) record against MIAA opponents since joining the conference.

GORILLAS IN POST-SEASON PLAY

Pittsburg State has qualified for the national playoffs in 22 of the last 37 years, including a then record nine consecutive berths in the NCAA-II post-season championships from 1989-97.

The Gorillas have advanced to postseason play 31 times in the 114-year history of the football program, highlighted by 25 appearances in national playoff competition.

In 1957, the Gorillas captured the first of two NAIA National Championships under head coach Carnie Smith, completing a perfect 11-0 campaign with a 27-26 victory over Hillsdale College, Mich., in the Holiday Bowl at St. Petersburg, Fla. In 1961, the Gorillas again went 11-0 — this time winning the NAIA title with a 12-7 victory against Linfield College, Ore., in the Camellia Bowl at Sacramento, Calif.



In 1981, the Gorillas returned to the NAIA National Championship game under head coach Ron Randleman but came up short as PSU fell to Elon, 3-0, on a frozen field at Burlington, N.C.

In 1985, under first-year head coach Dennis Franchione, the Gorillas qualified for the NAIA playoffs once again but lost a first-round contest. Pittsburg State reached the semifinals the next three seasons, but each year the Gorillas' quest for a national crown ended in bitter defeat.

In 1989, PSU made the transition from the NAIA to the NCAA Division II ranks and won its first NCAA-II playoff game, a 28-7 victory over MIAA rival Northwest Missouri, before falling to Angelo State, Texas, in the quarterfinals.

PSU returned to the NCAA-II playoffs in 1990 under head coach Chuck Broyles, reaching the national semifinals before falling, 39-29, to eventual national champion North Dakota State.

Finally in 1991, PSU won its first national championship in 30 years and its first title as a member of NCAA Division II with a 23-6 victory over Jacksonville State, Ala., at Florence, Ala.

In 1992, PSU came inches short of a repeat championship, after reaching the title game by virtue of a pair of thrilling wins against North Dakota State (38-37 in OT) and Portland State (41-38). In the title game, the Gorillas saw a late drive against the same JSU team they beat in '91 come up short, and the Gamecocks escaped with a 17-13 win at Florence. The loss ended PSU's school record 25-game winning streak.

In 1993 and 1994, PSU qualified for the Division II playoffs, but suffered first-round defeats. In '93, the Gorillas dropped a 17-14 decision at North Dakota, and in '94, PSU lost an 18-12 triple overtime contest to North Dakota State on a rain-soaked Brandenburg Field.

In 1995, PSU again reached the NCAA-II National Championship game. The Gorillas took a 12-0-1 record into the title game, before falling, 27-7, to North Alabama.

In 1996, '97 and '99, PSU suffered close first-round defeats to Northern Colorado. In 2000, PSU lost a first-round game against Nebraska-Omaha. In 2001, PSU defeated UNO in the first round before losing to eventual national champion North Dakota in the national quarterfinals. In 2003, UNB defeated PSU in the first round en route to a national runner-up finish.

In 2004, the Gorillas advanced all the way to the 2004 NCAA-II National Championship Game, before falling, 36-31, to Valdosta State at Florence, Ala. In 2005, Pitt State reached the NCAA-II quarterfinals during a 10-4 campaign. In 2008, the Gorillas advanced to the second round of the NCAA-II playoffs while posting an 11-2 record.

In 2011, Pitt State capped a magical run through the season by capturing the school's fourth all-time national championship with a 35-21 victory over Wayne (Mich.) State in the NCAA Division II National Championship game at Florence, Ala., on Dec. 17.

In 2014, the Gorillas advanced to the second round of the playoffs before falling to the eventual national runner-up, Minnesota State-Mankato.

PITTSBURG STATE'S ALL-TIME PLAYOFF RECORD

Pittsburg State compiled a 9-5 record in seven NAIA playoff appearances, and the Gorillas have a 25-16 mark in the NCAA Division II playoffs, for a combined 34-21 mark.

Pitt State is 25-7 at home in the playoffs, 5-12 on the road and 4-2 in games played at neutral sites. All four neutral site victories have come in national championship games (1957, 1961, 1991, 2011).

Pittsburg State has played in seven additional postseason bowl games: the 1950 Mirza Temple Shrine Bowl, the 1979 Boot Hill Bowl, the 1980 Moila Shrine Bowl, the 2006 Mineral Water Bowl, the 2010 Mineral Water Bowl, the 2013 Mineral Water Bowl and the 2017 Agent Barry Live United Bowl.

- **Oct. 10, 1908** — The Manual Training Normal School takes the field for the first time, dropping a 6-0 decision to the Girard Athletic Association at the new Normal Grounds under Coach Albert McLeland.
- **Oct. 30, 1908** — The "Normals" notch their first victory with a 2-0 decision over the Pittsburg Business School in a game played at the high school field on 9th & Broadway.
- **1909** — John Fuhrer becomes school's second head coach.
- **Nov. 25, 1909** — The "Normals" host their first Thanksgiving Day game. Construction of new grandstands at the Normal Grounds, which was undertaken by college students and faculty, was completed in time for the game, a 6-0 win by visiting Southwest Missouri.

ST. PETERSBURG, Fla. — Kansas State Teachers College captured its first NAIA national championship with a narrow 27-26 victory against the Hillsdale College Dales in the 1957 Holiday Bowl.

The Gorillas snapped the Dales' 34-game winning streak and finished their season with an unblemished 11-0 record.

KSTC jumped out to a 20-0 lead then had to hold on in the game's final moments to secure the one-point victory.

Charles Norris had a pair of first-quarter touchdown runs and Paul Grandell hauled in a 17 yard TD pass from quarterback John Matour as KSTC struck for three scores in the initial period.

The Dales rallied with 13 points in the second quarter, then knotted the score at 20-20 on Walt Poe's 7-yard TD catch from quarterback Doug Maison.

Grandell put the Gorillas back in front with his second 17-yard TD grab from Matous and Bill Samuels booted the PAT for a 27-20 advantage.

Hillsdale's Earl O'Shaughnessy caught a 14-yard TD pass from Maison late in the fourth quarter, but Wayne O'Shaughnessy's potential game-tying PAT missed, leaving KSTC in front, 27-26.

The Dales successfully recovered an onside kick at the Gorillas' 46 yard line, but Gene Wayenberg sealed the KSTC victory when he intercepted a Maison pass in the end zone as time expired.

SACRAMENTO, Calif. — Kansas State College won its second NAIA Championship in five years with a hard-fought, 12-7, win against the Linfield College Wildcats in the 1961 Camellia Bowl at Hughes Stadium.

Bob Fulton put KSC in front on its first offensive play when he broke loose for a 64-yard scoring run.

Neither team scored again until the fourth quarter when KSC's Archie Ringgenberg returned an interception 89 yards to set up a one-yard plunge by Gary Snadon which put the Gorillas up 12-0.

The Wildcats had driven to the KSC 20 yard line, before Ringgenberg turned the game around with his interception.

Linfield countered with a scoring drive to trim the margin to 12-7 on Bernie Grant's 9-yard TD catch from quarterback Bill Parrish midway through the fourth quarter.

The Wildcats had a chance to take the lead late in the game, after driving to the KSC 40 with 1:22 left, but Parrish was sacked by Bruce Roach on fourth down to seal the victory.

BURLINGTON, N.C. — The Gorillas suffered their first NAIA championship game defeat on a blustery day in North Carolina, as the host Elon College Christians edged Pittsburg State, 3-0, for their second straight NAIA Division I crown.

The temperature was 30 degrees at kickoff with a northwest wind blowing 15-20 miles per hour. Turnovers and missed opportunities became the keys to the game.

Elon turned the ball over six times, including on its first two offensive possessions.

PSU couldn't cash in though, as Dave Hammons missed four field goals in the game (32, 29, 27, 47).

EC's Phil Renn scored the decisive points early in the fourth quarter when he booted a 23-yard field goal.

The Gorilla had a pair of opportunities to tie the score or go ahead in the final period.

Hammons missed a 47-yard field goal attempt with 10:27 to play in the game. After the Gorillas got the ball back, PSU drove to the EC 34-yard line, but Brent Smotherman's fumble gave the ball back to the Christians with 4:30 remaining.

Elon then successfully ran out the clock to claim the win.

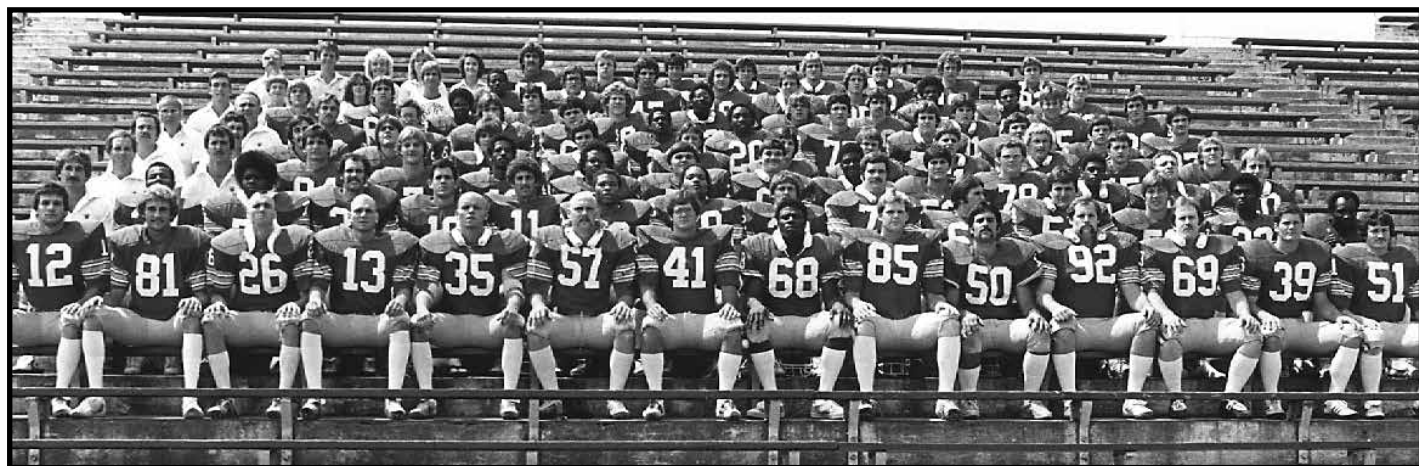
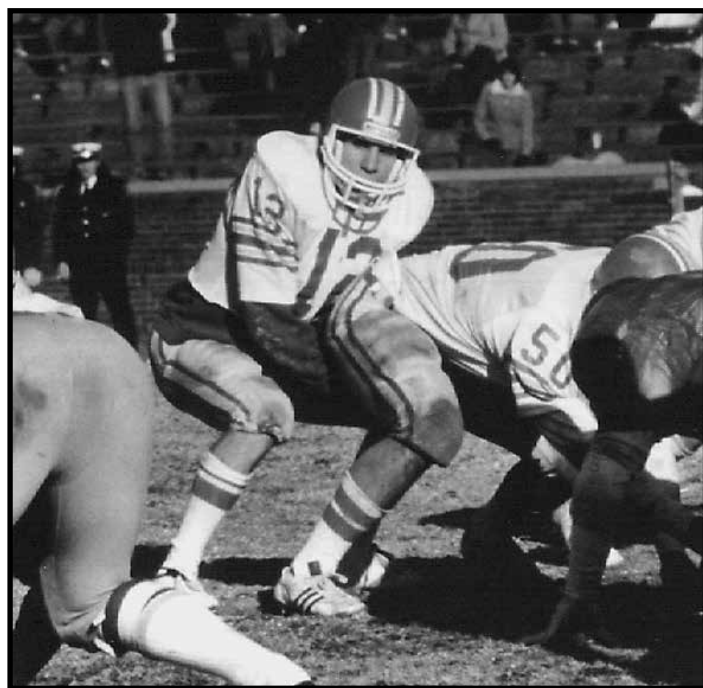

FLORENCE, Ala. — Pittsburg State University captured its first NCAA national championship by beating the Jacksonville (Ala.) State University Gamecocks, 23-6, at Florence, Ala.

Wide receiver Ronnie West, who was presented the Harlon Hill Award honoring the top athlete in Division II football the night before, caught a 17-yard TD pass from Brian Hutchins to put the Gorillas in front late in the first quarter.

Pitt State took a 13-6 lead to the intermission when Hutchins capped a 76-yard drive with a 13-yard run with 16 seconds remaining in the second quarter.

The Gorillas closed the door on the Gamecocks in the second half, when JSU QB Nickey Edmondson was forced out of the game with a leg injury in the third quarter.

Pitt State's Darren Dawson added a 10-yard touchdown run late in the third period, and James Jenkins booted a short 22-yard field goal midway through the fourth quarter to complete the scoring.

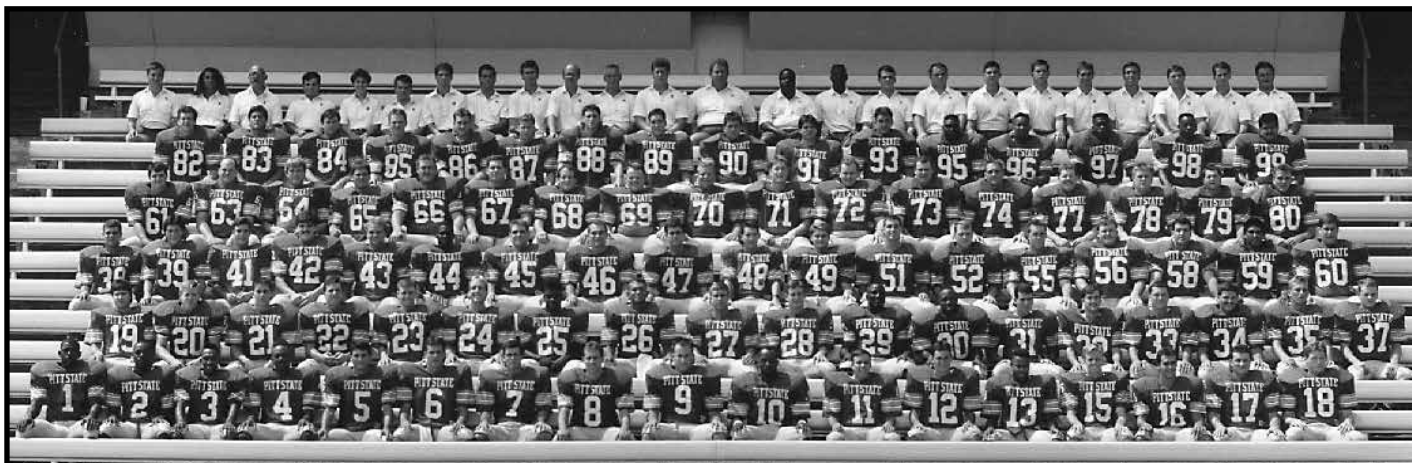

FLORENCE, Ala. — The Jacksonville (Ala.) State University Gamecocks played a game of keep-away with the Pittsburg State University Gorillas and then stopped a late drive to claim the 1992 NCAA Division II National Championship.

The Gamecocks (13-1-1) avenged a 23-6 loss to the Gorillas (14-1) in the 1991 title game by limiting Harlon Hill Award winner Ronald Moore to a season-low 83 yards rushing.

Pitt State built a 13-3 lead, but Jax State scored the game's final 14 points to win it.

Moore, who claimed the Hill Trophy as the National Player of the Year the night before the game, electrified the crowd by returning the opening kickoff 99 yards for a touchdown.

Ray Staten added a 21-yard TD grab from Brian Hutchins midway through the second quarter, before the Gamecocks closed within three points, at 13-10, on Danny Lee's 8-yard TD run late in the second stanza.

Jax State pushed in front on the opening drive of the third quarter, taking a 17-13 lead on Sean Richardson's 5-yard run.

The Gamecocks kept Pitt State's high-powered offense in check in the second half.

The Gorillas mounted a late drive, but Jax State held PSU on downs at the Gamecocks 22 yard line in the waning seconds to seal the victory.

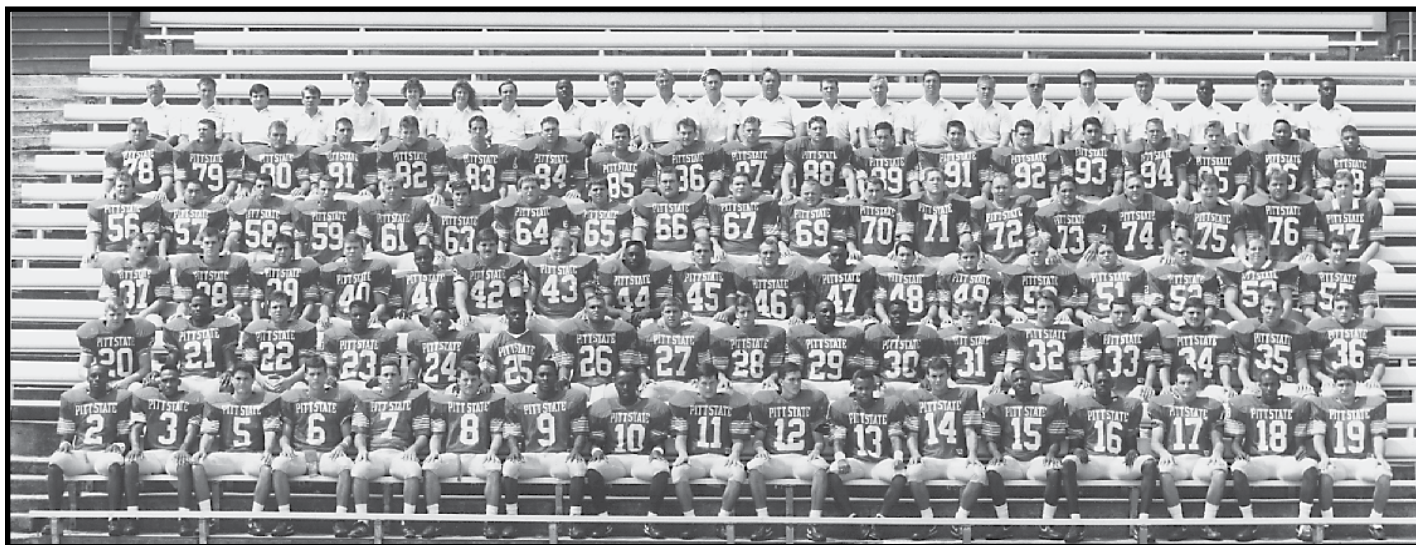
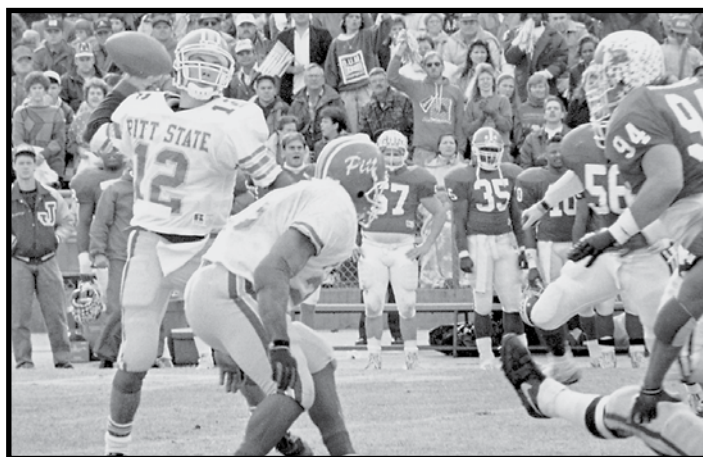

FLORENCE, Ala. — The University of North Alabama scored on its first offensive possession and stifled the Pittsburg State University offense to post a 27-7 victory and claim the 1995 NCAA Division II National Championship.

UNA (14-0) became the first Division II school to win the national title three years in a row, accomplishing the feat in front of its home crowd at Braly Stadium.

The Lions held PSU (12-1-1) to just 99 yards rushing and 176 yards of total offense for the game.

UNA built a 14-0 lead, then dealt PSU a damaging blow by adding a touchdown with five seconds left in the first half.

The Gorillas got on the board early in the fourth quarter when quarterback Jeff Moreland connected with Chris Hudson for a 15-yard scoring strike.

The Lions sealed the game when fullback Nate George capped a nine-play drive with a short plunge into the endzone with under a minute to play.

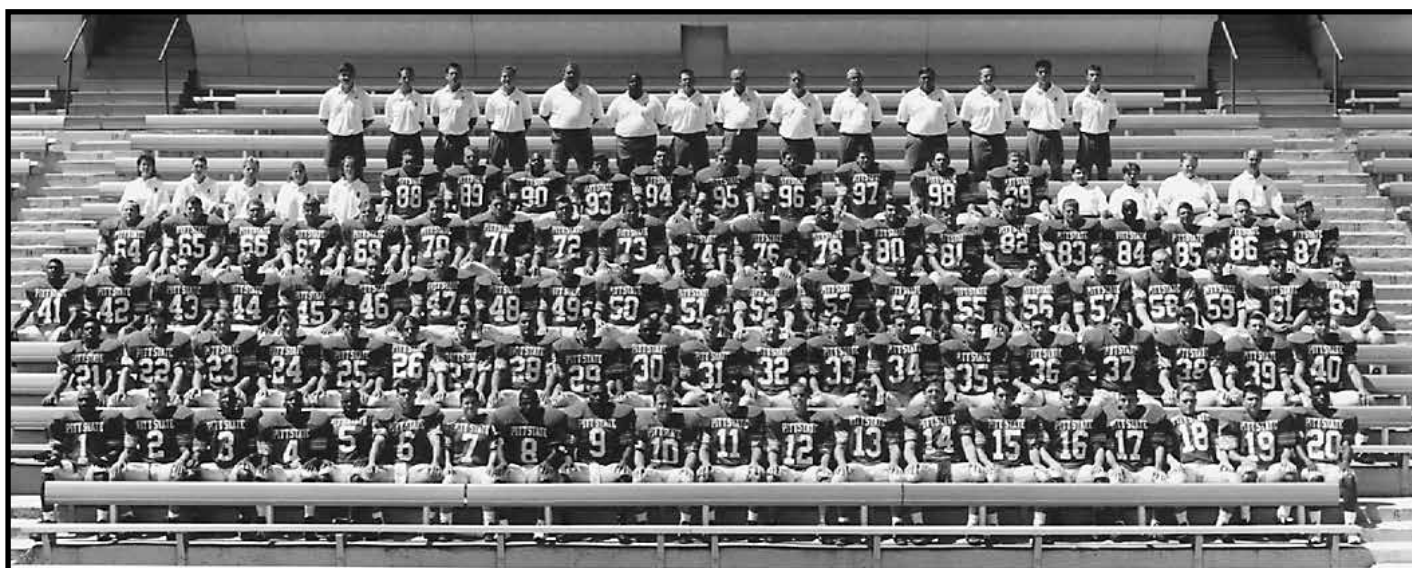

The Gorillas (14-1) jumped in front 14-0 on the Blazers (13-1), but were unable to shut the door on VSU.

Pitt State's Jimmie Taylor returned an interception 32 yards for a touchdown 56 seconds into the game, and Neal Philpot tossed a 10-yard TD pass to Jermaine Carpenter midway through the first period, staking the Gorillas to the double-digit lead.

The Blazers rallied to tie the game at 17-17 on Will Rhody's 27-yard field goal with three seconds remaining in the first half, and VSU scored 19 of the next 26 points in the second half to force the Gorillas to play from behind.

PSU's final offensive drive ended with an interception with 38 seconds remaining, allowing VSU to run out the clock.

FLORENCE, Ala. — Pitt State finished off a magical season with a 35-21 victory over Wayne (Mich.) State in the title game before a sea of crimson & gold clad fans that dominated the crowd.

Wayne State (12-4) returned the game's opening kickoff 93 yards for a touchdown 11 seconds into the game and the Warriors, led 14-10 with 13 seconds to play in the opening period.

Pitt State (13-1), like it has multiple times in the season, remained determined and undaunted. Chase McCoy booted a 34-yard field goal to trim the margin to 14-13 with 10:26 to play in the first half. Then, Pitt State swung the momentum of the contest when Paul Robinson blocked a Stefan Terleckyj field goal attempt and Aries Herrion scooped up the ball and returned it 80 yards for a go-ahead score.

Elijah Olabode sealed the victory for the Gorillas with an interception in the PSU end zone five players later — his second pick of the game — and the Gorillas hometown hero Dickey picked up a first down with a five-yard run, then clocked the ball three times for the victory.

Dickey completed 10 of 16 passes for 190 yards and rushed for a team-leading 68 yards on the ground. John Brown caught five passes for a game-high 99 yards for the Gorillas. Nate Dreiling made a game-high 15 tackles. Robinson had one of three Pitt State interceptions to go with his blocked field goal and Olabode finished the game with two interceptions.

GORILLA HISTORICAL TIDBITS

October 11, 1919

The Pittsburg "Normals" treated first-year head coach Garfield W. Weede to his first coaching victory in a 14-0 win against the Springfield "Normals".

In newspaper accounts afterward, Pittsburg players declared the game "disgraceful owing to the cursing and foul playing of the Springfield players."

Pittsburg's James "Jum" Hyndman was kicked in the head in the game, and, afterward, the Springfield coach refused to issue towels or warm showers to the Pittsburg players.



November 7, 1919

After dropping their first two games of the 1919 season, the Pittsburg "Normals" closed out the campaign with seven wins and a tie to post a 7-2-1 overall mark.

The lone blemish down the stretch — a 0-0 tie to Ottawa — forced the "Normals" to share the Kansas Intercollegiate Conference (KIAC) crown with the College of Emporia, a team Pittsburg did not meet on the '19 schedule.

In the Ottawa game on Nov. 9, the "Normals" "outplayed and outgained the Ottawa team by a wide margin", according to newspaper accounts, but Pittsburg failed to score.

On the "Normals" final drive, Hyndman rushed the ball to the Ottawa 2 yard line, but the timekeeper's whistle sounded before Pittsburg could run another play, leaving the game in a tie.

GORILLA HISTORICAL TIDBITS

November 27, 1924

Ottawa University pulled one of many Thanksgiving Day upsets recorded across the nation, as the Baptists held the Gorillas to a scoreless tie.

The blemish prevented Pittsburg from recording the school's first undefeated football season, but the Gorillas still claimed the outright Kansas Intercollegiate Conference (KIAC) title for head coach Garfield Weede.

The Gorillas, who punted 21 times in the game, misfired on a pair of field goal attempts — one each by Edward Stephenson and William Short.

Pittsburg also completed just 4 of 22 forward passes with three interceptions. The Baptist fared no better through the air, completing 3 of 14 passes with four interceptions.

Moriconi's 67-yard touchdown run just minutes into the game started the Gorillas' shutout campaign.

October 6, 1934

"Blue" Howell's eleven post an impressive 18-13 victory over Washburn at Topeka to start the 1934 season 3-0.

The Gorillas defeat the Ichabods, considered an early favorite for the CIC crown, one week after Washburn played the touted Army squad to a 19-0 decision at West Point.

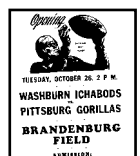
November 25, 1943

The Pittsburg Teachers College squad, comprised mostly of former football stars from Texas colleges in Navy training, completed the 1943 season with an unblemished 6-0-0 record, following a 32-6 victory over William Jewell College at Liberty, Mo.

The Gorillas are one of just nine college teams nationwide to post undefeated marks that season.

In the finale against the Cardinals, Pittsburg guard Donald Stegge staked Pittsburg to a 7-0 lead after he recovered one of three Cal Purdin fumbles in the William Jewell end zone for a touchdown.

The Gorillas defeated Omaha, 34 to 18, before an overflow crowd (estimated at 10,000 fans) in Brandenburg Stadium and finished the regular season undefeated and untied champions of the Central Intercollegiate Conference.

President Leonard H. Axe declared the holiday from classes in an announcement at the game, and students observed the occasion with a pep rally at noon and a parade and dance in the afternoon..."

The Gorillas, the No. 1-ranked team in the NAIA, went on to defeat Northern State, S.D., 28-14, then downed Linfield, Ore., 12-7, to claim the national title.

In a scheduling oddity, Pittsburg State plays and defeats Emporia State twice in three weeks during the 1976 regular season.

On Oct. 16, the Gorillas post a 40-27 victory over the Hornets at Emporia. Running back Rex Garner fuels the PSU offense, rushing for a career-high 192 yards. He scores four times, on runs of 13, 6, 2 and 69 yards.

Bob Long added another 121 ground yards as PSU picks up its first CSIC victory of the season for first-year head coach Ron Randleman.

On Oct. 30, the Gorillas blank the Hornets, 30-0, at Brandenburg Stadium. Garner rushes for 112 yards in two quarters of action, before giving way to PSU reserves.

GORILLA HISTORICAL TIDBITS

Oct. 11 / Dec. 6, 1986

On October 11, 1986, at Topeka, the No. 1-ranked Gorillas overcame the muck of a rain-soaked Moore Bowl field to post a 21-7 victory over Washburn University.

WU quarterback Jim Bernard, in post-game comments, uttered this statement in summing up the day's game: "We would have kicked their butts on a dry field."

Eight weeks later, on December 6, 1986, his Ichabod squad was afforded the opportunity to atone for their regular season loss to the Gorillas in the first round of the NAIA playoffs at Brandenburg Stadium.

WU jumped out to a 10-0 lead in the game, but PSU charged back with 17 points before the half, and the Gorillas rolled to a 58-24 romp — on a dry field.

GORILLA HISTORICAL TIDBITS

November 28, 1992

Top-ranked Pittsburg State and No. 2-ranked North Dakota State meet in the NCAA-II quarterfinals at Brandenburg Field/Carnie Smith Stadium.

The Gorillas, the defending NCAA-II champions, erase an 11-point deficit in the game's final 10:23 to send the game into overtime. PSU's Jeff Wood boots a 39-yard field goal with 2 seconds remaining in regulation to knot the score at 31. Ronald Moore, who would go on to claim the 1992 Harlon Hill Trophy, scored his fifth touchdown of the game on a 1-yard run in OT. NDSU also scores on their OT possession — on a 26-yard pass from Arden Beachy to Craig Geren.

Bison head coach Rocky Hager calls timeout and elects to go for a game-winning 2-point conversion. The Gorillas stuff the play, but are flagged for a facemasking penalty.

NDSU runs a second 2-point play from inside the PSU 2. This time, PSU's Jerry Paul Boone registers "The Stop", bringing NDSU's Mark Hansen down inches short of the goal line to send the Gorillas into the NCAA-II semifinals.

In 1997, the PSU-NDSU game is voted the Top Game of the Quarter Century, celebrating the 25th Anniversary of Division II Football.
