UAB Soccer - Building a Tradition

Head Coach Mike Getman has led UAB to 12 consecutive winning seasons. During this time the Blazers have won three Conference Championships and have been nationally ranked in each of the past nine seasons. During this time the team has a record of 159-86-17 and Coach Getman has been named Conference Coach of the Year three times.

The 2004 season saw the Blazers capture both the regular season and postseason tournament runners-up finishes in Conference USA. The Blazers also reached the 10-win plateau for the 10th time in the last 11 seasons and reached the C-USA tournament for the 10th straight year.

The Blazers had three straight NCAA Tournament teams under Getman from 1999-2001. The '99 campaign was arguable the best season during Getman's tenure, as the Blazers reached the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament.

The 2005 season should be the most exciting to date. With a new-look Conference USA which features national powers Tulsa and SMU along with nationally prominent programs in Kentucky, South Carolina, Marshall, UFC and Florida International. The 2005 schedule features home matches against national power UNC Greensboro and C-USA rivals East Carolina, Souther Carolina, UCF, Florida International, defending league champion Memphis and an exhibition match against ACC power Clemson. With all but three letter-winners and two starters returning from a year ago, expectations are very high within the team.

Evident of the great strides the UAB soccer program has made, even the national media is picking up on what this team has been doing:

"When Mike Getman arrived in Birmingham... it was merely a question of time before the Blazers would be thrust into the national spotlight." (*The New York Times*)

"...Coach Mike Getman has turned around the program at the University of Alabama at Birmingham, where the Blazers
