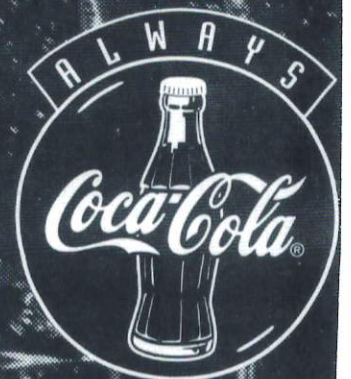

2002-2003 SEASON PREVIEW

The Spring Hill Basketball Team looks to the future under new head coach Tom Kenna. Coach Kenna inherits a program that has won twenty or more games in ten of the past eleven seasons, four straight NAIA National Tournament appearances, and two GCAC Championships in the past three years. With Coach Kenna at the helm, expect success to continue.

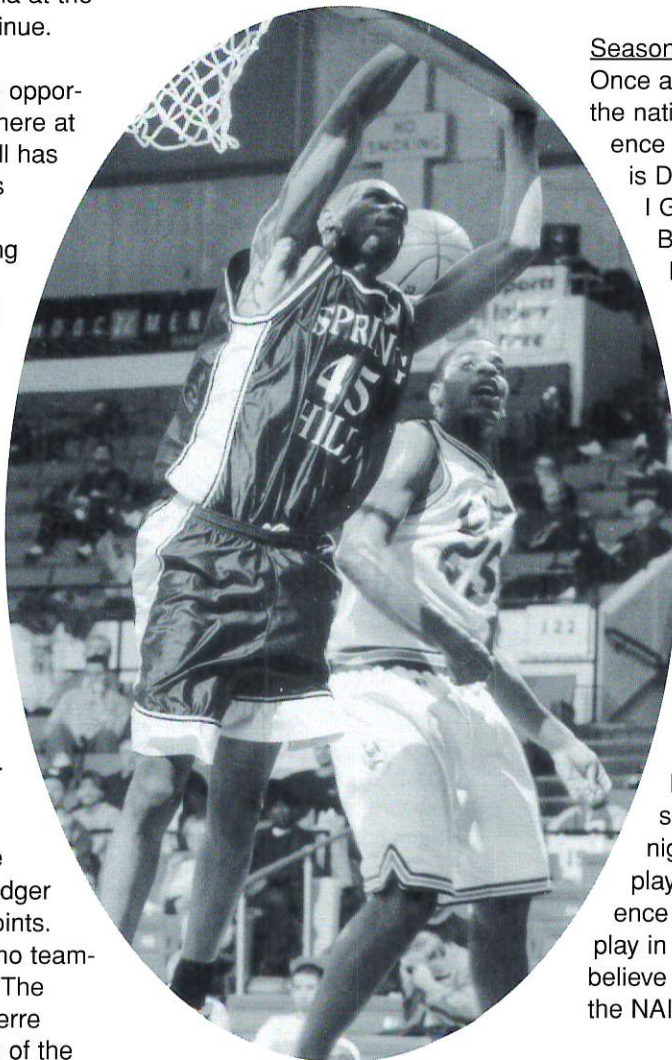
"I'm really excited to have the opportunity to be the Head Coach here at Spring Hill College. Spring Hill has a great tradition of academics and basketball. I believe that with the talent we have coming back combined with several new comers, Badger fans will enjoy the upcoming season."

Returning Players

This season the Badgers return seven players from a squad that went 26-7, earned a GCAC Title, and advanced to the NAIA National Tournament. The team's top two returning players are 6'5" senior forward Shawn McKee and 6'2" junior guard Pierre Du Ventre. McKee has lead the team in scoring two of the past three seasons. This past season he became the 27th player in Badger history to score over 1,000 points. Du Ventre is a rising guard who teammates affectionately dubbed "The Future" of SHC basketball. Pierre started the last eleven games of the season, including the Conference and National tournaments. Over the past two seasons, Pierre has shot an outstanding 47% from the three-point line.

Other key returning players include 6'1" Lucas Picarelli, 5'11" Nate Williams, 6'4" Courtney Bloom, 6'5" Nick Long, and 6'9" Casey Johnson. Picarelli is an extremely talented point guard who has excellent court vision. Williams, a combo guard, is the

team's best defensive player. Long, a wing player, has excellent shooting range and deceptive athleticism. Johnson, a very skilled center, has excellent post moves and a shooting touch that reaches out beyond the arc.



As the lone senior on the team, Shawn McKee will be the team leader this year for the Badgers.

New Comers

This year the recruiting class could potentially be the best Spring Hill College has ever seen. It includes transfer Matt Forget, as well as two outstanding freshmen, Chris Baldwin, and Bobby Cole. Forget, a 7'0" NCAA Div. I transfer, is a skilled big man that could see immediate

playing time. Baldwin, a 6'5" wing player, brings athleticism and a scorers mentality to the program. And wrapping up the 2002 recruiting class is Bobby Cole, a 6'5" guard, with a 6'10" wing span. Cole can do a little bit of everything: rebounding, shooting, and creating shots off the dribble.

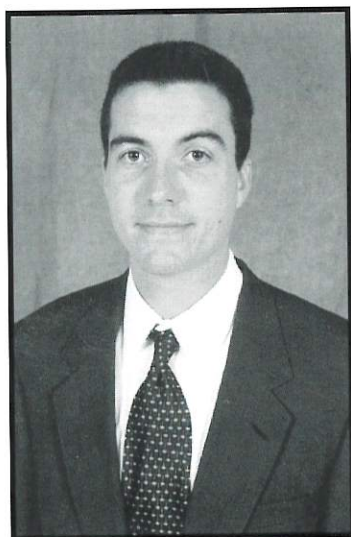
Season

Once again, the Badgers play one of the nation's most difficult non-conference schedules. The highlight game is December 16 at NCAA Division I Georgia Southern. The Badgers also face NCAA Division II Nyack College and 1999-2000 NAIA Division II champions Embry-Riddle. The Badgers also play against many other tough NAIA opponents. Along with these games the Badgers face an always challenging Gulf Coast Athletic Conference schedule. Coach Kenna says, "Our non-conference schedule is the toughest since I have been here. We have no scheduled wins. Every game will be a challenge for us. However, I am sure we will be ready to play night in and night out. Plus, playing this difficult non-conference schedule will get us ready to play in the GCAC, which many believe is the toughest conference in the NAIA."

The Last Word

"The 2002-2003 season will be a great one!! We have a great nucleus of guys coming back plus five newcomers that could see immediate playing time. We may have lost some key players, but I truly believe we have the talent to win another GCAC title and earn a trip to the NAIA National Tournament," says coach Kenna.

HEAD COACH TOM KENNA



Tom Kenna begins his first season as the new head basketball coach after serving as an assistant coach for the Badgers for three seasons, from 1999-2002, under former head coach Bill Carr. Kenna is the 12th coach in Badger history and takes over a program that has won twenty or more games in ten of the past eleven years. The Badgers have also advanced to the NAIA National Tournament the previous four years. Kenna will be looking to continue the success that the Badgers have had in the past.

Before joining the Spring Hill coaching staff in 1999, Coach Kenna was an assistant coach at his alma mater St. Thomas University, in Opa Locka, Florida. While at St. Thomas, Kenna helped lead the team to two consecutive conference championship appearances. As a player at St. Thomas, Kenna helped lead St. Thomas to a NAIA Division II National Tournament appearance in 1997.

As the lead assistant at Spring Hill, Coach Kenna helped manage the team's travel and assisted in offensive and defensive strategy. He also earned a reputation as a top notch recruiter. Over the past three seasons he helped sign one all-district, two all-state, and four all-county players. Most noteworthy were two starters for the 2001-2002 season. Kenna's first recruiting class as the head coach includes a 7'0" Division I transfer and three players that scored over fifteen hundred points each throughout their high school careers.

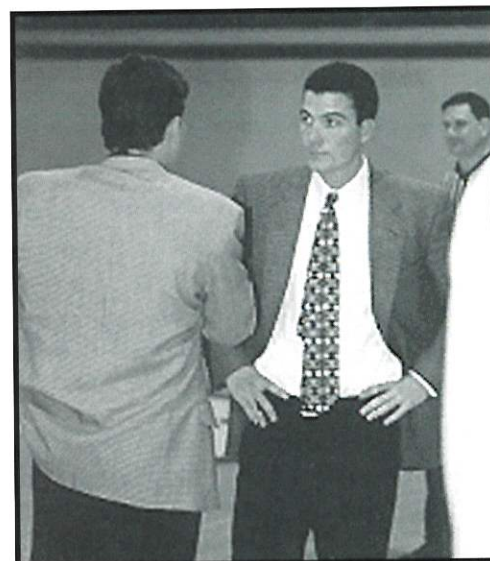
Coach Tom Kenna received his Bachelors degree in Sports Administration in 1997 and his MBA in 1998.

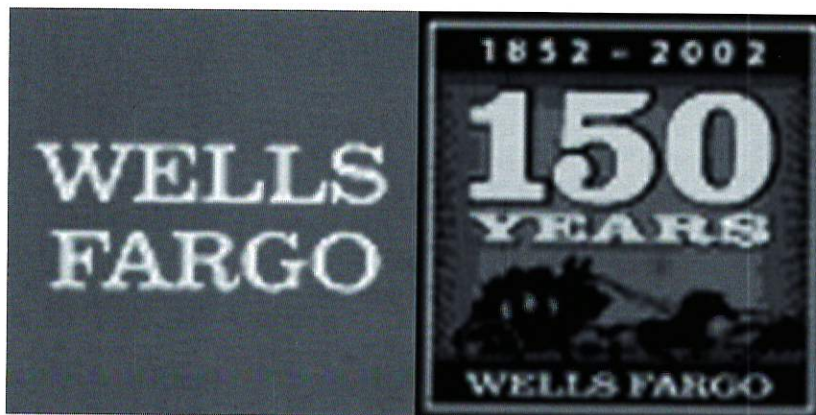
ASSISTANT COACH - MARCUS CASTER • First Season

Coach Marcus Caster begins his first season as Spring Hill College assistant coach, and will be helping Coach Kenna with continuing the success that the Badgers have had. A native of the Mount Vernon, AL, he attended Citronelle High School and the University of Mobile.

At the University of Mobile, Coach Caster was a four-year letterman in basketball. He was on teams ranked in the top 10 in the NAIA 3 years out of four. In the 1994-95 season, he was selected as defensive player of the year. He tied a record for most rebounds in a single game, ranked in the top five in field goal percentage, and in the top ten for rebounds.

Coach Caster is currently employed as an Information Specialist with the Drug Education Council Inc. Also, he is a Certified Prevention Specialist. He is married to Latunja Renee and has two children, son Peyton Marcus and daughter Mackenzy Ellis. He received his B.S. from the University of Mobile, in Sports Medicine, in May of 1998.

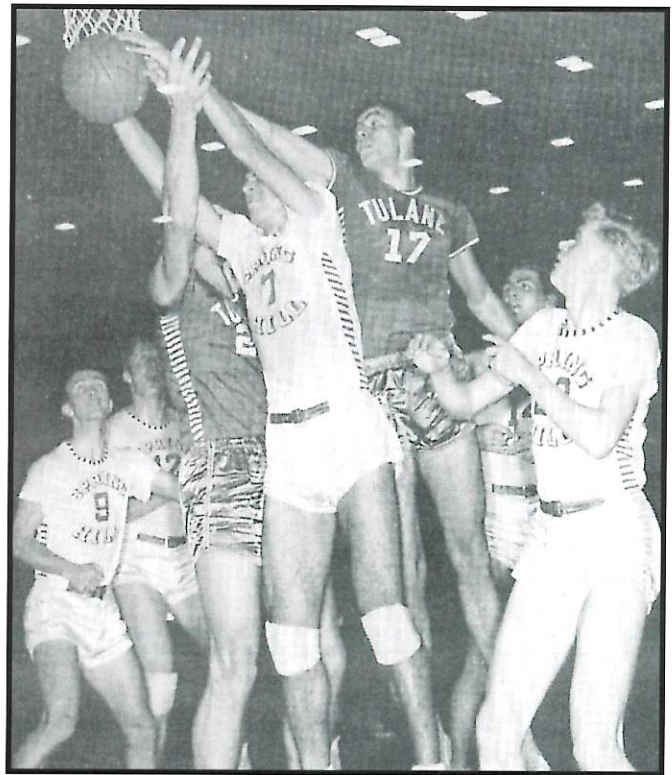

The NAIA – Providing Balanced Athletics Programs for 47,000 Student-Athletes

Throughout its history, the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) has provided strong leadership for all aspects of intercollegiate sports: Since its introduction of intercollegiate championship basketball in 1937, the NAIA has maintained the highest standards while administering first-rate athletics programs.

Time and time again, the NAIA has stepped forward to address the important issues of the day — be it racial integration in the '40s and '50s or establishing the first women's championship program in 1980. The NAIA has not been afraid to enact changes while others have watched and waited.

In the past decade, presidents of the NAIA colleges and universities have assumed a position of responsible leadership. The NAIA's Council of Presidents, the organization's primary governing body, is comprised of 35 college and university presidents from all regions of the United States.

With its major emphasis on education and character development, it was natural for the NAIA to further strengthen academic eligibility requirements in the mid-'80s. All NAIA participating student-athletes must maintain a 2.0 grade-point-average (GPA) while accumulating credit hours for a declared academic degree. Unlike other associations, NAIA student-athlete academic eligibility is monitored on a term-by-term basis.

The All-America Scholar-Athlete program, a long-standing NAIA tradition, recognizes junior and senior student-athletes with a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.5 (on a 4.0 scale).

During the '90s, the waves of change once again washed over the NAIA. The membership voted to institute affiliated conference and regional groupings and discontinue the use of district play as a means of qualification for national championships, marking the first time since the NAIA's creation that district competition would not be used.

Since 1937, the NAIA has administered programs and championships in proper balance with the overall educational experience. In 2000, the NAIA reaffirmed its purpose to enhance the character-building aspects of sport. Through Champions of Character, the NAIA seeks to create an environment in which every student-athlete, coach, official and spectator is committed to the true spirit of competition through five tenets: respect, integrity, responsibility, servant leadership and sportsmanship. This program will educate and create awareness of the positive character-building traits afforded by sports and return integrity to competition at the collegiate and youth levels while impacting all of society.

ARTHUR OUTLAW RECREATION CENTER

After nearly six decades of traveling, the Spring Hill College basketball programs finally had a place to call home. Opened to the campus in June 1997, the \$7.3 million Arthur R. Outlaw Student Recreation Center is a state-of-the-art recreational facility utilized by the students, faculty and staff of Spring Hill.

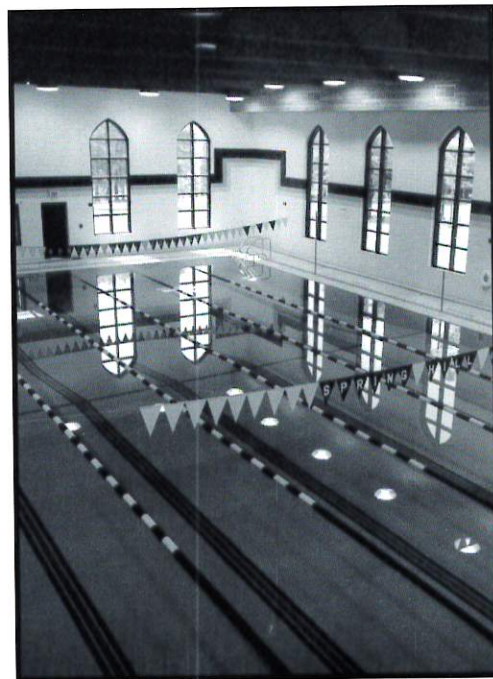
"Home" has been sweet for the Badgers as the men and women have posted a combined record of 102-39 record in the Outlaw Center, which includes a 65-7 record for the men.

The facility includes a modern weight room complete with free weights, station training and cardiovascular equipment. This equipment was graciously donated by John Burke ('63).



Also included in the facility is a six-lane, 25-yard swimming pool, two raquetball courts, a dance/aerobics studio, as well as locker room and training facilities for students and staff. Athletic Department offices and a Hall of Fame room for special receptions is housed on the upper level.

The centerpiece of the facility is the 2,000-seat gymnasium. The facility is the home for the men's and women's basketball teams, the volleyball team and campus intramural programs. During the off season, the gymnasium's ideal size and proximity to the center of campus make it a great place to hold other campus events and activities.

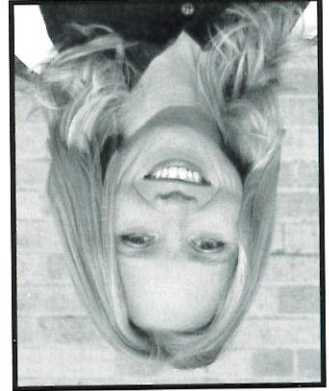

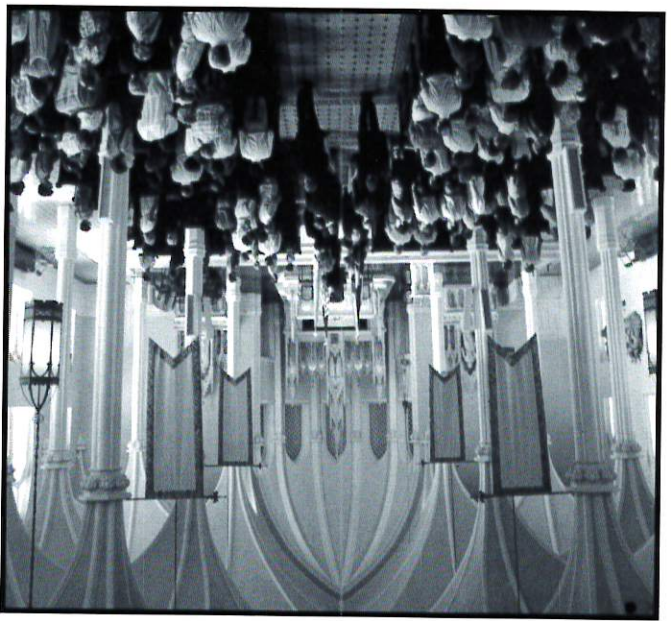

The Cloister offers quick meals on the go, while the Golf Shop provides a menu of sandwiches, snacks and beverages.

CLUBS AND ORGANIZATIONS

More than 50 clubs and organizations are available for student involvement outside of class and athletics. RESIDENCE HALLS

As a Spring Hill student, you are provided four-year guaranteed housing in campus residence halls and 65 percent of the total student body live on campus. There are seven residence halls. Each residence hall has a Resident Assistant (R.A.) who is an upperclass student selected on the basis of his/her leadership ability and concern for fellow students. Washington, D.C. Additionally, Fr. Lucy served as rector for the Jesuit Community at Marquette University and vice president for development at Seattle University. He received a Ph.D. in educational administration from the University of Wisconsin at Madison, an M.A. in liturgy from the University of Notre Dame, as well as undergraduate and graduate degrees in philosophy from St. Louis University.

A Wisconsin native, Fr. Lucy entered the Society of Jesus in 1951 after graduating high school at the Canpton School, an all-male boarding school in Wisconsin, and was ordained in 1964. 2001 marks his Golden Jubilee, or 50th year, as a Jesuit.

His older brother, Roger, is also a Jesuit priest, while another brother, Pat, served as Governor of Wisconsin in the 1970s and was the vice presidential running mate to independent candidate John Anderson in the 1980 U.S. Presidential election.

Fr. Lucy founded and served as director of Marquette's Center for Ignatian Spirituality and in 1995, he attended the 34th General Congregation of the Society of Jesus as one of 200 delegates worldwide.

Since becoming the 37th president at Spring Hill College on June 1, 1997, Fr. Gregory F. Lucy's leadership has made a significant impact on the College. With a "Vision for the College on the Hill," Fr. Lucy set into motion plans that have resulted in record enrollment, development of a comprehensive Campus Master Plan, and construction of a new residence hall. He has made academics and technology priorities for the College; enhancing programs and investing in faculty, while wiring each residence hall for Internet access.

Under Fr. Lucy's direction, Spring Hill College has enjoyed record fund-raising years, including a \$3 million gift in 1998 from former Mobile Mayor and College alumnus Arthur R. Outlaw. Throughout his time at the College, Fr. Lucy's goal has been to enrich the Spring Hill Experience for every student while making the 171-year old institution a premier, small, residential, Catholic liberal arts college in the Jesuit tradition.

Prior to Spring Hill, Fr. Lucy served as president and chairman of the board of the National Jesuit Conference based in

Because of the small classes, averaging 17 undergraduates per class, the students form close bonds - partnerships with each other as well as with Spring Hill's faculty and staff. The Spring Hill community takes the time and makes the effort to form caring, enduring relationships.

This concern for the individual person, what the Jesuits traditionally have called *cura personalis*, is a fundamental characteristic of the College community. This personalized care allows each student to develop individually while sharing in the ideals of the Spring Hill community.

Enrollment is 1,000 students, 65% women, 18% minority and 70% from out of state. The campus is located in the heart of Mobile on 300-acres of greenery, including an 18-hole golf course. There are two 15-week semesters (fall and spring); two 2-week sessions following the spring; and one 6-week summer session.
