The 2022 U20 World Wrestling Championships will be held over seven days at the Arena Armeec Sport Hall in Sofia, Bulgaria, with 30 weight classes across three styles competing—10 weights in each of the disciplines: Greco-Roman, women's freestyle and men's freestyle.

The event starts with men's freestyle competition Aug. 15-17, women's freestyle action Aug. 17-19 and Greco-Roman wrestling Aug. 19-21. Medal matches will take place Aug. 16-21.

Draws for each day's competition will be released the day prior.

Interviews with athletes and teams must be organized by USA Wrestling Communications Manager Taylor Gregorio.

MEN'S FREESTYLE PREVIEW

Team USA is sending a promising men's freestyle roster to the U20 World Championships in Sofia, Bulgaria. The tournament kicks off with men's freestyle competition, Aug. 15-17. Fans can watch all the action live on FloWrestling.

Leading the squad is Alex Facundo, a 2018 and 2019 U17 World bronze medalist, who will be competing at 74 kg. This will be his third age-group World Championships. Facundo, a redshirt freshman at Penn State, also has a U20 Pan American gold medal on his resume from earlier this year. Domestically, he has been a threat for several years, winning back-to-back folkstyle national championships in 2018 and 2019 and winning the U20 Nationals at the 2022 U.S. Open.

Another World Championships veteran joining Facundo is Nic Bouzakis, who wrestled Greco-Roman at last year's U20 Worlds, where he finished eighth. He will be representing the U.S. in freestyle at 61 kg in Sofia. An incoming freshman at Ohio State, Bouzakis is also a 2022 Pan Am champion and U20 Nationals champion.

Five other U20 Pan American gold medalists fill out the roster, including Vine Cornella (65 kg), Mitchell Mesenbrink (70 kg), Jaxon Smith (92 kg), Ben Kueter (97 kg) and Nicholas Feldman (125 kg). All five athletes bring impressive domestic credentials, winning their brackets at the 2022 U.S. Open.

Committed to wrestle at California Baptist, Mesenbrink owns three other major national titles, including 2021 National High School Recruiting Showcase champion, 2019 Preseason Nationals champion and 2019 16U Folkstyle Nationals champion. He was also a 16U freestyle All-American at Fargo in 2019.

Kueter, who has committed to the University of Iowa for wrestling and football, was a 2021 Folkstyle Nationals champion and notched a runner-up finish at the USMC Junior Freestyle Nationals later that year. He also had top-four performances at the 2019 UWW U17 Freestyle Nationals and 2019 UWW U15 Freestyle Nationals.

Ohio State wrestler Feldman earned the 16U Greco-Roman Fargo title in 2019 and placed third in freestyle at that same tournament.

Cornella, an incoming freshman at Cornell, was fourth at the Bill Farrell Memorial in April, and Smith, a red-shirt freshman at the University of Maryland, earned All-American status at the 2018 16U Fargo national tournament.

Rounding out the lineup is Jore Volk at 57 kg, Brayden Thompson at 79 kg and Bennett Berge at 86 kg.

University of Wyoming wrestler Volk is a four-time 16U Fargo All-American, turning in championship performances in freestyle and Greco-Roman in 2019. Additionally, he placed top-eight in the Junior freestyle division at that same tournament.

Thompson, an Oklahoma State commit, holds two Preseason Nationals titles from 2019 and 2020 as well as runner-up performances at 2021 USMC Junior Nationals and the 2021 National High School Recruiting Showcase.

Slated to wrestle at South Dakota State, Berge was a 2019 USMC 16U Freestyle Nationals champion and a 2021 Junior Freestyle Nationals All-American.

The team will be led by a group of talented coaches, including U.S. Men's Freestyle Development Coach James Green and assigned coaches Kerry McCoy and Logan Stieber as well as several personal coaches.

Opening the tournament is Volk, Cornella, Mesenbrink, Thompson and Kueter on Aug. 15 with Bouzakis, Facundo, Berge, Smith and Feldman beginning their competition on Aug. 16.

WOMEN'S FREESTYLE PREVIEW

USA Wrestling is sending a group of experienced women's freestyle wrestlers to the U20 World Championships in Sofia, Bulgaria. Women's freestyle competition is set for Aug. 17-19. Fans can watch all the action live on FloWrestling.

Headlining the lineup are previous age-group World champions Katie Gomez at 53 kg, Destiny Rodriguez at 68 kg and Amit Elor at 72 kg.

Elor brings the most international experience to the group, winning U17 and U20 World gold medals last year as well as a 2019 U17 World bronze medal and 2018 U15 Pan American title. She seeks to become the first two-time U20 World champ in women's freestyle since Victoria Anthony in 2009-10. She will also be representing the United States at the Senior World Championships in September and U23 World Championships in October.

Gomez enters Bulgaria in search of her second-straight World gold medal after claiming a U17 World title in 2021. A U15 Pan Am champion, Gomez has impressed domestically, collecting National High School Recruiting Showcase and Who's Number One championships in addition to two All-American finishes at Fargo.

2019 U15 World champion Rodriguez returns to the world stage in Sofia. Also a 2018 U15 Pan Am champion, Rodriguez was this year's National High School Recruiting Showcase champion and owns two Fargo national titles.

There are two other World medalists in the mix. At 50 kg, Audrey Jimenez will compete in her second World Championships of the summer. In late July, Jimenez represented the U.S. at the U17 Worlds, where she went 0-1. However, she has already proved herself internationally as she earned a bronze medal at the 2021 U17 Worlds and has a U15 Pan Am gold medal to her name.

Reese Larramendy will suit up for the Red, White and Blue at 65 kg. In 2019, she made her first impression at the world level with a U15 World silver. Most recently, Larramendy, who will be a part of the historic University of Iowa women's wrestling team, grabbed a bronze medal at the Grand Prix of Spain in July.

Three athletes, Adriana Dorado Marin (55 kg), SaVannah Cosme (59 kg) and Tristan Kelly (76 kg), will compete at their second-career World Championships.

Dorado-Marin, an Army WCAP athlete, took 13th at the 2019 U17 Worlds. This year, she won the Senior division of the U.S. Open and added a bronze medal from the Grand Prix of Spain. Cosme competed at the 2021 U17 Worlds, where she finished 16th. A Colorado native, Cosme is a 2019 U15 Pan Am silver medalist and a 2022 Grand Prix of Spain bronze medalist. Kelly, also a WCAP wrestler, finished 16th at the U17 Worlds in 2018. Kelly has perhaps one of the strongest domestic resumes with two Fargo titles and two top-five Senior finishes. She is also a 2019 U17 Pan Am champ and 2017 U17 Pan Am silver medalist.

Completing the lineup is Sofia Macaluso and Aduago Nwachukwu, who will make their World Championships debuts in Bulgaria.

2022 Tricia Saunders High School Excellence Award winner Macaluso will wrestle at 57 kg. She is a two-time Folkstyle Nationals champion and 2021 Junior Fargo runner-up.

Wrestling at 62 kg, Nwachukwu has had a successful year, winning the NAIA Women's National Invitational for Iowa Wesleyan College and taking third at the U.S. Open in the Senior division.

The team will be led by a group of talented coaches, including U.S. Women's Freestyle Development Coach Jessica Medina Bunker and assigned coaches Emma Randall and Alli Ragan as well as several personal coaches.

Opening the tournament is Jimenez, Dorado-Marin, Cosme, Rodriguez and Kelly on Aug. 17 with Gomez, Macaluso, Nwachukwu, Larramendy and Elor beginning their competition on Aug. 18.

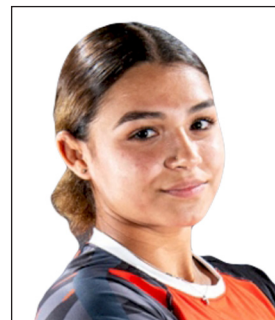

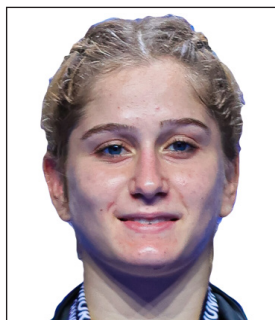

GRECO-ROMAN PREVIEW

Team USA is sending a young, talented Greco-Roman team to the U20 World Championships in Sofia, Bulgaria. The tournament wraps up with Greco-Roman competition, Aug. 19-21. Fans can watch all the action live on FloWrestling.

Heading up the squad are past World Team members Robert Perez III and Kodiak Stephens.

Wrestling at 87 kg, Stephens is entering his second-consecutive U20 World Championships. Last summer, he finished 20th. Since then, he's claimed a 2022 U20 Pan American gold medal and a 2021 Junior Pan Am Games silver medal. Domestically, he won the U20 division of the U.S. Open.

Perez, who will compete at 67 kg, represented the United States at the 2019 U17 World Championships, taking 13th. In his young career, Perez has collected four international medals, including a double-gold performance at the U17 Pan American Championships, winning freestyle and Greco-Roman. He also secured silver at the 2022 U20 Pan Ams as well as a bronze at this year's Bill Farrell Memorial.

Two athletes have made a name for themselves domestically on the Senior-level.

Payton Jacobson, the U.S. rep at 77 kg, earned a spot on this year's Senior National Team and finished third at the Senior U.S. Open. Additionally, he is a two-time U20 Pan American silver medalist.

At 60 kg, Max Black took second at the Senior U.S. Open and in that same week, won the U20 division. He was also fourth at the 2022 Senior World Team Trials. Internationally, Black has a U20 Pan Am bronze medal from earlier this year.

Three other Pan American medalists are expected to compete for the USA.

Richard Fedalen won silver at the 2021 U20 Pan Ams and one year later improved on his performance with a gold medal. He'll compete at 72 kg in Bulgaria.

Similarly, Utah Valley wrestler Haiden Drury (63 kg) earned silver in 2019 and went on to score gold at this year's Pan Am Championships. Drury is a two-time

Fargo champion in Greco-Roman, once at 16U and once at the Junior division.

Heavyweight Aden Attao has been busy this season. After claiming the title at the U20 Nationals, Attao went on to win gold at the U20 Pan Ams and shortly after secured the coveted USA Wrestling Triple Crown by winning national titles in folkstyle, freestyle and Greco-Roman.

Rounding out the roster is Jonathan Gurule at 55 kg, Adrian Artsisheuskiy at 82 kg and Christian Carroll at 97 kg. Gurule is a two-time Fargo All-American, who took third at the U.S. Open in the U20 division. Artsisheuskiy produced a runner-up finish at the U20 U.S. Open and turned in a first-place showing at the 2022 Senior World Team Trials Last Chance Qualifier. Carroll has a 2021 Junior Fargo title on his resume and was second at the 2021 U20 World Team Trials in both styles.

The team will be led by a group of talented coaches, including assigned coaches Zac Dominguez and Mohamed Abdelfattah as well as several personal coaches.

Opening the tournament is Gurule, Drury, Jacobson, Stephens and Attao on Aug. 19 with Black, Fedalen, Perez, Artsisheuskiy and Carroll beginning their competition on Aug. 20.

Ultimately, the USA ran away with the team title in an historic performance, beating second-place India by 64 points.



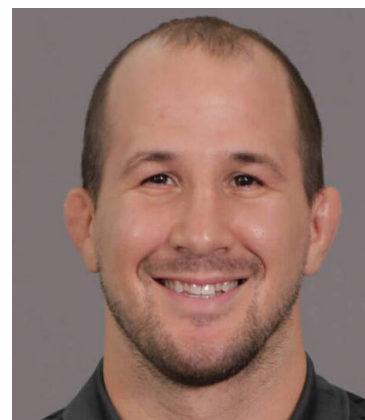
