OFFICIAL NAME:	New Holland Canadian Junior Men's and Women's Curling Championships
DATE/SITE:	March 25 - April 1, 2022 - Stratford Rotary Complex, Stratford, Ont.
FORMAT:	<p>Eighteen teams are competing in each gender with 14 Member Association teams, one host team and three teams based on two-year rolling berth spots. If a Member Association does not send a team, its spot is filled by the next highest qualified team on the two-year rolling berth spots.</p> <p>The teams are separated into two pools of nine teams and seeded by MA Cup standings from the 2019 and 2020 junior championships. Seeds 1, 4, 5, 8, 9, 12, 13, 16 and 17 are in Pool A; seeds 2, 3, 6, 7, 10, 11, 14, 15 and 18 are in Pool B.</p> <p>The teams play an eight-game round robin within each pool. At the conclusion of the round robin the top three teams in each pool advance to the playoffs. Tiebreaker games will not be played.</p> <p>The first-place teams in each pool receive a bye into the semifinals and the second- and third-placed teams cross over to play against each other (2A vs. 3B; 2B vs. 3A). The winners of the cross-over games advance to the semifinals. The winner of the semifinals advance to the gold-medal game and the losers will play in the bronze-medal game.</p>

WINNERS EARN:	Berth into the 2023 World Junior Curling Championships as Team Canada (location, dates TBD)
HOW TEAMS QUALIFIED:	<p>Teams qualified through one of 14 provincial/territorial championships hosted across the country by their respective Member Associations.</p> <p>As host province, Ontario selected an additional men's and women's team to compete as Ontario 2.</p> <p>In the women's event Nunavut did not send a team, meaning there were four additional spots to be awarded based on two-year rolling berths. The teams are: Alberta 2, Nova Scotia 2, Manitoba 2 and Quebec 2.</p> <p>In the men's event, Nunavut and Yukon did not send teams, meaning there were five additional spots to be awarded based on two-year rolling berths. The teams are: Saskatchewan 2, Manitoba 2, Newfoundland & Labrador 2, British Columbia 2 and Alberta 2.</p>

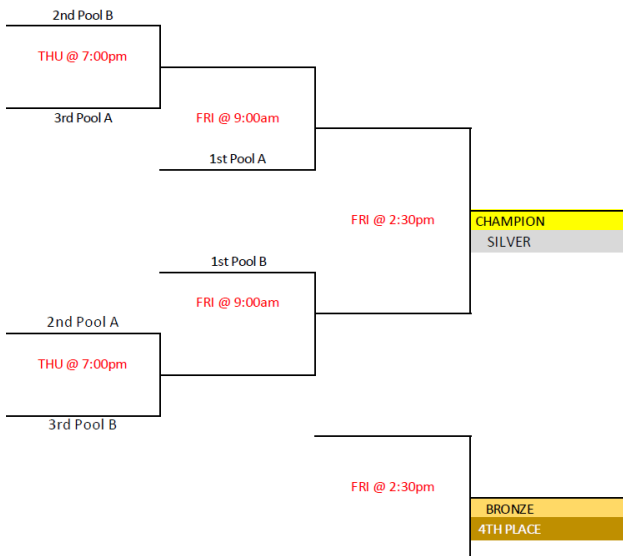

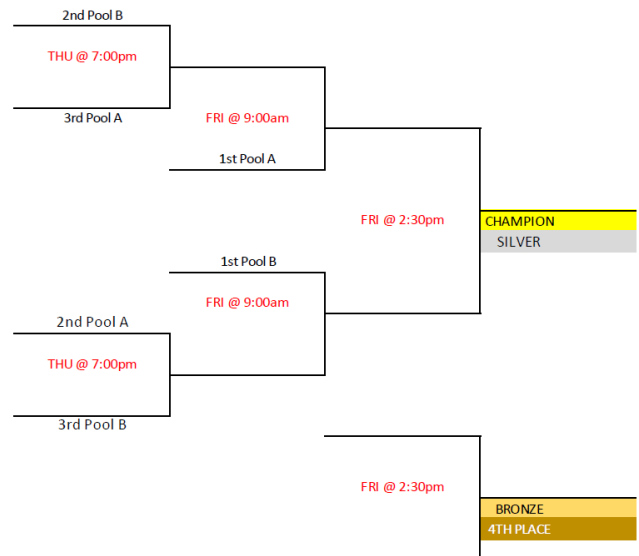
