Staff create a positive climate for learning in which everyone wants to learn. They inspire students to be curious about their studies, reach their potential and be ambitious for themselves and their futures.



FACILITIES

TO MEET THE ACADEMIC, SPORTING AND CREATIVE NEEDS OF OUR STUDENTS

At The King John school, we are determined to provide a quality education for all. Staff have high expectations of their students and themselves. They give willingly of their time and make use of high-quality resources to ensure the best outcomes for students. As such, we take great care of our school site. We are continually improving and developing our facilities to support our wide-ranging curriculum and extra-curricular provision, in order to meet the academic, sporting and creative needs of our students.

Our school offers the following state-of-the-art facilities:

- A purpose-built assembly hall with tiered seating for 350, plus professional light and sound systems
- A traditional school theatre space seating 300
- A well-stocked Learning Resource Centre with reading and computer facilities
- A modern, purpose-built sixth form centre with a well-equipped common room and extensive private study area
- A hair and beauty salon
- A purpose-built humanities block with eight classrooms and a conference room
- A sports hall catering for football, hockey, basketball, volleyball, netball and badminton
- An FA-approved and registered, floodlit 3G multi-use games area;
- Two high level competition netball courts
- A fitness suite with running and rowing machines and a free weight area;
- External playing fields for football, rugby and athletics
- A dance studio
- Well-resourced science and design technology suites
- Fully equipped IT rooms
- An inviting dining hall and servery offering a delicious selection of hot and cold food
- A fully resourced drama studio with lighting and audio systems
- Three playground areas with seating areas.

Students can access the school and its facilities before and after the formal day and are often found in our Learning Resource Centre, which is open between 8am and 4.30pm or using our extensive sporting facilities.

A broad, balanced and well-taught curriculum, as well as our extensive extra-curricular provision, enable students to make strong progress and to maximise their potential, regardless of background. We are proud of our rich and robust curriculum, which provides an enviable range of learning opportunities. Any student starting school now, will be entering a job market where many of the careers with which we are familiar, will have changed by the time they are sixteen years old! As a result, we are constantly looking at ways to improve our existing offer, researching and adapting our curriculum to better meet the needs of our young people in a rapidly changing world.

Our innovations can be seen across all key stages; through the work of the Chrysalis group at Key Stage 3, the wide range of choices at Key Stage 4 and post-16 which includes a strong academic offer and the opportunity to blend the academic, applied and vocational. The design of the curriculum at The King John School is about providing choice and opportunity for progression so that the student benefits in the long term. We pride ourselves in knowing our students and supporting them in reaching their full potential to enable them to move onto the next stage of their lives.

On a practical note, at Key Stage 3, the 350 students in a year group are generally divided into 12 teaching groups. Students in Year 7 & 8 are taught in both teaching groups and tutor groups. Students are placed in ability sets in a variety of subjects including maths, English and science.



Everyone at our school has a role in making our school a truly reflective learning environment, with the highest possible aspirations and expectations. We expect students and all members of our community to be treated— and to treat others—with respect at all times. This helps make our school a calm and orderly place in which students have a positive attitude to their learning.

Students benefit from an open culture that actively promotes all aspects of their welfare and gives them a voice. As a result, they are happy and enjoy good emotional wellbeing.

Our well-trained pastoral teams support students by getting to know them well and going out of their way to meet their day-to-day needs. All students have a personal tutor whom they meet every day, while each year group is led by a Head of Year who is supported by an Assistant Head of Year and non-teaching Student Support Officer. The Student Support Officer follows your child from Year 7 through to Year 13, ensuring continuity of support for both students and parents.

We work closely with local primary schools to ensure as many new students as possible visit us before they enrol. Also, primary students often visit to watch our performances, take part in Year 5 master classes or participate in LAMDA, arts skills, or


sports summer programmes. We know these initiatives really help to quell the mystique and fear of moving to secondary school.
